Boyd County Public Schools is currently establishing enrollment criteria to determine if applicants are the right fit for our virtual learning academy for the 2021-2022 school year. Below is an overview of what we plan to put into place if our school board moves forward with a virtual learning option and this waiver is approved by the Kentucky Board of Education. To begin, students and guardians will be required to attend an in-person orientation process where they will receive information regarding the student learning platform, materials needed, teacher instructional supports, and specific guidelines, such as attendance, assessment, and overall expectations of both the student and guardian(s). Students will be required to complete synchronous and asynchronous learning opportunities if enrolled in the Boyd County Virtual Academy. At the current time, the district plans to use Edmentum as the main learning platform for K-12 students. K-5 students use Edmentum's Calvert platform and 6-12 students will use Courseware. The curriculum embedded in the platforms is aligned to Kentucky standards, but we also have the ability for our teachers to customize the content to follow our particular curriculum timelines. Teachers can also add or take away content to build a robust program that is tightly aligned to standards, but also provides opportunities for individualization and differentiation. Teachers may choose to use Google Classroom or other programs in the district to further support instruction. Google Meets will be held regularly, and students will be required to be in attendance. Students will follow the district testing windows and will be required to come on campus to complete the universal screener (currently STAR) and any other diagnostics that may be required to track student progress in reading and math. Students may also be required to come on campus to complete other school/district assessments as needed. Teachers will work with students and families to provide extra support or tutoring opportunities should a student be struggling academically in any area. At mid-term, any student, who has failing grades, fails to attend Google Meets, isn't completing online assignments based on timelines given, or is considered truant, will be moved back to traditional/in-person learning. In addition, parents will be required to attend a parent Google Meet or in-person conference at least once per nine weeks.



BOYLE COUNTY KIDS COME FIRST VIRTUAL ACADEMY

Boyle County Virtual Learning (BCVL) will be a digital platform-based learning model used in conjunction with a certified teacher. A digital platform is a computer-based program that provides access to videos, tutorials, explanations, and practice activities for courses/classwork. At the Middle and High school levels the students will use Edmentum. For grades K-5, the digital platform has not been selected. We are currently researching several options to best meet the needs of all students. Students will complete all required platform work and any supplemental work that is assigned within the deadlines and timeframes. This program's pacing will replicate the experience of our in-person students. Students will be required to meet daily a minimum of two times. Additionally there may be times students will be required to meet, virtually, with teachers for extended learning opportunities and/or intervention.

APPLICANTS:







Bullitt Virtual Learning Academy Mission

The Bullitt Virtual Learning Academy (BVLA) is an innovative online program seeking to serve the educational needs of students in a virtual environment. Students will have Bullitt County Public School teachers and staff to provide instruction, intervention, and facilitate learning to meet the needs of the whole child.

<u>Rationale</u>

The current pandemic forced Bullitt County Public Schools to create both an in-person and virtual learning model. We have seen students struggle, but we have also seen high levels of success with some students virtually while navigating these unprecedented times. The intention of BVLA is to continue to provide an instructional virtual learning platform for students to continue to experience success while supporting both academic and social and emotional needs. The BVLA will become one of the three major programs housed within the Riverview Opportunity Center. Bullitt Virtual Learning Academy will provide an avenue for many students within the district to have an equitable, non-typical high school experience, while still meeting the standard of Bullitt County Public Schools Profile of a Graduate. Parents and students, through survey data, have shown the want for this type of program, and many of our students' performance, during the pandemic, has displayed a need for the program.

The Bullitt Virtual Learning Academy will seek students in two specific areas of need. There are many students within our rosters who have barriers preventing the typical navigation of a traditional educational format. Students with high levels of anxiety have become commonplace in our students. There are many academically brilliant students currently struggling within regular school systems, but the pandemic has provided said students an opportunity to work from home and thrive. These barriers also exist for students who have recently had life-altering experiences and may need a social reprieve with the ability to remain on task and on pace.

The student who plans to work hard and work ahead is the second area of need. There are hard-working students who may not have an interest in a co-op opportunity or a program which adds college credit. These students may still want to work at a quicker pace in order to finish school earlier without having to do specific extras or be tied to a promise of a certain kind of work experience when their coursework is complete. Traditional education creates barriers for the student who is focused on leaving school with a diploma at a nontraditional pace. With all of the flexibility of the new system of delivery, there is no reason a student who wants to work at a faster pace should be made to slow themselves if their parents agree. BVLA will provide these opportunities and remove barriers outside and within the control of the school/district.

The Bullitt Virtual Learning Academy will be a testament to Bullitt County Public Schools' commitments to innovation and meeting the needs of students. A technology rich asynchronous and synchronous experience coupled with highly qualified, caring teachers will breed sustainable excellence. The plan is to create a solid

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foundation of excellent instruction and remain on the cutting edge of technology within the program. Over time, BVLA will help graduate numerous students within the district who would have struggled in other areas. "Fit" and belonging are social concepts which can either be a barrier or an asset to a student. The Bullitt Virtual Learning Academy will remove barriers, be an asset, and become the right "fit" for many BCPS students.

