#### **Expectations and Obligations**

- ✓ Any organization providing services and supports to children and youth who meet criteria for having a Severe Emotional Disability (SED) and their families and who have child welfare involvement is eligible to request funding for projects, resources, activities, and/or co-sponsorship of training, professional development, and conferences.
- ✓ Technical Assistance is available to organizations requesting SOC funding. This includes consultation regarding training, cultural/linguistic responsiveness, family and youth engagement, and evaluation.
- ✓ SOC staff will assist with promotion of co-sponsored events via website, distribution lists, and community networking.
- ✓ Copies of materials will be provided to SOC FIVE Training Coordinator.
- ✓ Any funds awarded must be used to "supplement" not "supplant"! In other words, these funds may not free up state or local dollars for other purposes but should create or augment programs to an extent not possible without these dollars.
- ✓ Per cost-sharing guidelines, the budget report will include total in-kind and cash contributions (e.g., other partner sponsorships, meeting room space, staff time, handouts, supplies, etc.) which can contribute to SOC FIVE requirements. Match resources are non-federal public or private funds that are not being used as match for any other federal program.
- ✓ Proposals must be submitted to <u>DeeDee.Ward@ky.gov</u> by April 8 for April review, July 8 for July review, and October 7 for October review.
- ✓ Proposals will be reviewed quarterly by an interagency team in mid-April, mid-July, and mid-October 2021.
- ✓ Awardees will be notified by April 30, July 30, and October 29, 2021.
- ✓ Upon notice of award, the awardee will submit a single invoice to <u>DeeDee.Ward@ky.gov</u> for approval and will be processed by the Kentucky Partnership for Families and Children, Inc. (sample invoice enclosed).
- ✓ A final report including a summary of activity and/or participant evaluations will be submitted to the <a href="mailto:DeeDee.Ward@ky.gov">DeeDee.Ward@ky.gov</a> within 60 days of event conclusion. This report will also include match requirements as described above.

If awarded grant funds, Todd County Schools will provide services to support the social-emotional needs of students with severe emotional disabilities who have child welfare involvement or are at-risk for involvement. Specifically, Todd County Schools plans to enhance the current Social Emotional Learning (SEL) book library for both students and guidance counselors, purchase memberships to School Counsleor World, and support attendance to the Kentucky School Counselors Association Conference. Additionally, anxiety reducing/calming kits will be developed for students. Each of these is described in more detail below.

A variety of books, including culturally and linguistically appropriate selections, will be chosen that are geared toward ages kindergarten through grade 12 and focus on coping with a various social and emotional issues, such as anxiety, depression, anger, and grief. Resource books will also be purchased for guidance counsleors to help support social and emotional needs.

School Counselor World is a membership that provides guidance counselors access to a number of evidence-based counseling resources, including individual and group counseling activities, behavior interventions resources, a materials library, guidance lessons, and trauma informed care training and resources. Guidance counselors at each school will be provided membership.

Staff who provide counseling services will also be provided the opportunity to attend the Kentucky School Counselor Association Conference. The conference will provide counselors additional training to help better support students with emotional needs and their families.

Anxiety reducing/calming kits will be developed for students at various ages. These kits will include items such as coloring books, fidgets, journals, scented markers, etc.

The following System of Care Principles are addressed in this project: Developmentally appropriate services; Incorporate mental health promotion, prevention, early identification, intervention, and recovery services and supports; Evidence-informed and promising practices; Services and supports delivered in the least restrictive, most normative environments possible; Provide services without discrimination.

Goal 1: Increase staff and at-risk student access to effective Social Emotional Learning (SEL) and materials.
Objective 1: By the end of the 2021-2022 school year, the number of Social Emotional Learning (SEL) books acccessible to students and guidance counselors will increase by at least 65.
Objective 2: During the 2021-2022 school year, guidance counselors will access resources from the School Counselor World and the Kentucky School Guidance Counslors Association Conference to plan guidance lessons and/or indvidual/group counseling activites as evidenced by lesson plans and/or counseling notes.
Objective 3: During the 2021-2022 school year, a minimum of 40 anxiety reducing/calming kits will be made and distributed to schools in the district to provide to students with social-emotional needs.
