IRE Biden's commemoration of the deaths of hundreds of Black people killed by a white mob a century ago came amid the current national reckoning on racial justice.

"Just because history is silent, it does not mean that it did not take place," Biden said. He said that "hell was unleashed, literal hell was unleashed." And now, he said, the nation must come to grips with the following sin of denial.

"We can't just choose what we want to know, and not what we should know," said Biden. "I come here to help fill the silence, because in

silence wounds deepen."

After Biden left, there was a spontaneous singing by some audience members of a famous civil rights march song, "Ain't Gonna Let Nobody Turn Me Around."

The events on Tuesday stood in stark contrast to then-President Donald Trump's trip to Tulsa last June, which was greeted by protests. Or the former president's decision, one year ago, to clear Lafayette Square near the White House of demonstrators who gathered to protest the death of George Floyd, a Black man, under the knee of a white Minneapolis police officer.

DISTRICT FACILITIES PLAN HEARING REPORT*

A public hearing was held at the Independence Bank Performing Arts Center at Graves County High School on June 17, 2021, at 5:30 PM. The purpose of the public hearing was to propose a new District Facility Plan developed by the Graves County Local Planning Committee. The Local Planning Committee (LPC) voted 15-0 in favor of the proposed new plan and the Board voted 4-1 to approve the new plan.

There were 45 individual(s) in attendance. Mark Rogers, Maintenance Director, served as the locally-appointed hearing officer. Community members, Board members, LPC members, and school personnel were present.

COMMENTS


Mark Rogers called the public hearing to order, and outlined the purpose of the hearing and the hearing procedures in accordance with 702 KAR 1:001. It was explained that those persons wishing to speak would be given the opportunity and that written statements would be accepted. All considerations will be made available to the Kentucky Board of Education via the hearing officer's report. The hearing officer read the proposed new District Facility Plan which includes; the plan showing current and long range plans, with GCMS becoming a 6-8 center. Lowes Elementary becoming a Transitional status, and all other elementary schools becoming a PS-5 center. Capital Construction Priorities schedule within the 2021-23 Biennium are priority 1 projects. Capital Construction Priorities schedule after the 2023 Biennium are priority 2. Capital Construction Priorities regardless of schedule are priority 3 and 4. District Needs are priority 5.

The floor was opened to those who wished to make a statement. Lynn Warner spoke about how the tax payers of Graves County never wanted consolidation and still don't. There were no written statements submitted.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the new District Facility Plan developed by the Graves County Local Planning Committee and adopted by the Graves County Board of Education be approved as the District Facility Plan for the Graves County School District. A copy of the new plan is attached.
