- 7 RELATES TO: KRS 61.805 61.850, 156.070(2), 160.380, 160.445, 20 U.S.C. 1681
- 8 STATUTORY AUTHORITY: KRS 156.070(1), (2)
- 9 NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 156.070(1) requires the Kentucky
- 10 Board of Education to manage and control the common schools, including interscholastic athlet-
- 11 ics in the schools. KRS 156.070(2) authorizes the board to designate an agency to manage athlet-
- 12 ics. This administrative regulation designates an agent for middle and high school athletics; es-
- 13 tablishes the financial planning and review processes for the agent; and incorporates by reference
- 14 the bylaws, procedures, and rules of the agent.
- 15 Section 1. Definitions. (1) "Contact <u>Drill</u>" means that drills are run at Level 3, [thud, or] Level 4,
- 16 <u>or Level 5 [live action]</u>.
- 17 (2) "KBE" means Kentucky Board of Education.
- 18 (3) "KHSAA" means Kentucky High School Athletics Association.
- 19 (4) "Level 0" or "air" means that players run a drill unopposed [and] without contact.
- 20 (5) "Level 1" or "bags" means that a drill is run <u>with</u> [against] a bag or <u>against</u> another soft con-
- 21 tact surface.

(6) "Level 2" or "control" means that a drill is run at <u>an</u> [the] assigned speed until the moment of
contact; one (1) player is predetermined the winner by the coach; contact remains above the
waist, and players stay on their feet.

4 (7) "Level 3" or <u>"Control to Ground" means that a drill is run at an assigned non-competitive</u>
5 <u>speed or with players pre-engaged, there is a pre-determined winner, players are allowed to take</u>
6 their opponent to the ground in a controlled manner.

7 (8) "Level 4" or "thud" means that a drill is run at <u>a competitive</u> [the assigned] speed through the
8 moment of contact; there is <u>no</u> [not <u>a</u>] predetermined winner; contact <u>is</u> [remains] above the
9 waist; players stay on their feet, and a quick whistle ends the drill.

(8) <u>"Level 5</u> ["Level 4"] or "live [action]" means that a drill is run <u>at a competitive speed</u> in
game-like conditions [and is the only time that players are taken to the ground].

(9) "Non-Contact <u>Drill</u>" means that drills are run at Level 0, [air;] Level 1, [bags;] or Level 2[,
 control].

14 (10) "OCR" means the United States Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights.

15 Section 2. The KHSAA shall be the Kentucky Board of Education's agent to manage interscho-

16 lastic athletics at the middle and high school level in the common schools and private schools de-

17 siring to associate with KHSAA or to compete with a common school.

18 Section 3. To remain eligible to maintain the designation as the agent to manage interscholastic19 high school athletics, the KHSAA shall:

20 (1) Accept four (4) at-large members appointed by the Kentucky Board of Education to its high

21 school Board of Control;

22 (2) Sponsor an annual meeting of its member high schools;

23 (3) Provide for each member high school to have a vote on the KHSAA constitution and bylaw

1 changes submitted for consideration;

2 (4) Provide for high school regional postseason tournament net revenues to be distributed to the
3 member high schools in that region participating in that sport, utilizing a share approach deter4 mined by the high schools within that region playing that sport;

5 (5) Provide for students desiring to participate at the high school level (regardless of the level of

6 play) to be enrolled in at least grade seven (7);

7 (6) Require its governing body to annually establish goals and objectives for its commissioner

8 and perform a self-assessment and submit the results annually to the KBE by December 31;

9 (7) Advise the Department of Education of all legal action brought against the KHSAA;

10 (8) Permit a board of control member to serve a maximum of two (2) consecutive four (4) year

11 terms with no region represented for more than eight (8) consecutive years;

12 (9) Employ a commissioner and evaluate that person's performance annually by October 31, and

13 establish all staff positions upon recommendation of the commissioner;

