We are requesting this waiver for elementary grades only, K-5. Instruction will be delivered through a combination of a purchased online program and regular interaction with dedicated virtual learning staff employed in our district. This is also the structure we used for 20-21. We are currently reviewing programs to determine if we will stay with the one we have or shift to a different program, but regardless of the program the structure will be the same next year. Our virtual teachers use the online learning program in the same way that an in-person teacher would use a core textbook program. The program is the starting point, but teachers modify or supplement the program to meet the needs of their students. For example, if the program does not have art or music curriculum, our teachers will embed that in other ways to ensure students are receiving instruction in all appropriate grade level standards. They will also include regular experiences to promote social-emotional learning and well-being.

The virtual program includes both lessons and practice for students. Our virtual teachers will also teach lessons during google meets to supplement the program. They will use the student work within the program along with any supplemental student work they assign as formal evidence of student learning and outcomes. The regular interaction they have with students online as well as from parent communication will also be used as evidence of learning. Virtual students will complete our universal screener, iReady, 3 times next year. iReady also includes individualized lessons and tasks in reading and math that can be used with students to supplement the virtual program. Our virtual staff monitors student work daily and intervenes with individual students and parents quickly.

There are multiple layers to live interaction with virtual staff. Teachers have google meets regularly with students in whole group, small groups, and individually. Currently, primary students have regularly-scheduled whole group sessions 3 days a week with other days devoted to more small group and individual support. Intermediate students have regularly-scheduled whole group sessions daily with small group and individual sessions intermixed. Parent communication and involvement is a high priority. Our virtual staff currently uses dojo, e-mails, texts, or phone calls to communicate often with parents and there is an open door for two-way communication. At a minimum, staff is communicating directly with parents weekly, but in most cases it is much more frequent.

Virtual staffing for 21-22 will depend on the number and grade levels of participating students but will have fully dedicated staff. We do not intend to have teachers who are responsible for teaching both in-person and virtual students simultaneously. We started the year with 1 virtual teacher per grade level plus some dedicated instructional assistants who worked closely with the teachers doing the same kinds of tasks instructional assistants would do in an in-person classroom. Student teacher ratio was similar to in-person. As the year has gone on, more

students have come back to in-person learning, meaning more staff has shifted back as well. Currently, all of our virtual teachers are working with 2 or 3 grade levels of students. For 20-21 virtual students, we will consider the possibility of sharing staff between schools to limit the number of grade levels for each teacher. That decision will be made once we have numbers and grade levels. We are prepared to allocate district funds to staff elementary virtual learning with teachers and assistants to meet the needs.

We will have an application process for elementary virtual learning. Within the application we will pull aspects of the assurances on page 3-4 that are needed to ensure parents who are selecting this option are clear on the parameters of virtual learning for 21-22.

Waiver Request Appendix A – Plan Narrative Lawrence County Virtual Academy

The Lawrence County School District Board of Education is requesting that the Kentucky Board of Education grant a waiver of 702 KAR 7:125 and KRS 156.160 to allow for attendance-based virtual learning in a virtual academy setting for kindergarten through 5th grade students.

The Lawrence County Virtual Academy (LCVA) will follow the "school within a school" model that allows students to be scheduled in a full-time virtual course load while being enrolled in their regular school. An application will be developed for those students whose parents/guardians may request participation in the virtual academy. The applications will be screened to determine if a student has the potential to be successful. Also, as part of the screening process, parents and/or guardians will be required to attend a meeting to:

- Demonstrate whether the students have appropriate digital access and support beyond the school campus.
- Communicate the attendance expectations for full-time enrollment in LCVA.
- Set forth the requirements of using a Google Classroom as a learning management system, of taking universal screening and formative assessments (in-person), and of other on-site requirements.
- Communicate that students will participate in both synchronous and asynchronous learning opportunities through the use of Acellus (aligned with Kentucky Academic Standards) and other instructional software programs as well as regular interactions with a virtual instructor.

Students will participate in the same universal screeners and formative assessments (STAR and Early STAR) as their in-person counterparts. The results of these assessments will provide data on the students' progress in reading and mathematics. These results will also be used, along with the students' grades in classes, to determine student success. If a student is struggling, he or she will be referred to tutoring services for intervention. Furthermore, if a student becomes habitually truant or if the student cannot demonstrate academic success, the student will be removed from the academy and required to attend in-person classes at his/her school. Finally, progress can be monitored by parents weekly through Infinite Campus, but progress reports will be sent home at midterm and nine-weeks increments. Parents/Guardians will be required to attend parent-teacher conferences at least on a nine-weeks basis.