Enrollment Process

Families and students who are interested in enrolling in the Bullitt Virtual Learning Academy will apply in the spring and summer of 2021 for the 2021-2022 school year. The application will be for the full 2021-2022 academic year. The process will allow families and students to submit enrollment information along with providing information as to why participating in a virtual learning environment will be beneficial for their academic, social, and emotional development. The process will also involve a review of qualitative and quantitative data sources including a review of formative and summative assessment data at the school and district level. In addition, previous school year student attendance and/or participation will be reviewed to determine eligibility for enrollment into the virtual learning academy. Overall, the enrollment process will provide families and students with an opportunity to submit enrollment information with a review of multiple sources of data to determine if the student is the right fit for the Bullitt Virtual Learning Academy. Before the enrollment process begins, an informational night will be provided to interested families to learn about the Bullitt Virtual Learning Academy.

General Information

The instructional day will mimic the same times as in-person instruction at the elementary, middle, and high school level. Students will be expected to take initiative and be independent learners, with parent and teacher support, in the Bullitt Virtual Learning Academy. BCPS Graduate Profile competencies and demonstration of learning will be embedded into the BVLA for students to showcase learning and skills. Students must be able to know how to use learning resources available to them, ask for help when needed from parents/teachers, and be able to manage their time for learning and assignment deadlines. Students will be held to the BCPS Code of Conduct. If a new student transfers into the district from another district they can apply at the start of the second semester.

Parents are expected to participate in a minimum of 2 parent-teacher conferences during the academic year. Parents must be available for students and school staff throughout the day through phone, email, etc. A Parent Contract and a Student Pledge with Bullitt County Public Schools must be signed, adhered to, and kept on file for BVLA participation.

A student support team will be put in place when students begin to demonstrate academic struggles by providing intervention and support to increase student success. After a period of time with continued support without progress, the student will be placed on a probationary period. After meeting with parents/guardians along with the student support team, students that are not successful in BVLA, within the first grading period, will transition to their home school for in-person learning at the beginning of the second grading period.

A student device will be issued to all students.Students will be expected to be available for instruction and engagement with teachers during normal school hours. Students will be expected to complete grade-level curriculum. Students will be expected to take part in formative and summative assessments for teachers to progress monitor student learning. Students will be subject to the same grading utilized in the traditional classroom. Students will have a BCPS certified teacher to provide and support learning along with web-based software programs and learning platforms. Students will be expected to participate in project-based learning experiences at home. Students will be provided with special area/unified arts experiences through certified teachers and/or digital platforms.

If a student-teacher meeting is needed or a"field trip" is planned, families and students will have to provide their own transportation to and from the location. Most services will be provided virtually for students with disabilities, gifted and talented, and English Learners. Students may be required to meet with their teacher/provider in-person on an individual or small group basis for related services, academic services, etc. Students will be required to come

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in-person for district or state assessments. Families will be responsible for providing food and feeding their child breakfast and lunch.

Daily attendance will be required or an absence will be recorded against student's attendance. Attendance taken in morning and afternoon for elementary students. Attendance taken for each course for middle and high school students. Truancy procedures will be implemented by the district when students become non- compliant with attendance policies.

Virtual Learning Instructional Tools and Teaching/Learning Strategies

Bullitt County Public Schools is a 1:1 district, therefore, all students in the Bullitt Virtual Learning Academy will be provided with a ChromeBook. In addition, wifi access will be provided to students, if necessary. Students will participate in synchronous and asynchronous learning through a Bullitt County Public School certified teacher along with the utilization of digital platforms, such as Google Classroom and SeeSaw. Another software program that will be utilized is Class which is an authentic virtual classroom set up to monitor attendance, engagement, student interactions, etc. while also embedding formative assessment tools inside the virtual classroom as well as allowing students to only access needed content during the synchronous class session. In addition, all Google Suite tools are available to teachers as well to support learning. In addition, we will be utilizing web-based software programs like Edgenuity, Compass, PathBlazer, K12, Lexia, etc. and other district purchased software tools. In addition, our teachers will utilize MasteryConnect as a tool to provide standards-based assessments and track student progress on standards mastery by creating assessments in MasteryConnect which students can take at home for formative and summative assessments.

Pedagogical strategies utilized in the Bullitt Virtual Learning Academy will include project-based learning along with utilizing the Thinking-Focus classroom to include community, gradual release of responsibility, discourse, and thinking strategies in a virtual classroom founded in deeper learning. Students will be provided direct instruction and scaffolding support, as needed, while also participating in academic discourse with peers to increase collaboration and communication skills. In addition, the Bullitt County Public Schools Graduate Profile Competencies will be included in learning experiences for students.