14 (10) Permit the commissioner to employ other personnel necessary to perform the staff responsi-

15 bilities;

16 (11) Permit the Board of Control to assess fines on a member high school;

(12) Utilize a trained independent hearing officer instead of an eligibility committee for a highschool athletic eligibility appeal;

(13) Establish a philosophical statement of principles to use as a guide in a high school eligibilitycase;

(14) Conduct continual cycles of field audits of the association's entire high school membership,
which provides that each high school is audited regarding each school's compliance with 20
U.S.C. Section 1681 (Title IX) and submit annual summary reports, including the highlighting of

1 any potential deficiencies in OCR compliance to the Kentucky Board of Education;

2 (15) As a condition precedent to high school membership, require each member high school and
3 superintendent to annually submit a written certification of compliance with 20 U.S.C. Section
4 1681 (Title IX);

5 (16) Conduct all meetings related to high school athletics in accordance with KRS 61.805
6 through 61.850;

7 (17) Provide written reports of any investigations into possible violations of statute, administra8 tive regulation, KHSAA Constitution, KHSAA Bylaws, or other rules governing the conduct of
9 high school interscholastic athletics conducted by KHSAA or their designees to the superinten10 dent and principal of the involved school district and school before being made public;

(18) Not punish or sanction, in any manner, a school, student, coach, or administrator for allowing a student to play in an athletic contest or practice with the team during a time when an order of a court of competent jurisdiction permits the student to participate or otherwise stays or enjoins enforcement of a KHSAA final decision on eligibility; and

(19) Require any student enrolled initially in grade seven (7) through twelve (12) who is repeating a grade for any reason, to be ineligible, during the school year that the grade is repeated, to
compete in an interscholastic athletics competition at any level.

Section 4. To remain eligible to maintain the designation as the agent to manage interscholastic athletics at the middle school level, the KHSAA shall implement the following requirements for all participants in middle school interscholastic athletics, distribute these requirements to all middle schools, and publish via the KHSAA Web site:

22 (1) Require that these provisions apply to all middle school interscholastic athletics. The follow-

ing indicates that a team is representative of a school and classified as middle school athletics:

1 (a) The contest, event, or tournament is sponsored by a school or combined group of schools;

2 (b) Competitors wear a school-issued uniform;

3 (c) The contest, event, or tournament is sponsored by an outside entity as a school entry event,

4 which is advertised or promoted as a school event, whether or not an entry fee is required;

5 (d) A school entity pays an entry fee, for the student or team, including payment by booster or-6 ganizations;

7 (e) A school representative accompanies the student-athlete or transports the student-athlete to
8 the contest, event, or tournament;

9 (f) A designated or hired member of a school coaching staff, whether paid or unpaid, is present
10 and offering instruction, advice, evaluation, or refinement of skills or exercising other duties de11 fined as coaching within the sport rules;

(g) Transportation to or from the contest, event, or tournament utilizes school provided or approved transportation;

(h) Competitors in the contest, event, or tournament wear apparel identifying them by the nameof the school, including the formal name, informal name, or team nickname;

(i) Competitors in the contest, event, or tournament are provided promotional or other resources
by the school including school media recognition, signage, and items indicative of school representation;

(j) Competition in a contest, event, or tournament has, in any form, jurisdiction of the local
school board or school-based decision-making body, including financial or other approval control; or

(k) Competition in a contest, event, or tournament is covered by any school or school system
provided or procured insurance policy;

- 1 (2) Require that any head or assistant coach, whether paid or unpaid, desiring to coach interscho-
- 2 lastic athletics at the middle school level:
- 3 (a) Meet the requirements of KRS 156.070(2)(g)2;
- 4 (b) Meet the requirements of KRS 160.380(5) and (6); and
- 5 (c) Provide to the school documentation of successful completion of a C.P.R. course including

6 the use of an automatic external defibrillator and the first aid training, conducted by an instructor

7 or program approved by a college or university, the American Red Cross, the American Heart

