Academic/School Day Successes for 2020-2021

Interventions:

APEX Credit Recovery Lab
441 students received half credits in our APEX credit recovery this year. This is compared to 378 last year.

We offered college and career readiness (CCR) in math and English to freshmen, sophomores and seniors. Students showed growth in all classes, grades and areas.

Preliminary Assessment data:
Reading Year scores were: English- 1831, Math- 18278, Science- 1930, English- 1887.
End of Program Assessment after Industry Certifications- 66 seniors earned industry certifications in their career pathways.
Only 65 seniors were college and career ready. We seniors were college and career ready 743 seniors

Goals for 2021-2022

- We will be very proactive in our hiring this year to secure the best teacher candidates available. We began posting jobs and interviewing/hiring in April of 2021.
- Our intervention team is working on strategies to better implement intervention strategies for students next year. An intervention ad hoc committee was formed last year to plan and prepare for school-wide interventions for all students no matter their ability level. We have hired three new interventionists (math, ELA and behavior) to help in this area. We also received the Re-Engagement Grant through KDE for the 20-21 school year that concludes Sept 30, 2021. Two part-time interventionists were hired to work in this capacity. We are planning to re-apply for this grant and are hopeful to receive it for the 21-22 school year.
- We will continue work to improve our college and career readiness so that students may transition out of high school prepared for employment, the military or college.
- There will be a focus on the new assessment and strategies to continue our academic progress – especially with the new accountability system. We will be using programs such as No Red Ink (premium package), MI Write (on demand writing) and CERT (ACT prep) to monitor student growth in those areas.
- Over the last five years, we have moved as a school to be able to be 1:1 with technology. Currently, we have over 1,600 chrome books and we are looking to add 500 more with our district ESSER funds.
- Re-igniting and re-engaging our students we lost during COVID (fell behind who are credit deficient). We will offer two Summer School events (Destination Acceleration) in June and July that will consist of enrichment, recovery and deeper instruction and learning.

What's New

We held classes in person and virtually through non-traditional instruction during the 20-21 school year. Staff were forced to collaborate more and grow in using technology more and in new, creative ways. Because of COVID-19, we were not able to start and conduct our school year in the traditional way. We were able to begin having normal activities with our students, especially our seniors in April and May with events such as graduation walk, awards and scholarship ceremonies. We were able to purchase several tech apps our teachers used consistently during NTI such as Newsela, Edpuzzle, Peardeck, Nearpod, Moby Max, Kami, Gamkit to name a few. These licenses are good for the 21-22 school year.

New interventionist positions were given to NHHS in math and reading. Our SBDM Council also approved a discretionary position to be used in the form of a behavior interventionist. Finally, we were awarded a Re-engagement Grant for the 20-21 school year which we hope to get renewed for the 21-22 school year.

TECHNOLOGY PURCHASES: SCHOOL YEAR 2020-2021

- Our technology purchases have been directed more towards Chromebooks so that our students can better utilize the web. Over the last five years, we have moved as a school to be able to be 1:1 with technology. Currently, we have over 1,600 chrome books and we are looking to add 500 more with our district ESSER funds.
