Vaccines

Healthy @ School Officer alerts Health Services

- A close contact is an unvaccinated **adult** who was within
 6 feet of an infected person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes while the person was considered contagious even when wearing a mask.
- A close contact is an unvaccinated student who was within
 3 feet of an infected person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes while the person was considered contagious even when wearing a mask.
- Fully-vaccinated persons do not need to quarantine following an exposure to a person diagnosed with COVID-19 if not experiencing symptoms.
 - Unvaccinated students/staff who are identified as close contacts will be instructed to **selfquarantine** regardless of if the contact is within or outside of school.

COVID-19 Cases: Protocol

- When a case comes in, close contacts are **notified** and given directions.
- A **notification** is sent to all students and staff in the school/work site when there is a positive case.
- After contact is made, the information is **entered into the system**.
- The system is then **updated** regularly on the JCPS website.

COVID Cases

- A quarantined student is one who has been exposed to COVID-19 and has been told by a medical professional to **quarantine** as a result of a positive case or being a close contact.
- In order to keep quarantined students connected to their classrooms, they will have online work they can do at home provided by their classroom teacher(s) or a resource teacher provided by JCPS.
 - Quarantined students will also receive live, online **instruction** and off-line **assignments**, similar to the at-home instruction that they received last school year.

Quarantined Students/Staff

- Diagnostic screening testing is available to **students and staff** with informed consent.
- **Partner** with company(ies) on stateapproved list who will provide diagnostic screening testing.
- **Consent form** is available as an online form for students and found on Parent Place. (Option for hard copy as well).
- Consent form for employees is also an online form. (Option for hard copy as well).

Diagnostic Screening Testing As of Monday, August 16:

- Just over **3500** students have signed up for diagnostic screening testing
- Just over **845** staff have signed up for diagnostic screening testing
- Sign-ups are ongoing
- Additionally, school nurses can complete symptomatic testing with parent consent

Diagnostic Screening Testing JCPS is partnering with Sphere to offer free **drive-thru COVID-19 testing** at schools across the district. The testing will run from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. each day. The testing will be offered Monday-Thursday.