Elementary and Middle School Virtual Learning Academy

Bullitt County Public School certified staff will be deployed for elementary and middle school students based on enrollment. Classrooms will meet cap requirements for elementary and middle school classrooms and will have a certified teacher. In addition, unified arts/special areas (stem, art, physical education, coding, etc.) will be provided through a combination of certified teachers and digital platforms, as appropriate. Elementary students will be virtually "self-contained" with a homeroom teacher with middle school teachers organized by content and teacher vertically. Reading on grade level at the elementary will be a focus as well as math, science, social studies, and writing. Elementary teachers will teach the five components of literacy in second and third grade aligned with the Kentucky Academic Standards utilizing our early literacy assessment instruction and data protocol. Elementary and middle school students will also be provided time to experience student-led conferences, be involved in goal setting, mentoring, and other experiences that support a child's academic experience. Students will have access to extracurriculars and athletics at their home school.

High School Virtual Learning Academy

High school students enrolled in Bullitt Virtual Learning Academy innovative program will graduate within their 4-year cohort. Students will have certified teachers for content area graduation requirements. Students will be provided pathway opportunities, dual credit and AP classes as needed and/or requested. As the program continues to grow with enrollment, transition readiness, pathway growth and completion, and expansion of learning opportunities shall be added to the academy. The program will be assessed primarily on how many students graduate with their cohort on time. We anticipate that we can graduate most of our students in a span of four years. There is also a component in the program where we'll also focus on early graduation and some students may graduate in three years. Overall it will be a different educational platform that will be a gateway for students to start their college and career readiness. We also expect that all of our students graduate college and/or career ready. High school students will also be provided time to experience student-led conferences, be involved in goal setting, mentoring, and other experiences that support a child's academic experience. Students will have access to extracurriculars and athletics at their home school.

Special Populations

Bullitt County Public Schools has diverse learners in all grade levels. The BVLA will be open to enrollment for diverse learners. However, students with disabilities will be enrolled as determined through the ARC process involving appropriate stakeholders. BCPS certified special education teachers will be deployed to students in the BVLA who have an individualized education plan (IEP). The regular education teacher and special education teacher will collaborate to ensure the individual needs are met of each student along with ensuring progress on IEP goals. Co-teaching and resource teaching will be implemented as dictated on IEP. English Language Learners will also be provided with access to the BVLA and their language and academic needs will be met by deploying existing district English Language Teachers to provide support in and out of the regular classroom for students at all levels. Assessment data will be utilized to determine if the BVLA is an appropriate placement for an EL student based on ACCESS and TELL assessment data. Gifted and talented students will also have access to the BVLA and individualized programming will be provided based on the Gifted Student Services Plan for each student through our existing district gifted and talented teachers. All students with diverse needs will continue to be able to access the personalized learning needs through BCPS certified teachers as well as digital platforms, as appropriate.

Climate and satisfaction surveys, academic formative and summative assessments, and progression through the online learning platforms are components of how Bullitt County will measure progress towards grade level mastery and graduation. Solution-based meetings, focusing on academic history combined with social and emotional aspects will guide the individualized educational needs of the students. The professional learning community process will be used for teachers to answer the four questions: (1) What do our students need to know and be able to do? (standards), (2) How will we know they have learned it?, (3) How will we respond when they master standards?, and (4) How will we respond when they do not master standards?. In addition, the instructional process will be used to plan units with mastery checks for students along the way. Student work samples will be collected and reviewed throughout the PLC process and at school level meetings to analyze and assess the expectations and quality of work in the BVLA. Teachers will be required to submit lesson plans for review for the planning of research-based instruction fused with digital learning tools and pedagogies. Learning outcomes will be monitored through MasteryConnect through formative and summative assessments, our district CASE benchmark assessment, ACT, state assessment data, transition ready percentages, and graduation rate. In addition, mastery of our Graduate Profile competencies will be embedded into work evidence and outcomes for students demonstrate skills tied to each competency.

Professional Learning

Bullitt County Public Schools employ Digital Learning Coaches who will be deployed to provide teachers with job-embedded professional learning through coaching cycles and consulting as needed to enhance student learning outcomes. An instructional coach will also be deployed to work with teachers through coaching cycles to build teacher capacity and support administration in ensuring high expectations, grade level assignments, rigor, and student support. The district will also be using digital leader experts to assist with professional development for teachers as well. The BVLA will create a professional development plan to ensure teachers have the needed support and tools for growth and development teaching in a virtual environment.

District understands that KRS 156.210 provides the Commissioner of Education with access to the papers, books and records of all teachers, superintendents, or other public-school officials. 