8 Association, or other bona fide accrediting agency that is approved by the KHSAA based upon

9 industry standards. The certification shall be updated as required by the approving agency;

10 (3) Require adherence to the following items regarding safety, sports medicine, and risk minimi-

11 zation for all interscholastic athletics at the middle school level:

12 (a) Each student, before trying for a place on a middle school athletic team, shall provide an an-

13 nual medical examination, in accordance with KRS 156.070(2)(e), and shall use the KHSAA

14 form PPE01, with PPE02 being optional for the health care provider;

15 (b) All participants at the middle school level shall adhere to all sports medicine and risk mini-

16 mization policies in use at the high school level that may be supplemented by the school, school

- 17 district, conference, or association including:
- 18 1. Heat index and heat illness programs;
- 19 2. Wrestling weight management programs;
- 3. Concussion and other head injury policies including policies for minimizing impact exposure
 and concussion risks;
- 4. The following football drill work and practice activity limitations:
- a. Football contact and non-contact practice shall use the appropriate clothing and equipment for

- 1 the level of drill, including:
- 2 (i) A drill conducted in helmets-only shall be a Level 0, [air,] or Level 1[, bags];
- 3 (ii) A drill conducted in shells (shorts, shoulder pads, and helmets) shall be a non-contact drill;

4 and

- 5 (iii) A contact drill shall be conducted in full equipment;
- 6 b. Middle school football shall practice a minimum of eleven (11) days before engaging another
- 7 group or opponent in full contact, using the following minimum schedule:
- 8 (i) Five (5) days in helmets;
- 9 (ii) Followed by three (3) days in helmets and shoulder pads; and
- 10 (iii) Concluding with three (3) days in full equipment practice; and
- c. Contact drills shall not be conducted more than twenty-one (21) days before the first regularseason contest;
- 13 d. The [Beginning July 1, 2020, the] first regular season interscholastic contest shall not be
- 14 played before the Saturday preceding week seven (7) of the National Federation of High Schools
- 15 Standardized Procedure for Numbering Calendar Weeks;
- 16 5. The following baseball pitching limitations shall apply to all interscholastic play at the middle
- 17 school level including scrimmages, regular season, and post season games:
- a. The pitch count shall be based on pitches thrown for strikes (including foul balls), balls, ballsin play, and outs;
- 20 b. Warm-up pitches allowed before each inning, warm-up pitches allowed by the umpire in case
- of injury or game delay, and plays attempted against the batter-runner or any runner at first, sec-
- 22 ond, or third base shall not count against this limit;
- c. A pitcher at any level who reaches the pitch count limit in the middle of an at-bat shall be al-

- 1 lowed to finish that hitter;
- 2 d. The required calendar rest shall begin on the day following the date on which the game began,
- 3 or a resumed game began regardless of the conclusion time of the game; and
- 4 e. The rest periods shall be based on the following total pitches:
- 5 (i) Maximum pitches eighty-five (85);
- 6 (ii) Fifty-six (56) pitches or more three (3) calendar days rest;
- 7 (iii) Thirty-six (36) to fifty-five (55) pitches two (2) calendar days rest;
- 8 (iv) Twenty (20) to thirty-five (35) pitches one (1) calendar day rest; and
- 9 (v) One (1) to nineteen (19) pitches no mandated rest;

10 6. Students seeking to play or practice, including scrimmages, regular season, and post season

11 games, in the sport of fastpitch softball, shall be required to wear face protection, commercially

12 manufactured for softball facial protection and worn as intended by the manufacturer, when play-

13 ing the positions of first base, third base, and pitcher; and

14 7. Teams participating in middle school athletics as defined by subsection (1) of this section shall

15 use KHSAA licensed officials in the sports of baseball, basketball, field hockey, football, soccer,

16 softball, and volleyball;

17 (4) Create a permanent Middle School Athletics Advisory Committee. This committee shall:

18 (a) <u>Report regularly, not less than annually to</u> [Be autonomous with respect to] the Board of Con-

19 trol of the KHSAA with the Board of Control obligated to make a recommendation to the Ken-

20 <u>tucky Board of Education with respect to annually proposed regulatory changes;</u>

21 (b) Be composed of no less than three (3) middle school representatives from each Supreme

22 Court district as well as no less than three (3) at large representatives from throughout the state;

23 (c) Provide an opportunity for nonprofit athletic groups, parents, and others to participate and

provide input on the sport, athletic event, or athletes involved in interscholastic activities through
 local school districts;

3 (d) Meet not less than twice annually to review current programs and policies, make 4 recommendations for improvements to and participation in middle school interscholastic 5 activities, as well as any changes in statute, administrative regulation, or policy related to middle 6 school interscholastic athletics, and assist in the development of model guidelines for schools, 7 districts, conferences, and associations to be used in implementing a middle school athletic 8 program; and

9 (e) Report regularly, not less than annually, to the commissioner of the KHSAA and issue, in
10 conjunction with the commissioner, a formal written report annually to the KBE with recom11 mendations for changes in statute, administrative regulation, or policy;

(5) Require any organization conducting a school-based event at the middle school level to sub-mit the following, which shall be published and listed on the KHSAA Web site:

(a) Annual financial reports of all sanctioned and approved events sponsored by the organization;and

(b) Documentation of financial accountability including verification of federal status and tax
documents including an annual IRS Form 990;

(6) Provide notice to the middle schools related to any program conducted by KHSAA related to
educating school administrators about the provisions of 20 U.S.C. 1681, Title IX;

20 (7) Provide educational materials and a mechanism to facilitate the monitoring and tracking ca-

21 pabilities for the middle schools to ensure compliance with the provisions of KRS 160.445 and

22 other requirements for coaches at the middle school level;

23 (8) Require that any student who turns:

9

(a) Fifteen (15) years of age before August 1 of the current school year shall not be eligible for
 interscholastic athletics in Kentucky in competition against students exclusively enrolled in
 grades eight (8) and below;

4 (b) Fourteen (14) years of age before August 1 of the current year shall not be eligible for inter5 scholastic athletics in Kentucky in competition against students exclusively enrolled in grades
6 seven (7) and below; and

7 (c) Thirteen (13) years of age before August 1 of the current school year shall not be eligible for
8 interscholastic athletics in Kentucky in competition against students exclusively enrolled in
9 grades six (6) and below;

10 (9) Require each school, school district, conference, or association of schools to develop rules

11 and limitations regarding student participation at the middle school level to include:

12 (a) A defined age limitation for participating students;

13 (b) A policy regarding the participation of students below grade six (6);

(c) A limitation on practice time before the season in any sport or sport activity which shall not
exceed the practice time adopted for play at the high school level;

(d) A limitation on the number of school-based scrimmages and regular season, school based
contests in each sport or sport-activity, which shall not include post season contests and shall not
exceed the allowable number of contests for that sport or sport-activity at the high school level;
and

(e) A limitation on the length of the regular competitive season in each sport or sport-activity,
not including any post season activities, which shall not exceed the length for that sport or sportactivity at the high school level;

23 (10) Conduct all meetings related to middle school athletics in accordance with KRS 61.805

10

1 through 61.850;

2 (11) Issue an annual report to the KBE on the status of interscholastic athletics at the middle
3 school level, including any recommendations for changes in statute, administrative regulation, or
4 policy;

5 (12) Allow a school or school district to join a conference or association that has developed rules

6 for any particular sport or sport-activity to satisfy the requirements of this administrative regula-

7 tion; and

8 (13) The period of June 25 to July 9, inclusive, shall be a dead period for middle school athletics.

