20-21 Points of Action:

- Consulted on the hiring of 3 IA positions, 4 Certified teacher positions, 1 cafeteria manager position, 4 ESS hourly positions, 3 Title 1 hourly positions, and 1 office manager positions.
- Approved ESS, PPA, and Principal's combining budgets for 21-22.
- Approved Title 1 Set Aside funding for technology licenses.
- Approved Title 1 Family Compact for 21-22
- Approved Crisis Emergency Management Safety Plan for 21-22
- Approved Staffing Allocations for 21-22
- Approved all required components of the CSIP for 20-21
- Approved FRYSC Continuation Plan for 21-22 and the FRYSC SBDM/Principal Agreement for 21-22
- Reviewed use of school space for 21-22
- Reviewed Master Schedule for 21-22
- Reviewed MAP, iReady, and Brigance data throughout 20-21.
- Revised the Student Discipline Policy
- Streamlined the SBDM policies from 41 to 19.

20-21 Points of Success

- Implemented Accelerated Reader Literacy Incentive Program. Students in grades 1-5 earned 4,400 points
- 56 At-Risk students were brought into the building for daily instruction despite A/B schedule and NTI due to COVID.
- Students At-Risk decreased from 23% to 7% in Math from Fall to Spring and in Reading from 12% to 9% between Winter and Spring.
- CES placed third in the district for Reading Fluency.
- 25 students returned from OLA to in person instruction during the school year.
- CES introduced the Cubbies program to introduce students ages 1-5 to CES and begin early literacy and math skills with a focus on language development.
- 63 families joined our new Cubbies outreach program
- CES became part of the Dolly Parton Miracle Library Program.
- 261 student entries into the ESS program this year. 2,108 total service hours for the year for the students that we served.
- CES OWLS Nature Trail was approved and funded through a variety of grants and donations including NOLIN RCC, Copelin Bros., and Vulcan Materials.
- CES Tower Garden Grant was funded through Kentucky Farm Bureau.
- CES received an excellent Safe Schools Inspection, and scores of 100 in Cafeteria Inspection and Building/Grounds Inspections.
- CES Governor's Cup Team earned Runner-Up in the district competition.
- Incoming K students received a home visit and Welcome Popsicle Picnic in place of Jumpstart due to COVID restrictions.
- Students and Staff participated in a Lip sync battle for Rock Star Day, The Great Pumpkin Drop, and Baskin Robbins for PBIS Rewards during in-person instruction.
- Built relationships with community partners through Red Ribbon Week and Career Day.
- Held "Growing Great Kids" PreK and K registration event.
- Implemented the AgSTREAM initiative.
- Provided students with Field Day, Family Movie Night, and End of Year/graduation Parade.
- Renovated school lobby to be a welcoming and student-centered space.
- Repurposed library to provide more flexible space for students.
- Implemented iReady Math Common Core curriculum with fidelity.
- 5th graders earned the Work Ethic Certification and worked towards Abound Credit Union Financial Literacy.
- Southland Dairy Farmers and the Cattlemen's Association, along with 4-H began providing opportunities for our students.