The purpose of CCPS Virtual Learning Academy is to provide:

- An alternative option to in-person learning where all coursework can be completed through the CCPS Virtual Learning Academy.
- Learning activities supported by virtual teacher-led instruction as well as utilizing on-line learning opportunities that are aligned with Kentucky Academic Standards.
- A curriculum aligned with the Kentucky Academic Standards and the learning goals in each student's Individual Learning Plan (ILP). The ILP is state mandated for grades 6-12.

Benefits:

- Instruction provided by Kentucky accredited teachers
- No tuition and fees
- Accredited diploma upon satisfying all requirements for graduation
- Individualized academic and career preparation plan
- Increased responsibility in time management, organization, self-direction and self-regulation.
- Eligibility for a KEES yearly GPA, ACT bonus, Dual Credits, AP courses, and Salutatorian/Valedictorian awards
- Weekly food bundles provided by Christian County Public Schools Food Services

Introduction:

- Virtual Learning Academy (VLA) will be an A5 school independent from A1 schools.
- Student's individual enrollment will reflect enrollment in the Virtual Learning Academy.
- Attendance, grades and credits will be posted by VLA.
- Cumulative student records will be housed at VLA

Hours of Operation:

Virtual Learning Academy will operate Monday thru Friday from 8:00 am - 3:00 pm. VLA will follow the Christian County Public Schools District Calendar.

Criteria:

- 1. Students who are on track for graduation
- 2. Students who are not in truancy
- 3. Students who have successfully completed all of the previous year's coursework with passing grades
- 4. Students who have shown mastery of the previous grade level standards based on multiple measures (universal screeners, teacher recommendations and grades).
- 5. Medical hardship supported by medical/professional documentation (documentation provided must be current and support the need for VLA enrollment)
- 6. Students must acquire and maintain consistent internet access
- Students and guardians will be required to complete an in-person orientation to go over the criteria of the program, complete their On-line registration form and receive a Chromebook (if needed).
- 8. Exceptions will be considered for students with disabilities

Enrollment:

All students desiring enrollment in VLA during the 2021-2022 school year will re-apply or apply for entry and be accepted into the program using criteria outlined above. Medical hardship will be reviewed first then a committee will determine the enrollment of other students based on capacity. If qualifying applicants exceed the enrollment capacity, a waiting list will be developed based on the order in which applications are received. Any new enrollments in CCPS desiring entry into the program will be required to complete the application process and if approved will be added to the waiting list. The initial application process will be completed through Google Form and will be communicated on the CCPS webpage, Facebook page and Twitter beginning March 8 and ending March 26. Families will be notified by April 15 if they have been accepted into the program or not.

CCPS Virtual Learning Academy will service students in grades 4th - 12th with a maximum enrollment of 600. The student capacity at each grade level will be broken down as follows:

4 - 6 grade - 150 students 7 - 8 grade - 150 students 9 - 12 grade - 300 students

Internet Use Policy:

The Christian County Board of Education provides computers as tools to enhance students' learning. The district's computer network and the Internet, whether used on or off-campus; whether owned by the school district or by the student or his/her family; whether accessed on campus or off campus during or after school hours; may not be used for the purpose of harassment of any kind. All forms of harassment over the Internet (commonly referred to as cyberbullying) are unacceptable and will be viewed as a violation of school board policy and the district's acceptable computer use policy and procedures. Malicious use of the district's computer system is prohibited. Users are responsible for the appropriateness of the material they transmit over the system. Hate mail, harassment, discriminatory remarks, or other antisocial behaviors are expressly prohibited. Failure to adhere to Internet Acceptable Use Policy will result in the following disciplinary action: the loss of computer privileges and/or removal from the Virtual Program. In addition, when any kind of threat is communicated or when a hate crime is committed, the administration will report such crimes to local law enforcement officials.

Attendance/Truancy:

Students are required to adhere to the attendance policy as stated in Christian County Public Schools attendance policy. Virtual Learning Academy students' attendance requirement is satisfied by logging in daily.

In the event of an absence, students are to provide a written excuse note of absences to the Virtual Learning Academy attendance clerk within five (5) days of a recorded absence, in accordance with Christian County Public Schools attendance policy. In cases of chronic absence or truancy (6 total days of unexcused absences), and after consultation with the appropriate staff, in accordance with policy and procedures, the Virtual Learning Program will take action including but not limited to removal from the Virtual School Program, referral to the truancy office, issuance of legal notices, and juvenile court intervention. These actions will take place in an effort to remedy any social, emotional, or family support issues that may contribute to a student's excessive absences.

Lost/Stolen Equipment:

The equipment is provided for use only while a part of the Virtual Learning Academy. In the event that the student leaves the Virtual Learning Academy or moves out of Christian County, the equipment must be returned to the Virtual Learning Academy administrator. Failure to return

the computer with assigned accessories will result in the equipment being considered stolen and a police report will be filed. If the equipment is lost/stolen during the course of the school year, a replacement will only be considered after a copy of the police report has been received by the Virtual Program (depending on circumstances, a replacement may NOT be available.

