### Success Stories for 2020-2021

- We survived NTI and all of the twists and turns that were related to Covid protocols.
- Teachers learned how to successfully navigate online teaching and were taught how to utilize multiple platforms and programs to make NTI successful.
- New flooring was installed throughout the school and a new paint job was also completed by our custodians. The interior of the school looks wonderful.
- We held an online open house, provided videos of staff reading children's books aloud, had spirit weeks fueled by social media, all to keep families engaged during such an uncertain time.
- We partnered with Delta Sigma Theta sorority to provide 75 Meadow View families with Thanksgiving and holiday meals. Extra meals were also provided to other north end families.
- Our FRC coordinator created a scavenger hunt activity that was used by all north end schools to provide families with a safe and socially distanced activity during Spring Break. Over 150 Meadow View students and their families participated.
- Through a grant with the Hardin County Conservation Service we erected a Hi-Tunnel greenhouse that our teachers will be able to utilize during science instruction. Currently summer vegetable crops and flowers that were planted by students are growing in the hi-tunnel.
- Class Dojo was used as our school-wide PBIS points management system. This allowed for parents to see in real-time the successes of their students. These points, as a part of our school-wide PBIS initiative, were given to students who were caught being "positive, prepared, or productive." All students who reached 92% or above each month were rewarded. Grand prize winners were chosen monthly from each classroom.

- After school tutoring at all grade levels was held in the spring on Tuesdays and Thursdays. (ESS funded). Students were hand-selected during PLCs based on MAP data, IReady data, and classroom assessments.

### Goals for 2021-2022

Meadow View will strive to increase student achievement in the areas of reading and math in the coming year. We are working to build a strong culture of reading throughout our building and have several school-wide events planned to help spur student excitement for reading. We will also focus on Math workshop and hands on activities to help increase engagement of students.

Meadow View will strive to increase student and staff celebrations/recognitions, that will in turn lead to retention of quality teachers and staff members. We also will attempt to increase our parent and community involvement in the coming school year. We believe that celebrating our students and our staff is vital to creating a climate and ultimately a culture of success. We also believe that the involvement of our parents and community will further help to build a successful school environment.