The Lawrence County School District will continue to provide performance-based virtual coursework for students in Grades 6-12. The students who participate in the performance-based virtual learning opportunities will be included in the exception set forth at 702 KAR 7:125 (1)(4)(g).

K-12 Patriot Learning Academy Plan 2021-2022

Parents of K-12 students may voluntarily complete an application for their child to apply for enrollment to the Lincoln County Patriot Learning Academy for the 21-22 school year. Students with service plans ex: IEP, 504 plans, etc., are also eligible to apply.

Enrollment:

Students enrolled in the online option will be considered full-time students with a full schedule of courses. The courses will be provided through Google Classroom, a vetted online platform. The online platform will provide core instruction but a Kentucky certified teacher will be available to support, supplement, and enhance the content as needed. Students participating in the online option will have access to receive meals. Students will be identified as non-transported (NT) in Infinite Campus for transportation funding.

Selection Criteria:

The following criteria must be met before the student will be accepted into this program.

- 1. Students must demonstrate a history of good attendance (cannot have more than 3 unexcused absences or participation marks).
- 2. Passing grades for all subjects and, if previously enrolled in an online course, students must have completed the online course successfully.

Passing Grade Means:

Elementary: Progressing for the year and/or C or better for the last semester of 20-21

LCMS: C or better for the last semester of 20-21 LCHS: 2.0 or better for the previous semester

Once enrolled, students who continuously do not meet academic or attendance expectations may be placed on probation and could be released from the program.

A trial period of two weeks will be given to students/families upon initial enrollment to opt out and return to in person instruction. If this occurs, the option for future virtual learning will not be allowed.

Students may opt in to virtual learning after the registration period is closed under extenuating circumstances (i.e., quarantine). Principals must initiate this process.

Students with an individual education plan (IEP) must agree to meet with the special education service providers for services outlined in the IEP and agreed upon in an ARC meeting.

Assurances:

Before applying to enroll in the Patriot Learning Academy for the 21-22 school year, each family must make sure this learning option is the right one for their child and that the student is equipped with the necessary

skills to be successful in a self-guided online learning environment. We ask that families assure us that their child exhibits the following characteristics, either independently, or in the case of younger students, with strong support from the parents/guardians:

- → Self-motivated
- → Ability to work independently
- → Ability to set and meet deadlines
- → Perseverance
- → Taking initiative to ask for help when confused
- → Ability to follow a schedule
- → Prior demonstrated success, or potential for success, in a virtual learning environment

We also require a commitment from the parent/guardian to ensure that their student has the tools, resources, and support that they need to be successful. Parents/guardians who are considering enrolling their child in the Patriot Learning Academy are asked to make certain they can provide the following supports:

- → Assisting the student in creating and adhering to a schedule
- → Regularly monitoring progress and assignment completion within the learning platform
- → Communicating with and responding to teachers and staff members
- → Ensuring the student attends all scheduled synchronous (live) sessions
- → Establishing a distraction-free workspace within the home
- → Ensuring reliable access to technology

Duration of Enrollment:

All students registering for the Patriot Learning Academy commit to attending the online academy for a minimum of an entire semester. However, if a student is unable to demonstrate academic success (passing 3 of the 4 of their core content classes), or becomes habitually truant (6 or more unexcused absences), may be placed on probation or asked to report to school to complete their online content or to enroll for inperson instruction. A trial period of two weeks will be given to students/families upon initial enrollment to opt out and return to in person instruction. If this occurs, the option for future virtual learning will not be allowed.

Technology Requirements:

Technology access is a critical component for online instruction. Students must have reliable high-speed internet service to participate (i.e., the ability to stream a video without buffering). If more than one student in a home will be enrolling in the Patriot Learning Academy, then the internet service must be able to support all students being online at the same time. The district will not provide actual internet service or hotspots for the 21-22 school year.

The student must have access to a reliable device with a webcam and microphone such as a Chromebook, laptop, desktop computer, or tablet (not a Smartphone), that will allow them to create, complete, and submit projects and assignments. If more than one student in a home will be enrolling in the Patriot Learning Academy, then each student must have access to their own device. The district can provide a device for those students who need one if a contract agreement is signed and followed.

Attendance:

K-5: There will be a minimum of two required Google Meets each day (1 in the AM and the other in the PM). Attendance will be taken during these "Meets".