Dress Code:

Students are to dress in clothes promoting a safe and respectful learning environment. Clothes creating a disruptive environment or cause a health or safety hazard are not appropriate and not acceptable during virtual class sessions. School personnel will enforce this dress code:

Clothing cannot:

- show profanity, obscenity, violence, or symbols of hate
- promote alcohol, tobacco, or drugs
- promote gang colors or gang related signs
- show underwear or sag.
- show bare skin between upper chest and mid-thigh

Discipline Due Process:

Virtual Learning Academy will not tolerate any derogatory comments, profanity or threats against any staff member. The referral will be submitted to the Virtual Learning Academy Principal. The principal/designee will investigate a student's alleged misconduct and determine whether disciplinary action is necessary. The principal/designee will provide due process by explaining the program's view of offense, the information gathered during the investigation, and the consequences or other behavioral intervention as determined by the principal. The principal/designee will allow the student to explain his/her side or view of the offense. If the principal/designee has knowledge of any serious student misconduct, the principal/designee may immediately remove the student from the Virtual Learning Academy. If it is determined that disciplinary action is not warranted, the incident will be deleted from the file. Parents will be provided written notice of any misconduct and/or removal from the Virtual Learning Academy. VLA will follow the Code of Acceptable Behavior.

Academic Integrity Contract

Virtual Learning Academy students must sign a commitment form attesting to academic integrity regarding each of the following topics.

All work must be completed by the student alone

- Any collaboration among students must be pre-approved by the teachers
- Plagiarism will not be allowed in any form. This will include copying or using the ideas or words of others and presenting them as one's own.
- Students will not allow others to copy their work
- Content from the Internet will not be misused or misrepresented.

All Virtual Learning teachers utilize a variety of technologies to check student work for authenticity. If the teacher confirms that the student has plagiarized work in any manner, the student will be subject to consequences outlined in the CCPS Code of Acceptable Behavior up to and including removal from the program.

Courses of Study:

Elementary and Middle School

Students in 4th through 8th grades will take core classes (Reading/Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies) each school year that address all required Kentucky Academic Standards in those areas. Special courses will be offered in physical education, art, and computer science, career exploration and financial literacy (6-8), and keyboarding (6-8). Beginning in 6th grade, all students will establish and maintain an Individual Learning Plan (ILP) each year.

In order to remain enrolled in the Virtual Learning Academy, students must maintain passing grades in all courses. Grades will be reviewed bi-weekly by the Virtual Learning Academy teachers and Administrator. Failure to maintain passing grades in any course will result in the following:

- 1st Week Conference with parent and student
- 2nd Week If any grade is below a 60 average, for a second consecutive week, the student will be required to have a google meet with the teacher twice a week to review progress toward passing.
- 3rd Week If any grade is below a 60 average, the student will continue to meet with the teacher twice a week to review progress toward passing.
- 4th Week If any grade is below a 60 average, the student will be required to attend inperson tutoring sessions with VLA staff until grades are passing. If a student fails to attend tutoring or maintain passing grades, the student could potentially be withdrawn from the Virtual Learning Academy and enrolled in their A1 School at the end of the semester. (conference with parent and student)

Exiting VLA by Request:

- Once enrolled in VLA students shall remain enrolled in VLA until the end of the semester, or school year.
- If a student requests to change learning settings there will be a review by the designated CCPS Virtual Learning Academy Committee which would convene at the end of each semester.
- Students will only be allowed to exit VLA and return to a traditional CCPS school at the end of the semester or end of the current school year.
- When a student is approved for exit, the process will follow that of an in district transfer. The receiving school will be notified of the student's request to return. The receiving

school should complete a records request for the transferring student, and once received, VLA staff will send all records to the receiving school including current grades.

Special Education:

Virtual Learning Academy will accommodate students with special needs through their Individual Educational Plan (IEP). When a student is accepted into the program, an ARC will convene to update their IEP.

Decisions for individual students with disabilities under the IDEA shall be made through the Admissions and Release Committee process and changes in service delivery required under the IDEA shall be made to the student's IEP.

Decisions for students identified under Section 504 shall be made through the team process as required under federal law and corresponding District policies and procedures (and changes in service delivery under the IDEA shall be made to the student's IEP).

It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian or student 18 years or older to participate in the Admissions and Release Committee (ARC) in which daily service minutes, accommodations, modifications and any other special services will be altered to reflect services provided by the Christian County Public Schools Virtual Learning Academy.

Sports:

Students enrolled in Virtual Learning Academy (VLA) will not be allowed to participate in extracurricular sports in Christian County Public Schools.

