The boys basketball team won the 6th district tournament and lost in the semifinals of the region tournament to the eventual champion, UHA

The girls basketball team won the 6th district and 2nd region tournaments. They won their first two games of the KHSAA state tournament, losing to Marshall County in the semifinals. Sadie Wurth was named 2nd Region Player of the Year and was a candidate for KY Miss Basketball.

The cheer team won the Region 1 Game Day competition and had the highest score of all schools across the state. They competed virtually in the National Competition and finished 5th in the nation. They are competing in the state competition on Thursday, May 13 in Winchester, KY.

One individual (Hannah Martin) and one relay team advanced to the state swim meet.

The wrestling team had two state qualifiers, JJ Poynter and Rance Hawkins.

Maggie Johnson advanced to the state bowling tournament, where she finished 17th in the state. Maggie and Holden Hobby competed in the Unified Bowling State Tournament and finished 2nd.

The bass fishing team had one boat (2 fishermen), Nate Coomes and Quinn Harmon qualify for the state tournament.

The boys archery team advanced to the state tournament where they finished 12th in the state. Two girls qualified individually for the state tournament.

The baseball team is currently 13-9 and continuing to get better every day.

The softball team is currently 16-6 with each loss coming to top rated teams in Indiana and Kentucky.

The track and tennis teams having good seasons and will start postseason play the week of May 24.
