#### **B. AREAS ADDRESSED:**

- Master schedule reflects minimal movement/class changes for students due to COVID restrictions. Also students don't have 7 classes if we go to NTI.

- MAP Assessment administered in Math, Reading, and Language Usage during the fall, winter, and spring for all students. Data was compiled in all areas and growth was monitored. We saw growth in our students throughout the school year as evidenced by MAP data/reports even during the pandemic.
- MAP results reviewed with the SBDM Council fall, winter, and spring.
- ESS program consisted of Day time waiver of assistants giving KSI instruction and data monitoring. We also had a morning program for Reading and Math KSI students-57.
- IXL purchased with Title 1 funds for all students for Reading and Math.
- School Emergency Plan Approved
- Emphasis on PBIS school-wide
- District wide PLD days reported
- CSIP shared and approved along with Needs Assessment, Closing the Achievement Gap, Executive Summary, Title 1 Annual Review, School Assurances
- Individual student conferences over MAP and KPREP test
- Activities were coordinated for our school community through our Family Resource
- Professional Development plan for 21-22
- Title 1 Compact and Parent Involvement Policy as well as Title 1 budget for 21-22
- SEL with Joel Katte the 4th quarter for students

- Made a back to school google website (Virtual Open House) that included all important information to return to school and a welcome back video.
- Made a Veterans Day slideshow presentation for all the students that submitted pictures of family members that are Veterans
- OLA students had the opportunity to come in and take the MAP test
- PBIS store taken around on a cart for students to buy things with their Bruin bucks
- Used Wednesdays the first quarter to invite students into school that are falling behind, students with an IEP/504
- Hired 2 ESS Instructional Assistants to help with RTI data collection and monitoring
- 8th grade grade placed runner up in the conference championship game
- Received Gold Level Status from the state for our PBIS program
- Community Service project to Feeding America Backpack program (donations)
- Had a virtual book fair for students
- 1st quarter virtual team pride rally to award points for team of the year
- Counselors created a Mindfulness Google Classroom for both students and staff
- Approved CSIP
- Approved School Report Card
- Mrs. Nickell recognized the students from last school year for Perfect Attendance and Honor Roll on the announcements and presented them with certificates and medals
- Had students write letters to Veterans whose names were submitted to us, they were mailed to them.
- Paula Hildabrand received an HCS Stronger Together Award at the HCS board meeting
- Presented the district and school NTI plan
- Presented winter MAP data (on grade level percents)
- Governor's Cup District Runner Ups for the Academic Team
- Academic Team- 6th grade Showcase placed first in their competition
- Several students qualified for the National Beta Convention (19 areas) from the State Convention that was held virtually (32 students)
- Hosted a Spirit Week
- The Academic Team placed 2nd in the Regional Competition, Quick Recall team made it to State by placing first place.

- 7<sup>th</sup> and 8th grade volleyball teams made it to the Championship game. 7th grade Runner-up and 8th grade went undefeated and won the Conference Championship.
- Had our last home game here and honored all the former athletes with a special slide show presentation
- 8th graders with their parents had the opportunity to sit down with a staff member at CHHS about their freshman schedule.
- 7<sup>th</sup> grade boys basketball teams made it to the championship game, Runner Ups
- Conducted both the staff and parent engagement survey and results were shared
- Band held a Spring concert at Central Hardin
- STLP teams presented to SBDM and then placed in the State Competition
- News Enterprise did a story on Mrs. Douglas's projects
- EHMS hosted a GO365 Biometric Screening for employees
- Fifteen students nominated for McCoy's Young Achiever Award
- Summer Camps offered for all students (Destination Acceleration)-
  - o Took 26 students from failing for the year to passing.  
6th- 5, 7th- 10, 8th-11
  - Had 26 IEP/504 students attend 3 weeks of summer school to target skills needed for the next grade level. 6th-13, 7th-6, 8th- 7
  - Had 30 GT students attend one week of summer camp with a unit on Systems (visited the WKU planetarium and the Louisville Aviation Center)
  - Daily average attendance anywhere between 45-55 students
- We had three certified teachers retire at the end of the year and one classified
- Hired 7 new certified teachers and two classified