Graduation/Pictures/ExtraCurricular/CoCurricular Activities:

- Virtual Learning Academy (VLA) students will be allowed to get school pictures taken at their school and purchase yearbooks (high school)



- 1. Performance-Based virtual students included in the exception set forth at 702 KAR 7:125(1)(4)(g) shall not be covered by this waiver. The district shall continue to count Performance-Based virtual students in pupil attendance subject to all provisions of 702 KAR 7:125.
- 2. Attendance shall be tracked by a certified teacher at a course level for virtual middle and high school students covered by this waiver. Each course shall have attendance stored in the student information system attendance tables following KDE guidance. Attendance shall be tracked by a certified teacher at least two times each school day for fully virtual elementary school students with checks three hours apart. Each course shall have attendance stored in the student information system attendance tables following KDE guidance. These courses shall not be set up as virtual/performance-based courses.
- 3. Attendance clerks or other assigned district personnel shall reconcile attendance for each course/period to ensure proper codes are entered for absent students. Attendance events shall continue to be entered at the office level (i.e. Dr. Excuses/parent excuses). District understands and agrees that attendance information provided shall be subject to audit by KDE.
- 4. All truancy laws shall be followed for virtual students. District shall develop and implement policies to address virtual attendance absences, including the attendance status of students with an internet outage and the process to return students to in-person instruction for truancy violations, in addition to legal action which may be required by KRS 159.150, 159.180, and other applicable truancy laws.
- 5. Only students whose families have requested to be enrolled in the virtual school, program, or academy are included under this waiver, accompanied by school and district approved documentation resulting from locally adopted policies for enrollment. No student shall be involuntarily placed in the virtual school, program, or academy. No student shall be placed in the virtual school, program, or academy solely due to disciplinary reasons. The Admissions and Release Committee (ARC) of any student with an Individual Education Program (IEP) pursuant to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) shall document the students enrollment in the virtual school, program, or academy in the ARC Conference Summary.
- 6. All students shall be full-time enrolled in the virtual school, program, or academy.
- 7. Only students with determined appropriate digital access and support beyond the school campus shall be candidates for enrollment in the virtual school, program, or academy. The district shall establish and implement an application and on-boarding process to ensure students and families understand the expectations for full-time enrollment in a virtual school, program, or academy and a determination of candidacy. The district shall ensure all students enrolled in virtual school, program, or academy have appropriate digital access to fully participate in and access the virtual program.
- 8. The virtual school, program, or academy shall have teachers and other staff assigned to support and provide instruction aligned to the grade-level expectations established in the *Kentucky Academic Standards* (*KAS*), including the selection, vetting, and usage of high-quality instructional resources aligned to the *KAS* and grade-level appropriate work. The use of standardsaligned high-quality instructional resources and curriculum is also assured via the annual

superintendent assurance regarding the <u>Kentucky Digital Learning Guidelines</u>. District shall maintain evidence of having systemic formative assessment processes in place to: (1) accurately measure student progress on grade-level standards for students enrolled in a virtual school, program, or academy; and (2) support students enrolled in the virtual school, program, or academy needing accelerated learning on grade- level standards within Tier 1 universal instruction as well as those students who need more targeted Tier 2 and Tier 3 interventions and supports.

- 9. The virtual school, program, or academy shall implement synchronous (real-time or live) strategies and digital platforms for two-way student to teacher visual and verbal interactions. Additionally the virtual school, program, or academy shall utilize a learning management system (LMS) or other digital platforms that allows teachers to monitor student's progress, interactions and engagement with the teacher and other students online for the review of student work and completion of assignments in both real-time and on-demand (asynchronous interactions). District understands and that frequent live, regularly-scheduled contact with a Kentucky certified teacher is suggested to produce more effective results and assures that the virtual school, program, or academy implemented pursuant to waivers contained herein will prioritize frequent live, regularly-scheduled contact with a Kentucky certified teacher.
- 10. The district shall fully comply with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act, and all applicable laws and regulations for the education of students with disabilities. District shall fully implement accommodations and Individual Education Programs (IEP) for students with disabilities enrolled in a virtual school, program, or academy. District shall review and consider how this may impact students enrolled in a virtual school, program, or academy pursuant to this waiver.
- 15. District understands that pursuant to KRS 156.010, the Commissioner of Education has authority for monitoring the management of school districts, including administration and finance, implementation of state and federal laws and regulations, and student performance. District understands that KRS 156.210 provides the Commissioner of Education with access to the papers, books and records of all teachers, superintendents, or other public-school officials. District hereby agrees that such authority specifically extends to all aspects of its operation of a virtual school, program, or academy pursuant to this waiver request and MOU. 

For the 2021-22SY, CISD wishes to participate in an *academy structure* for virtual learning in grades K-12. All students shall be enrolled as full-time students in the Corbin Independent School District (assurance #6) and will be assigned a schedule that aligns with the standard day of in-person students (assurance #12). Students may, at times, move from virtual to in-person (or vice-versa) or take assessments in-person as deemed necessary by the schools when extenuating circumstances arise. 

