• Students will have a rigorous curriculum and be held to the same high academic standards as their on-campus peers.

 New students will fill out a transfer form for virtual school for Fall of 2021.

 Current full time JCHS and e-School students and staff will automatically transition to become students and staff of the new school.

Virtual School Grades 6-12:

> Students and Enrollment

- Students will have asynchronous learning with daily opportunities for synchronous support.
- Students will have supports to help teach organizational, time management, and digital citizenship skills including introductory sessions designed to teach the habits and skills needed to be a successful virtual learner.

Virtual School Grades 6-12:

The Student Experience

 Clear pacing established to maintain grade-level performance. Falling below this minimum pacing will activate an intervention protocol for support.

 Weekly individualized coaching sessions will be provided for all students to monitor progress and ensure success.

- AP courses will be available. In addition, all high school students will have access to the AP courses offered at the virtual school.
- Electives will be offered, however, courses like Art, Music, Dance, and Physical Education but they may be facilitated differently from a typical classroom setting.
- Career and Technical Education Pathways will be offered and may lead to industry certifications.
- Students will be required to report to a site location to participate in district, state, and federal assessments. Currently, there is no option to administer those assessments remotely.
- Students will be able to receive Special Education and English Second Language (ESL) services.

- Staff will work to meet each student's needs academically, socially, emotionally, and behaviorally.
- Extracurricular virtual clubs/activities will be available.
- Virtual school students will not participate in clubs/activities/athletics at their previous school.

 Devices will be provided to students who need them.

 Looked at several options on a new name to capture the excitement and direction of a 6th-12th grade opportunity.

 Stakeholders provided input on the new name.