Grades 6-12: There will be six required virtual sessions each day. Attendance will be taken during each session.

Students enrolled in the Patriot Learning Academy will follow the same attendance policies that apply to students attending school in-person. Online academy students will have 6 full-day parent notes that can be used at the discretion of the parent, 6 tardy to/from school notes, 10 Doctors/Dentist/Court Notes. An attendance code will be created to document times when students are without internet access.

Instruction:

Google Classroom, our digital learning platform, will provide the base core content for the student and a Kentucky Certified teacher will provide additional instructional support using Google Meets or virtual sessions. Students will receive instruction in the following content areas: Reading, Writing, Math, Science, Social Studies and Arts/Humanities and Physical Education.

Assessment:

Students will be assessed throughout the school year using iReady or MAP which will measure student progress on grade-level standards. Students may be required to come to school to complete formative and summative assessments. Students participating in the Patriot Learning Academy will be required to come to school to participate in all state assessments.

Virtual Personnel:

KY certified teachers will serve in the capacity as virtual teacher as the main contact. Students will complete virtual sessions with teachers throughout the school:

Magoffin County Schools is committed to offering quality virtual learning experiences for students that align with the Kentucky Academic Standards and the Kentucky Digital Learning Guidelines.

The school district plans to offer virtual instruction_via the Magoffin County Virtual Academy to interested families in two formats for the 2021-2022 school year.

- Synchronous learning will be mandatory for all students in grades K-6. In addition to their
 online teacher, students will have access to an academy facilitator, school
 counselor, FRYSC, and ESS teachers.
- Asynchronous learning will be offered to students in grades 7 12 with opportunities to
 communicate frequently with an academy facilitator and content specialists. Academy
 facilitators will communicate weekly with parents and students, and content specialists will
 be available after regular school hours for office hours. Students will also have access to
 guidance counselors, FRYSC, and ESS teachers.

Parents/guardians interested in enrolling students in the Magoffin County Virtual Academy for the 2021-2022 school year will complete an application. During the conference, a checklist of expectations will be reviewed and discussed. This checklist will include all components of the academy (program description, schedule, expectations, timelines for enrollment and withdrawal, student participation, grading, teacher feedback, communication, help for struggling students, local and state assessments, digital citizenship, etc.).

Content:

Grades K – 12

Academy facilitators, virtual teachers, principal(s), content specialists, ESS teachers, and technology leader(s) will meet as Professional Learning Communities during the summer and throughout the school year to align all course offerings with KAS. During the PLCs, personnel will review the digital resources available (Edgenuity, IXL, and Moby Max) and assign content where appropriate.

Digital Pedagogy:

All virtual teachers will be trained in the delivery of online/blended learning with a focus on the <u>Characteristics of Highly Effective Teaching and Learning</u> and the <u>Kentucky Framework for Teaching</u>. All virtual teachers will also receive ongoing training in selecting and utilizing high

quality instructional resource, evidence-based virtual and blended instructional strategies as well as effective use of the Edgenuity platform (LMS).

The district will provide or hire the following personnel to provide supports to virtual students.

- <u>Academy Director</u> The academy director title will be assigned to an existing central office administrator to oversee all aspects of the Virtual Academy.
- Academy Facilitator (at least one for grades K-6, one for grades 7-8, and one for grades 9-12) The academy facilitator will serve as a connector between students/families and the school community. 

McLean County Public Schools Virtual Learning Academy will consist of virtual learning provided through a variety of instructional methods including electronic curriculum designed for self-paced study/learning (asynchronous) and live web-conferencing through online teaching/learning/tutoring (synchronous) using various learning management systems to ensure grade level/course standards and assessments are implemented. The following information is provided to help families understand the difference between the VLA model used during the 2020-2021 school year that was designed solely for the pandemic, and the newly designed VLA model option for the upcoming 2021-2022 school year and beyond.

PURPOSE

The Virtual Learning Academy (VLA) model was originally developed from the needs that arose due to the pandemic. It was designed to be a temporary solution for families who were not able to attend in-person instruction during the 2020-2021 school year due to medical or other concerns related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

During the 2021-2022 school year and beyond, we will continue to offer a virtual learning option for our students and families; however, the purpose and format of this new VLA model will look significantly different than it did during the 20-21 school year. The purpose is simply to provide a different type of learning opportunity for students who thrive in a virtual learning environment.

