### **Success and Additional Information:**

- ❖ The Beta Club participated in the National Convention virtually in June. Only those who placed in the top 5 at the state level qualified to participate in the National competitions. These students competed in the following competitions: Andy McDowell: Division 1 National Math test, 10th grade, Avery Shoulders: Service Snapshot Leadership Challenge, Grant Avis: Division 1 National Social Studies test, 10th grade, Jonathon Reilly: Division 1 National Science test, 9th grade, Keegan Christensen: Division 2 National Math test, 11th grade, Raymond Goodman: 3D design, Sam Christensen: Division 1 National Language Arts test, 10th grade, Keegan & Sam Christensen and Sawyer Cannon: Engineering, Keegan Christensen also attended the Regional Leadership Summit in Evansville, IN; while there, he was chosen as a Regional Leadership Representative. Based on his position, he qualified to interview for a National Leadership Representative position. Anna Turlington worked on the Living Literature entry for submission.
- ❖ The following students placed NATIONALLY in their respective BETA categories during the virtual national convention: 10th grade Math: Sammy (Andy) McDowell placed 7th in the nation. 11th grade Math: Keegan Christensen placed 4th in the nation. 10th grade Language Arts: Sam Christensen placed 3rd in the nation. 9th grade Science: Jonathon Reilly placed 2nd in the nation. 10th grade Social Studies: Grant Avis was the national champion! 1st place in the nation!

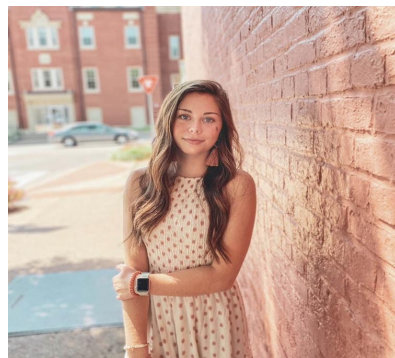

- ❖ The Bruin JROTC Battalion hosted the 10th Annual Hardin County Raider Cup at Central Hardin on 24 September. Central Hardin, Bullitt Central and North Bullitt competed for the top honors. The CPT Charles F. Thomas IV Traveling Cup is presented annually to the winner in memory of FT Knox High School and WKU graduate/ROTC Alumni who were fatally wounded in combat while serving in Vietnam. A Covid-19 limited crowd turned out for the competition and witnessed outstanding teamwork and determination. The One Rope Bridge, Tire Flip, Aid & Litter Carry, Relay and Cross Country Run events were



physically and mentally challenging for the Cadets. Senior Cadets from UofL and WKU Army ROTC along with the Kentucky Army National Guard served as judges. Central Hardin won the Traveling Cup for the 10<sup>th</sup> straight year having the highest combined team scores. Bruin Team 1 won the Top Raider Team trophy. Bruin Team 1 won 4 of the events while Team 2 had the fastest time in the One Rope Bridge. This will be Central Hardin's only competition this fall as most state and national meets have been rescheduled for the spring of 2021.
