❖ Summer at Lincoln ~

- Summer Enrichment Program ~
 - 151 students are signed up for this Enrichment Opportunity. Initial numbers are showing students are slow beginning this enrichment incentive. <u>However</u>, additional and individualized outreach began the week of June 14th to families.
 - Program Outline: This opportunity is geared to ALL current LES students in grades K 6. Students who sign-up will keep their learning devices over the summer by agreeing to participate in Lexia (Reading) and SuccessMaker (Math) during the summer months. Students meeting their learning goals will receive incentives along the way. (Flyer is included in submitted items)
- Summer Learning Program ~
 - 123 students are signed up for our summer program. This equals 29% of our student enrollment. Our attendance has been incredible and the learning is very intentional.
 - Update: Students in grades K 7th grades are being serviced during our learning program.
 - Program Outline: An Eight-week academic and enrichment camp collaboration with our 21st Century Learning Program will run from June 7th July 30th. This is targeted for students in current grades preschool 5th grade who are performing below grade level in either math or reading or both. Specific targeted interventions will be used with students with the purpose of focusing on missing skills and continued growth through the summer. Partnership with The Reading League –

- Update: 15 Lincoln teachers/administrators have volunteered to participate in a Book Study group this summer led by Ms. Amanda Berringer. This is work that will prepare us for our upcoming work with The Reading League.
- Partnership Details: Lincoln has partnered with The Reading League (TRL) for our upcoming school year. TRL is a national education nonprofit led by educators and reading experts dedicated to promoting knowledge to reimagine the future of literacy education and accelerate the global movement toward reading instruction rooted in science. Their purpose is to increase knowledge of science-based approaches to teach reading as well as research that demystifies how people learn to benefit the lives of millions of students.
