2020-2021 Accountability Waiver & Federal Classifications

Accountability Waiver & Federal Classifications

- Kentucky received official approval by the U.S. Department of Education (USED) to waive federal accountability for the 2020-2021 school year. The USED did require assessments be administered.
- Identification of Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI), Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) and Additional Targeted Support and Improvement (ATSI) was waived for the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 school years.
- Schools that received federal classifications of CSI and ATSI in the 2018-2019 school year will continue to receive support during 2021-2022.





Overview and Reporting for 2020-2021

2020-2021 Assessment Overview

- School and district staff made extraordinary efforts.
- Assessment administration windows were adjusted.
- Seven total ACT administrations (3 Fall 2020, 4 Spring 2021) were offered.
- Spring 2021 Kentucky Summative Assessment (KSA formerly K-PREP):
 - Successful online administration
 - Successful social studies field test (5, 8, 11)
 - Shortened assessment based on previously administered test items that still measured new standards, approximately 60 minutes per content area (would not meet all federal peer review elements)



Reporting for 2020-2021

- No accountability indicators or ratings
- Based on assessed students (not 100-day students)
- Participation and performance results from 2021 assessments
- Graduation Rate
- Quality of School Climate and Safety Survey
 - Climate
 - Safety
 - Opportunity to Learn
- Context for individual schools and districts is important (i.e., instructional setting, percentage tested)



Differences Impact Results and Comparability

- COVID-19 has impacted most aspects of education this school year, including the annual statewide assessment.
- As a result, the process for student test taking was changed and the results from this year's tests may look very different than previous school years.
- While we may not be able to use 2021 test scores to compare student achievement, we can still use them as a temperature check to better track and address COVID-19 school recovery.



Possible Impacts on Student Performance

- Learning Disruptions
 - School/district closures
 - Access to technology
 - Access to learning supports
- Test Modifications
 - Shortened form
 - Less time
- Participation Rates
 - Decreased participation
 - Uneven participation






Quality of School Climate and Safety/Opportunity to Learn


Quality of School Climate and Safety Survey including Opportunity to Learn

- All students in tested grades participated in the Quality of School Climate and Safety (QSCS) and Opportunity to Learn (OTL) survey. The QSCS survey consisted of 27 statements and 7 OTL statements.
- One form was administered to students in grades 3 through 5 and another form was administered to students in grades 6 through high school. Students responded whether they strongly agree, agree, disagree or strongly disagree.
- The OTL survey captured students' perceptions of their educational experiences during the 2020-2021 school year.
- OTL survey results can be used to inform educators, parents and stakeholders on students' perception of the change in instructional delivery methods due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
























2021 Elementary School Proficient and Distinguished Percentages in Reading and Mathematics by Student Group






2021 Middle School Proficient and Distinguished Percentages in Reading and Mathematics by Student Group





2021 High School Proficient and Distinguished Percentages in Reading and Mathematics by Student Group

















Percentages of Kentucky Public School Juniors Who Meet CPE Benchmarks for College-Level Readiness by Student Group




