LaRUE COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT DISTRCT FACILITIES PLAN HEARING REPORT

A public hearing was held at the <u>LaRue County High School</u> on <u>May 17, 2021</u>, at <u>5:30 pm</u> (local time). The purpose of the public hearing was to propose a new District Facility Plan developed by the <u>LaRue County</u> Local Planning Committee. The Local Planning Committee (LPC) voted <u>10 for and 0 against</u> in favor of the proposed new plan and the Board voted <u>5 for and 0 against</u> to approve the new plan.

<u>Peter Fisher of RossTarrant Architects</u>, served as the locally appointed hearing officer. Besides Peter Fisher, Superintendent David Raleigh and Board of Education members Dawn Conner, Paul Cooper, Farrah Pruitt, Price Smith and Joanna Hinton were present.

<u>Peter Fisher</u> called the public hearing to order. No one wishing to speak was present and no written statements were presented. The meeting was adjourned at 6:00 pm.