FORMAT

The new VLA model for 2021-2022 and beyond will be a digital platform-based learning model which will serve as the primary source of instruction. A platform is a computer-based program that provides access to videos, tutorials, explanations, and practice activities for each course/class in which the student is enrolled. The student will complete all required platform work and any supplemental work that is assigned within the deadlines and timeframes. In addition to the platform work, the student will have required scheduled synchronous (live- in person or virtual-Zoom) sessions with a teacher to provide additional small group and/or one-on-one instruction, guidance, reteaching, interventions, and special services. Optional tutoring and office hours with a live teacher will also be available on a limited basis. *Elementary students (K-5) will be required to attend at minimum two live sessions each day.

We are currently in the process of reviewing and selecting the best platform for our needs and will have a recommendation by May.

CONSIDERATIONS FOR ENROLLMENT

Enrollment for the 2021-2022 VLA model will be limited and not all who apply will be accepted. Through our experience with the pandemic VLA model, we recognize that a virtual learning

environment is not the best environment for all students, but it is a good option for some students and families. Before applying to VLA, the family must make sure this learning option is the right one for their child and that the student is equipped with the necessary skills to be successful in an online learning environment.

The VLA allows students to participate in grade level and appropriate coursework utilizing an online platform as the main vehicle for instruction. Students are expected to participate in all course work and will receive a grade based on the mastery of the content and the participation in the course.

Montgomery County virtual students are still students of the Montgomery County School district and must adhere to all policies, rules, and guidelines as students in the traditional classroom setting. (See Montgomery County Virtual School Contract).

Students who are considering enrolling in VLA should exhibit the following characteristics, either independently, or in the case of younger students, with strong support from their parents/guardians:

- Self-motivated
- Ability to work independently
- Ability to set and meet deadlines
- Perseverance
- Taking initiative to ask for help when confused
- Ability to follow a schedule
- Prior demonstrated success, or potential for success, in a virtual learning environment

Parents/guardians who are considering enrolling their child in VLA should make certain they can provide the following supports:

- Assisting the student in creating and adhering to a schedule
- Regularly monitoring progress and assignment completion within the learning platform
- Communicating with and responding to teachers and staff members
- Ensuring the student attends all scheduled synchronous (live) sessions
- Establishing a distraction-free workspace within the home
- Ensuring reliable access to technology and internet

Interested families must complete an application for each student they wish to enroll, commit to adhering to the established VLA expectations, and commit to staying enrolled for a minimum of one entire semester. Applications will be reviewed by a committee and families will be notified of the final enrollment decision.

This includes sessions that may be scheduled for small groups, interventions, and other special services. *Elementary students will be required to attend at minimum two		
٥	live sessions every day. Active participation during scheduled live (synchronous/zoom) sessions is an expectation for VLA. This involves use of the webcam and microphone at the teacher's request, responding to the teacher's questions and discussion prompts throughout the class, actively listening to directions and explanation of content, asking clarifying questions, and using the chat feature when appropriate. This means students should not be doing other tasks or using other devices or electronics during scheduled meeting times.

Families should be aware teachers can request that cameras be turned on during live sessions to promote opportunities for engagement, monitoring, and interaction. For unique situations with individual students who may not benefit from camera usage during the live stream, the family should contact the teacher to discuss options.
 Parents/guardians should provide a space in the home for students to have a distraction-free learning environment during live VLA sessions. Since the area behind the student may be visible to others when the camera is on, it is the family's responsibility to make sure the student is in a video location that does not divulge any information they don't want to share (such as address, background, people walking through the home, etc.).
 Families should be aware that teachers may record synchronous (live) sessions. These recordings are made available on an as-needed basis. Media release opt-outs do not apply to recording live lessons.
 VLA students will be required to take all state required assessments and some local

ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS

VLA students will have access to all required state curriculum and coursework to meet the minimum grade level and graduation requirements. While we will make every effort to ensure the learning platform offers a robust and varied curriculum, electives and special course offerings may be more limited than they are in a traditional in-person school setting.

assessments (major unit assessments and universal screeners - ex. MAP) in person.

Students who are enrolled in VLA are expected to enroll full-time in the virtual setting. However, in certain instances, students may be granted permission to participate in an on-campus class if the class or program cannot be offered through virtual learning such as band, some CTE options, etc.

VLA students are allowed to participate in sports, extra-curricular activities, and after school events with their home school of enrollment if they choose.