Covington Independent School District will use a combination of digitally- based instruction, various web-based programs carefully vetted for each content area and teacher created lessons available on line per Google Classroom. The combination of several formats are needed to address all the diverse needs of our students and families. All resources provided will be appropriate to each students' grade level and appropriate KAS at their grade level. All information will be communicated to our parents through our multiple communication methods; District-wide mailing, email, Facebook, Class Dojo, district website and individual school websites. The district's ultimate goal will be to continue to increase overall access to internet and continue to provide devices for all of our students. Our ultimate goal will be that our students would be able to receive recorded or real time lessons from their teachers either in person or virtually for portions of their program each day. These lessons would lead to other activities students could complete after lessons from their teachers. Recordings of these lessons would provide students with the ability to relearn topics if needed. Another goal would be for our teachers to provide whole class instruction, which could be in person and streaming live to students at home who may not be at school that day. These are all processes where our district is still in the development stage and will continue to build the infrastructure to improve.

We plan to continue and improve virtual interventions for our most struggling students in 2021-2022. If possible, we would identify our most struggling students in each school and that school would set up small group interventions with those students through programs like Google Meet, Zoom or similar programs. This would allow our teachers to provide real time interventions with our most struggling students. If families allow, we would also ask those students to come to school periodically for progress testing. Another layer we will add are programs which can provide targeted instruction that would focus on specific skills and concepts individual students are struggling with in the classroom as intervention. We will spend the summer researching possible ways this could be implemented in the 2021-2022 school year.

At the elementary level, middle school and high school levels, our students will have access to the Google Classroom learning management system and web based programs. Teachers will create assignments for their students, monitor and give feedback to students as needed.

Digitally based programs and platforms will be limited in order to streamline how many sites students/parents must access. Students in grades Preschool through 3rd grade will have access to a web-based program called Footsteps to Brilliance. This web-based reading program is free to all of our students in grades Preschool through 3rd grade. This program is used on a regular basis in our schools and in our homes. Teachers have students registered in this program and can assign and monitor student progress in this program. Teachers will re-communicate to parents how to access this program on-line and will provide again to parents their child's access code information.

Online classes may also use Odysseyware in grades K-5. Odysseyware is a choice that will allow our teachers to provide prescriptive lessons to our students at their current level. It is a standard aligned program and also has supplemental programs to choose from for our students. Teachers in grades K-5 have customized lessons within this program over the past year to directly align to our district curriculum. Odysseyware also provides intensive intervention for our students with multiple layers of instruction for student to work through to mastery. Our district will be researching more components which have been added recently to the web-based program this summer.

Online classes that are currently using Edgenuity will continue using Edgenuity in grades 6-12. Our district is also currently researching new additions to Edgenuity for elementary school. Edgenuity is a choice that will allow our teachers to provide prescriptive lessons to our students at their current level. It is a standard aligned program and also has supplemental programs to choose from for our students. Edgenuity also provides intensive intervention for our students with multiple layers of instruction for student to work through to mastery. Our district will be researching more components which have been added recently to the web-based program this summer.

Students in grades K-12 will also have access to Lexia. Lexia is a research based online reading intervention and or acceleration program for students. Lexia is a very intuitive program which allows students to progress at a set pace. Teachers can monitor this program electronically and also intervene with students if needed in person or virtually.

Our students in K-12 will also have access to Boardworks online application for all subjects. Topics for each of these online applications will be assigned by individual grade levels according to teacher assignments. Boardworks covers subjects and grade levels Kindergarten through 12th grade. This program is interactive and can be manipulated by the teacher so that specific parts of a lesson can be developed to match what the students need to learn. The program contains virtual lessons and work to go with each lesson. This web-based program also allows student interaction with many of its components. As mentioned above, lessons can be developed by each teacher using the applications provided with the program.

Additional programs may also be used to enhance learning opportunities remotely for our students. Our goal as mentioned above, is to provide a limited, consistent combination of the most intuitive webbased programs that meet our students' needs. As we move forward we plan to continue to learn and improve our overall program.

Instructional resources provided for virtual learning will be a continuation of current learning and will follow our districts approved units of study covering the Kentucky Academic Standards. The superintendent has outlined the expectation that work aligns with the current unit of studies and standards. The FCS Virtual Learning Academy learning pathway was born out of response to the needs of the pandemic. During most of the 20-21 school year, students participated in a virtual learning environment. During the 2021-2022 school year and beyond, we will continue to offer a virtual learning option for our students and families; however, the purpose and format of this new VLA model will look significantly different than it did during the 20-21 school year. During the 20-21 school year, students participated in regularly scheduled synchronous (live) instruction from a classroom teacher that was part of the school in which the student was enrolled. The standard learning platform during the 20-21 school year was Google Classroom and teachers would assign asynchronous (not live) homework, assessments and other activities. Students were expected to submit completed work in Google Classroom and grades were posted in Google Classroom and Infinite Campus. Communication between student and teacher took place through email, phone, Google Meet and/or message within the assignment page of Google Classroom.

