

One of my goals is to amplify the voices of educators and increase their collaboration across Kentucky.



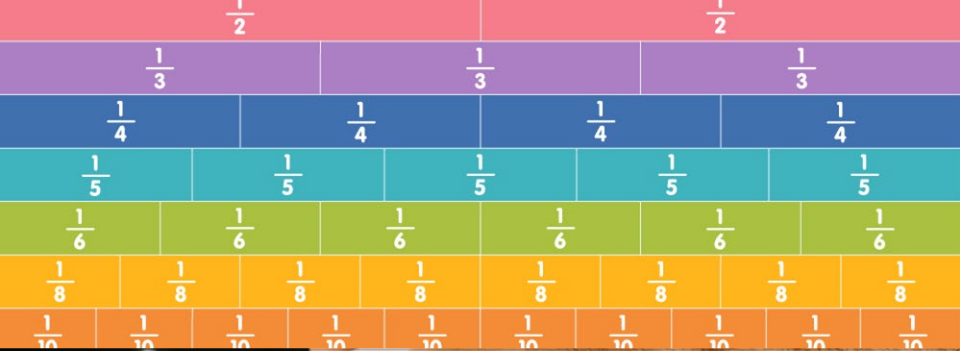

- a new approach to discussing poetry, etc.



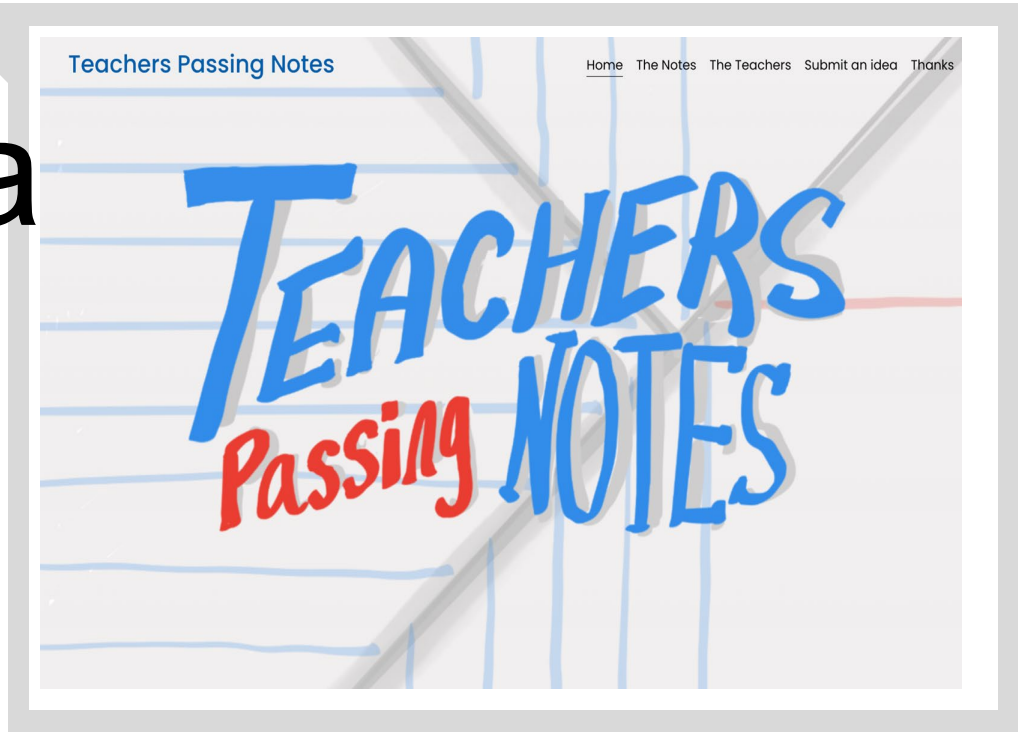

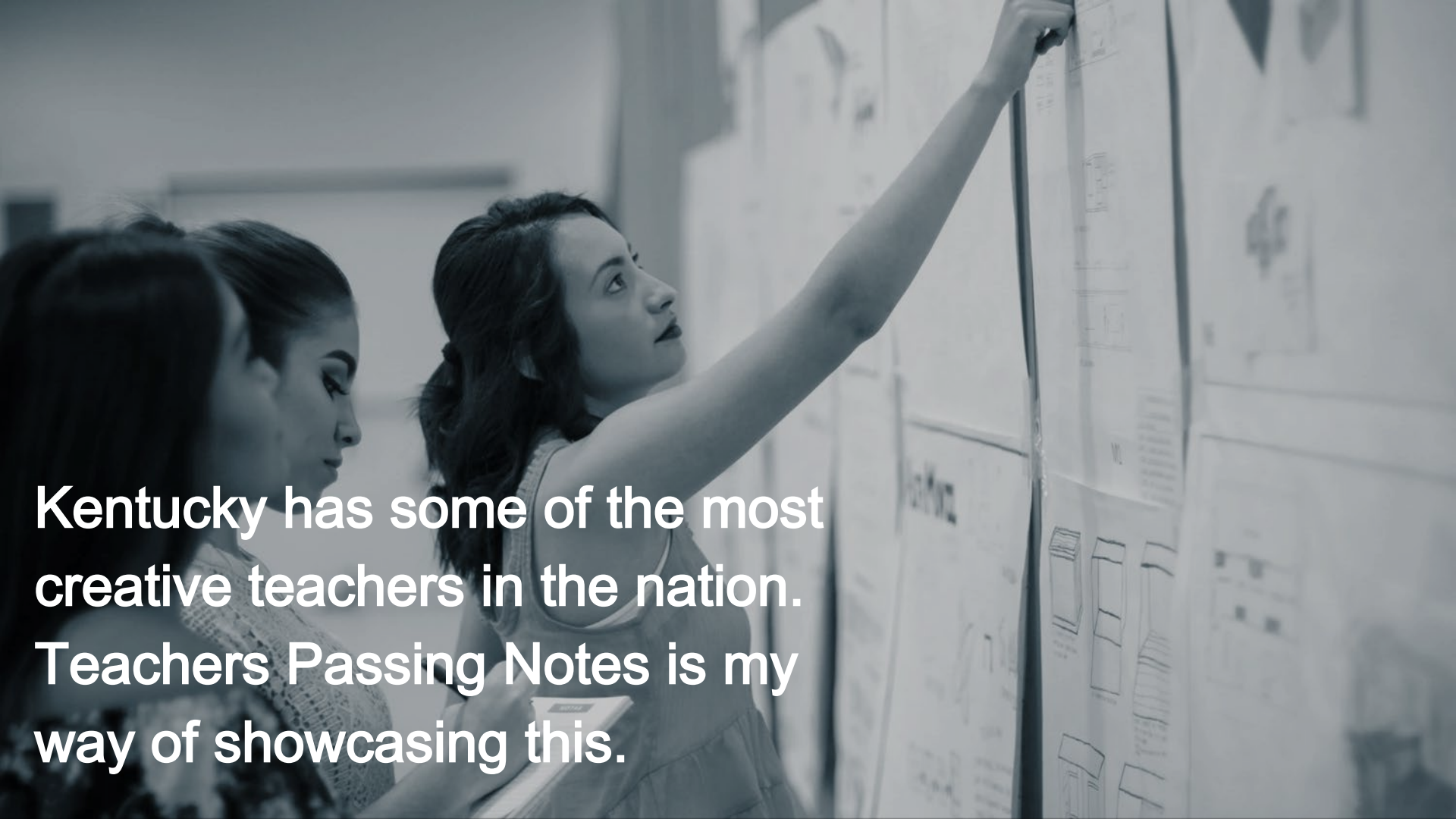
Collaboration has been so critical to my success as an educator.