VLA students must fully participate in all required local, state, and federal assessments. Whenever possible, assessments that can be administered remotely will be administered virtually according to the guidelines provided by the state and/or assessment company. Some assessments require in-person trained proctors to ensure statistical validity. For these assessments, the student may be required to report to an on-campus site to complete the assessment. Appointments for these assessments will be scheduled and communicated with the parent/guardian and student.

After 7 days of inactivity, the instructor and/or VLA Coordinator will make every effort to contact the student and/or parent. All communication and communication attempts with students and/or parents will be documented. Students are required to keep up with course pacing and demonstrate they are on pace to complete all assigned tasks.

Students may be withdrawn from the VLA and given an incomplete after two weeks (10 days) of non-participation. Access to the Montgomery County VLA online platform will be blocked upon withdrawal and the student will be expected to enroll in their home school. A student may re-enroll into the VLA with permission from the instructor and site administrator. A newly signed school-parent student compact letter must be submitted upon re-enrollment.

Parents must turn in all doctor excuses/parent notes for student absences.)

Montgomery County Virtual Learning Academy Parent/Student Agreement 2021-2022

The Montgomery County Virtual Learning Academy is a means to offer students an opportunity to participate in online learning provided through the district's sponsorship. Because online learning represents a non-traditional learning experience there are certain expectations for students enrolling in these courses. This contract is intended to present to students and their parents the standards expected for enrollment in Montgomery County's Virtual Learning Academy.

As a student/parent enrolling in the VLA, I am aware that, in addition to the policies and requirements of my school/district, I am expected to comply with the following standards:

- 1. All students are required to log into their VLA courses on a daily basis and participate in all scheduled live/synchronous (zoom) sessions (unless prior arrangements have been made with the instructor) in order to maintain enrollment and be considered in attendance. Students need to make a major commitment and must interact with the content, discussion boards, and other course materials often. If a student is unable to login to the system within each 7 calendar days, for any reason, they need to make direct contact with their instructor for directions. Students must keep current and/or make up all coursework. * Elementary students (K-5) are required to participate in at minimum 2 daily live sessions with their teacher. Attendance will be taken and all attendance/truancy policies will be enforced.
- 2. After 7 calendar days of inactivity, the instructor and/or the VLA Coordinator will attempt to contact the student and/or parent through various communication channels (phone call, email, text message, or message through platform). All communication and communication attempts with students and/or parents will be documented. Students are required to keep up with course pacing and demonstrate they are on schedule to complete all assigned tasks.
- 3. Students will be withdrawn and given an incomplete after two weeks (14 calendar days) of non-participation unless a prior arrangement was made with instructor/VLA administrator or student nonparticipation is excused. Access to the Montgomery County VLA online platform will be blocked upon withdrawal. A student may re-enroll into the course with permission from the instructor and site

- administrator. A newly signed school-parent student compact letter must be submitted upon re-enrollment. *All attendance/truancy policies will be enforced.
- 4. Students will be asked to report to a school site to receive targeted in person instruction as well as to complete unit course assessments and/or meet with instructors to review progress. (Time and location to be determined by instructor and student/parent.) Students failing to make adequate progress may be withdrawn from the VLA.
- 5. Students that withdraw or are withdrawn from the VLA due to nonparticipation or failing to make progress will be expected to return to their designated school and abide by all attendance policies of the Montgomery County School district.
- 6. Students must abide by all rules and regulations outlined in the Montgomery County Student Handbook, Virtual Learning Academy Handbook and the Montgomery County Acceptable User Policy. Any violations of code or policy could lead to an immediate withdrawal from the VLA.
- 7. Students are responsible for computer/internet access on a daily basis. Students that cannot access the online platform daily will need to return to school.
- 8. Students must complete all state and school required assessments in-person. This includes, but is not limited to, EOC assessments, K-PREP, ACT, PLAN, Explore, ASVAB, WorkKeys, KOSSA or any other exam administered at the state or school level. Failure to complete any required assessment will lead to immediate removal from virtual learning.