For 2021-22 and beyond, The FCS Virtual Learning Academy will be a digital platform computer-based learning model which will be supplemented with teacher created learning activities and assessments. A platform is a computer-based program that provides access to videos, tutorials, explanations, and practice activities for each course/class the student is enrolled in. The student will complete all required platform work and any supplemental work that is assigned within the deadlines and timeframes. In addition to the self-guided platform work, the student will have periodic required scheduled synchronous (live) sessions with a teacher to provide additional small group and/or one-on-one instruction, guidance, career readiness learning activities, reteaching, interventions, and special services. Tutoring and office hours with a live teacher will also be available on a limited basis. Students shall be assigned a schedule that aligns with the standard day of in-person students. Hart County Virtual Academy will utilize Google Classroom (and other web-based platforms) to deliver daily instruction for each grade level. All students will need access to a reliable device and internet service. It is the student/parent responsibility to communicate with the school if they need assistance with either of these requirements. The device needs to have microphone and camera capabilities. All of our buildings are hot spots. If you need internet service, you may pull up to any of our buildings and gain access at any time. Students must abide by the Acceptable Use of Technology Policy (AUP) and the Chromebook Learning Procedures (CLP) for those using a school's device.

Plans to consider: We are discussing the parameters which will be required to be a virtual student. Right now we are thinking we would need a medical statement stating why the student may not attend school and wear a mask (if the mask mandate is still in effect). Before our 5/20/21 board meeting we will have a more detailed guidance on how students may be admitted into virtual as well as attendance guidelines. Also, if the student is not completing work timely, that student would have to continue the year as an in-person student.

Students are responsible and expected to log in daily and complete their assignments in a timely manner. Students failing to turn in work will receive a phone call from their Virtual Teacher who will provide any assistance that may be needed. The district will follow board policy and truancy guidelines for students who habitually fail to complete their work. For grades K-2, a face-to-face meeting between student and teacher(s) (via Google Meet, Facetime, Skype, etc) will be required. This time will be used to determine progress toward mastery of foundational skills. When students are participating in Google Meets or any other face-to-face virtual platforms: Students' use of the camera feature is recommended. Students will be asked to keep their microphones on mute unless they have a question or are responding to the teacher or classmate. (This is for group sessions only). Students must be dressed appropriately. Students should use professional and polite language. Students should attempt to keep all background noise and distractions to a minimum.

Virtual teachers will communicate regularly with their students through a variety of means including Google Classroom, email, Google Meets, and phone calls to both student and parent/guardian. Each virtual teacher will have set 'office hours' per day (posted times) in which a student or parent may call with questions or concerns. Teachers should respond within 24 hours. Learning at home does not mean that all of the content must be online. The teacher may send home items for the student to do such as authentic tasks, reading a book, conducting an experiment, etc. Teachers will work with students and their families to ensure they have materials to complete each assignment or provide an alternate assignment. Virtual teachers are expected to provide feedback on assignments to students in a timely manner and contact parents with any concerns they may have regarding student's progress and/or grade. Virtual teachers will speak directly to a parent, guardian, or care giver at least once a week. The virtual teacher will also share student progress data with the regular classroom teacher. Virtual

teachers may choose to give students tests online using Google Forms or other online platforms. Teachers will take into consideration that virtual students will have resources available to them during a test, and will create tests and quizzes with that in mind.

If there are technical difficulties during an assessment, please take a screenshot of the problem (make sure you know how to do this on your particular computer before starting) so you can notify the teacher immediately. All students in grades K-8 are encouraged to take the RAPID Reading and STAR Math assessments. These assessments can be administered at each school. 



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

Jackson County Public Schools' Virtual Learning Academy will allow students to participate in a virtual learning environment, utiliziing the Google Classroom Program. The instruction will be supplemented with digital programming including ALEKS IC EXCEL Reading Plus iReady and APEX Teachers will provide instruction using a synchronous.

Duration

If approved by the KBE and signed by the Commissioner of Education or authorized designee, this MOU shall be effective beginning July 1, 2021 and shall continue in effect until June 30, 2022 or termination as provided herein, whichever occurs first.

Termination

Pursuant to KRS 156.160(2)(c), this MOU shall be subject to termination upon a determination by the Kentucky Board of Education that the school district has subsequently failed to meet the intent of the waiver and assurances contained herein. The parties agree that such a determination by the Kentucky Board of Education shall be final and binding on the parties hereto.