- 1. Performance-Based virtual students included in the exception set forth at 702 KAR 7:125(1)(4)(g) shall not be covered by this waiver. The district shall continue to count Performance-Based virtual students in pupil attendance subject to all provisions of 702 KAR 7:125.
- 2. Attendance shall be tracked by a certified teacher at a course level for virtual middle and high school students covered by this waiver. Each course shall have attendance stored in the student information system attendance tables following KDE guidance. Attendance shall be tracked by a certified teacher at least two times each school day for fully virtual elementary school students with checks three hours apart. Each course shall have attendance stored in the student information system attendance tables following KDE guidance. These courses shall not be set up as virtual/performance-based courses.
- 3. Attendance clerks or other assigned district personnel shall reconcile attendance for each course/period to ensure proper codes are entered for absent students. Attendance events shall continue to be entered at the office level (i.e. Dr. Excuses/parent excuses). District understands and agrees that attendance information provided shall be subject to audit by KDE.
- 4. All truancy laws shall be followed for virtual students. District shall develop and implement policies to address virtual attendance absences, including the attendance status of students with an internet outage and the process to return students to in-person instruction for truancy violations, in addition to legal action which may be required by KRS 159.150, 159.180, and other applicable truancy laws.
- 5. Only students whose families have requested to be enrolled in the virtual school, program, or academy are included under this waiver, accompanied by school and district approved documentation resulting from locally adopted policies for enrollment. No student shall be involuntarily placed in the virtual school, program, or academy. No student shall be placed in the virtual school, program, or academy solely due to disciplinary reasons. The Admissions and Release Committee (ARC) of any student with an Individual Education Program (IEP) pursuant to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) shall document the students enrollment in the virtual school, program, or academy in the ARC Conference Summary.
- 6. All students shall be full-time enrolled in the virtual school, program, or academy.
- 7. Only students with determined appropriate digital access and support beyond the school campus shall be candidates for enrollment in the virtual school, program, or academy. The district shall establish and implement an application and on-boarding process to ensure students and families understand the expectations for full-time enrollment in a virtual school, program, or academy and a determination of candidacy. The district shall ensure all students enrolled in virtual school, program, or academy have appropriate digital access to fully participate in and access the virtual program.
- 8. The virtual school, program, or academy shall have teachers and other staff assigned to support and provide instruction aligned to the grade-level expectations established in the *Kentucky Academic Standards* (*KAS*), including the selection, vetting, and usage of high-quality instructional resources aligned to the *KAS* and grade-level appropriate work. The use of standards-aligned high-quality instructional resources and curriculum is also assured via the annual

superintendent assurance regarding the Kentucky Digital Learning Guidelines. District shall maintain evidence of having systemic formative assessment processes in place to: (1) accurately measure student progress on grade-level standards for students enrolled in a virtual school, program, or academy; and (2) support students enrolled in the virtual school, program, or academy needing accelerated learning on grade-level standards within Tier 1 universal instruction as well as those students who need more targeted Tier 2 and Tier 3 interventions and supports.

- 9. The virtual school, program, or academy shall implement synchronous (real-time or live) strategies and digital platforms for two-way student to teacher visual and verbal interactions. Additionally the virtual school, program, or academy shall utilize a learning management system (LMS) or other digital platforms that allows teachers to monitor student's progress, interactions and engagement with the teacher and other students online for the review of student work and completion of assignments in both real-time and on-demand (asynchronous interactions). District understands and that frequent live, regularly-scheduled contact with a Kentucky certified teacher is suggested to produce more effective results and assures that the virtual school, program, or academy implemented pursuant to waivers contained herein will prioritize frequent live, regularly-scheduled contact with a Kentucky certified teacher.
- 10. The district shall fully comply with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act, and all applicable laws and regulations for the education of students with disabilities. For the 2021-2022 school year, Murray Independent plans to offer a virtual option for students in grades 6-12 as an 'academy' option embedded within our current schools. For students who select this option, we will utilize a combination of high quality instructional materials, strategies, and certified teachers. Primarily students will engage with the Edgenuity platform to receive high quality content in all areas. However, students will also receive a combination of live synchronous meetings with certified teachers as well as utilizing other platforms relevant to the student grade level. For instance in middle grades our students utilize Study Island for Science, IXL for Math and ELA, and other platforms when needed specifically for content and practice.

All students will utilize Google Classroom and Google Meet to communicate and stay on track with instruction. Students will be provided a school issued Chromebook to ensure equitable access to all platforms. Students will also receive individual support in learning to utilize and engage with these platforms.

Staff will be assigned to virtual students based on interest and enrollment, number of staff will be determined at a later date. Staff will include appropriately certified teachers for the student grade levels as well as classified support staff if necessary. Students who receive services through an Individual Education Plan, 504 Plan, Program Service Plan (EL), or Gifted and Talented Plan will continue to receive their services from the appropriate provider according to the student's individual plan and needs. Those providers will work with certified teachers monitoring virtual learning to ensure time and mode of receiving services is met for each student in the program.

The Rowan County School District is requesting a waiver to allow students to enroll in full-time virtual for the 2021-2022 school year utilizing the Academy model. This school within a school model will enable students Kindergarten through 12th Grade to participate virtually. These students shall be assigned a schedule that aligns with the standard in-person student's schedules and the hour requirements. Principals and counselors shall ensure that virtual student's schedules align with the standard day of in-person students.

Certified teachers will provide instruction to students that have been approved. Only students determined to have appropriate digital access and support will be approved. Parent/guardian must have digital access (internet) in the home. Internet services are deemed appropriate if a You Tube video may be viewed with good quality. A full time Digital Learning Coach will be available to support instructional technology for both teachers and students. Rowan County Board of Education will provide detailed information to families regarding the requirements for enrolling in the Viking Virtual Academy via email, district and school web pages, recorded webcasts, and FAQ sheets. An application has been developed and timelines established for submission/approval/notification/reason.



Union County Public Schools vision for virtual education in an A5 program setting and an academy setting will be for teachers to utilize a variety of technology tools, that they already use, to support learning that isn't face to face be as effective and as close as possible to what they would participate in on a normal school day. Teachers will develop lesson plans that can deliver the same content over a virtual platform. Students will participate in virtual instruction and use online resources by accessing them through the district's Google platform. The district has developed a plan to increase the level of Google Certified teachers in each building to help with the implementation of using Google Classroom and Google resources to organize virtual instruction so that it is easily accessible to all students. 702 KAR 7:125 Section 1(4) states:

Pupils shall be physically present in the school to be counted in attendance except under the following conditions:

The district is requesting a waiver of this language to include in the definition of "the school" to include a public virtual school, program, or academy, established by a Kentucky Public School District, where

instruction occurs using digital platforms, technologies, with continued access to certified teachers. Where each student is assigned full-time to the virtual school, program, or academy and there are teachers and other staff assigned to support and provide instruction (via the annual superintendent assurance regarding the Kentucky Digital Learning Guidelines). The virtual learning experience design shall allow for the monitoring of each student's interactions and engagement online, allows for synchronous (or live) visual and verbal interactions and the review of student work and completion of assignments in both real-time and on-demand (asynchronous interactions).

702 KAR 7:125 Section 1(1) states:

Daily attendance of pupils in elementary schools shall be determined by taking attendance one (1) time each day prior to the start of instruction and maintaining a pupil entry and exit log at each school.

The district is requesting that for any elementary school pupil that is enrolled full-time in a public virtual school, program, or academy daily attendance shall be determined by taking attendance twice a day: once at the beginning of instruction and once more in the second half of the school day (to account for full day or partial day funding mechanisms).

District Assurances

The district assures that:

- 1. Performance-Based virtual students included in the exception set forth at 702 KAR 7:125(1)(4)(g) shall not be covered by this waiver. The district shall continue to count Performance-Based virtual students in pupil attendance subject to all provisions of 702 KAR 7:125.
- 2. Attendance shall be tracked by a certified teacher at a course level for virtual middle and high school students covered by this waiver. Each course shall have attendance stored in the student information system attendance tables following KDE guidance. Attendance shall be tracked by a certified teacher at least two times each school day for fully virtual elementary school students with checks three hours apart. Each course shall have attendance stored in the student information system attendance tables following KDE guidance. These courses shall not be set up as virtual/performance-based courses.
- 3. Attendance clerks or other assigned district personnel shall reconcile attendance for each course/period to ensure proper codes are entered for absent students. Attendance events shall continue to be entered at the office level (i.e. Dr. Excuses/parent excuses). District understands and agrees that attendance information provided shall be subject to audit by KDE.
- 4. All truancy laws shall be followed for virtual students. District shall develop and implement policies to address virtual attendance absences, including the attendance status of students with an internet outage and the process to return students to in-person instruction for truancy violations, in addition to legal action which may be required by KRS 159.150, 159.180, and other applicable truancy laws.
- 5. Only students whose families have requested to be enrolled in the virtual school, program, or academy are included under this waiver, accompanied by school and district approved documentation resulting from locally adopted policies for enrollment. No student shall be involuntarily placed in the virtual school, program, or academy. No student shall be placed in the virtual school, program, or academy solely due to disciplinary reasons. The Admissions and Release Committee (ARC) of any student with an Individual Education Program (IEP) pursuant to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) shall document the students enrollment in the virtual school, program, or academy in the ARC Conference Summary.
- 6. All students shall be full-time enrolled in the virtual school, program, or academy.
- 7. Only students with determined appropriate digital access and support beyond the school campus shall be candidates for enrollment in the virtual school, program, or academy. The district shall establish and implement an application and on-boarding process to ensure students and families understand the expectations for full-time enrollment in a virtual school, program, or academy and a determination of candidacy. The district shall ensure all students enrolled in virtual school, program, or academy have appropriate digital access to fully participate in and access the virtual program.
- 8. The virtual school, program, or academy shall have teachers and other staff assigned to support and provide instruction aligned to the grade-level expectations established in the *Kentucky Academic Standards* (*KAS*), including the selection, vetting, and usage of high-quality instructional resources aligned to the *KAS* and grade-level appropriate work. The use of standards-aligned high-quality instructional resources and curriculum is also assured via the annual

superintendent assurance regarding the <u>Kentucky Digital Learning Guidelines</u>. District shall maintain evidence of having systemic formative assessment processes in place to: (1) accurately measure student progress on grade-level standards for students enrolled in a virtual school, program, or academy; and (2) support students enrolled in the virtual school, program, or academy needing accelerated learning on grade-level standards within Tier 1 universal instruction as well as those students who need more targeted Tier 2 and Tier 3 interventions and supports.

- 9. The virtual school, program, or academy shall implement synchronous (real-time or live) strategies and digital platforms for two-way student to teacher visual and verbal interactions. Additionally the virtual school, program, or academy shall utilize a learning management system (LMS) or other digital platforms that allows teachers to monitor student's progress, interactions and engagement with the teacher and other students online for the review of student work and completion of assignments in both real-time and on-demand (asynchronous interactions). District understands and that frequent live, regularly-scheduled contact with a Kentucky certified teacher is suggested to produce more effective results and assures that the virtual school, program, or academy implemented pursuant to waivers contained herein will prioritize frequent live, regularly-scheduled contact with a Kentucky certified teacher.
- 10. The district shall fully comply with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act, and all applicable laws and regulations for the education of students with disabilities. District shall fully implement accommodations and Individual Education Programs (IEP) for students with disabilities enrolled in a virtual school, program, or academy. District shall ensure that all Section 504 Teams and Admissions and Release Committees (ARC) were involved in determining how all special education, related services, and accommodations will be implemented for students with disabilities in the virtual setting.
- 11. The district shall ensure a system of high-quality professional learning on the high-quality instructional resources and on evidence-based instructional practices for virtual learning.
- 12. Fully virtual students shall be assigned a schedule that aligns with the standard day of in-person students. Virtual student schedules shall adhere to the standard day and hour requirements set forth at KRS 158.070.
- 13. District shall document all fully virtual students as non-transported for transportation funding purposes.
- 14. District understands that meals provided to students in a non-congregate setting for school year 2021-2022 are not eligible to receive reimbursement from the United States Department of Agriculture under the USDA School Meal Programs, absent approved USDA waivers. District shall review and consider how this may impact students enrolled in a virtual school, program, or academy pursuant to this waiver.
- 15. District understands that pursuant to KRS 156.010, the Commissioner of Education has authority for monitoring the management of school districts, including administration and finance, implementation of state and federal laws and regulations, and student performance. District understands that KRS 156.210 provides the Commissioner of Education with access to the papers, books and records of all teachers, superintendents, or other public-school officials. District hereby agrees that such authority specifically extends to all aspects of its operation of a virtual school, program, or academy pursuant to this waiver request and MOU. District hereby agrees that it shall ensure full and timely cooperation during any program review or audit of any aspect of its operation of a virtual school, program, or academy pursuant to this waiver request and MOU.

Much like this year, students will be required to attend live class sessions via google meets at designated times. Unlike this year, this class will be a 4/5 split, meaning one Virtual Academy teacher will be responsible for teaching both 4th and 5th grades.

Duration

If approved by the KBE and signed by the Commissioner of Education or authorized designee, this MOU shall be effective beginning July 1, 2021 and shall continue in effect until June 30, 2022 or termination as provided herein, whichever occurs first.

Termination

Pursuant to KRS 156.160(2)(c), this MOU shall be subject to termination upon a determination by the
Kentucky Board of Education that the school district has subsequently failed to meet the intent of the
waiver and assurances contained herein. The parties agree that such a determination by the Kentucky
Board of Education shall be final and binding on the parties hereto.