9 During the dead period:

(a) Students shall not receive coaching or training from school personnel, whether salaried ornon-salaried;

12 (b) School facilities, uniforms, nicknames, transportation, or equipment shall not be used;

13 (c) School funds shall not be expended in support of interscholastic athletics; and

14 (d) A postseason wrap-up activity, celebration, or recognition event relating to a spring sports

team at a school may be held.

16 Section 5. Financial Planning and Review Requirements. (1) KHSAA shall annually submit the

17 following documents to the KBE by October 31:

18 (a) Draft budget for the next two (2) fiscal years, including the current year;

19 (b) End-of-year budget status report for the previous fiscal year;

20 (c) Revisions to the KHSAA Strategic Plan as a result of an annual review of the plan by the

21 KHSAA governing body;

22 (d) A summary report of operations including summaries of financial, legal, and administrative

23 actions taken and other items ongoing within KHSAA. This report shall also include a summary

- 1 of items affecting:
- 2 1. Athletic appeals and their disposition, including the name of the individual, grade, school, and
- 3 the action taken by KHSAA;
- 4 2. Eligibility rules;
- 5 3. Duties of school officials;
- 6 4. Contests and contest limitations;
- 7 5. Requirements for officials and coaches; and

8 6. Results of a biennial review of its bylaws that results in a recommendation for a change, di-

9 recting any proposals for change in association rules to be considered for a vote by the member

10 schools at the next legislative opportunity; and

(e) A review of all items which have been submitted to the membership for approval through the
 processes established in the KHSAA Constitution and the result of the voting on those issues.

- 13 (2) The KHSAA shall annually submit at the next meeting of the Kentucky Board of Education
- 14 following receipt and adoption by the Board of Control, audited financial statements with the

15 KHSAA Commissioner's letter addressing exceptions or notes contained in management16 correspondence if any.

(1) Provide a brief summary of:

(a) What this administrative regulation does: KRS 156.070 requires the Kentucky Board of Education (KBE) to manage and control the common schools, including interscholastic athletics in the schools, and authorizes the KBE to designate an agency to manage athletics. This regulation designates the Kentucky High School Athletic Association (KHSAA) as the agent to manage high school and middle school interscholastic athletics, and incorporates by reference the bylaws, procedures and rules governing interscholastic sports.

(b) The necessity of this administrative regulation: This regulation is necessary to designate the agency to provide the day-to-day management activities of interscholastic athletics in Kentucky; to set forth the financial, planning and review processes governing the agent; and to incorporate by reference the bylaws, procedures and rules of the agency.

(c) How this administrative regulation conforms to the content of the authorizing statutes: The regulation designates the agency to manage interscholastic athletics, as authorized by the authorizing statute, and outlines the conditions under which this authority is granted.

(d) How this administrative regulation currently assists or will assist in the effective administration of the statutes: It designates the KHSAA as the agent to manage interscholastic athletics in the schools and districts at the high school and middle school levels, and publishes changes in bylaws, procedures and rules for affected schools and districts.

(2) If this is an amendment to an existing administrative regulation, provide a brief summary of:

(a) How the amendment will change this existing administrative regulation: These amendments make changes to the documents incorporated by reference, including the bylaws, to make the rule compliant with the provisions of recent legislation. Specifically, recent legislation permits students to repeat the 2020-2021 school year under certain circumstances while still remaining eligible to compete in interscholastic athletics. Changes were also made as a result of the recent Annual Meeting of Member Schools where they voted to clarify the procedure to break ties when voting for member of the Board of Control that is contained in the KHSAA Constitution. Additional changes were made to update policies and other documents according to recent board action.

(b) The necessity of the amendment to this administrative regulation: Pursuant to the KHSAA Constitution, which is incorporated by reference in this regulation, the members are required to have an annual meeting to discuss and recommend any needed changes to the Constitution and Bylaws. While they are not required to make changes to the Constitution and Bylaws, substantive changes must be made through this process. This amendment incorporates changes approved

at the annual meeting of the Delegate Assembly. This amendment also is necessary to designate the KHSAA as the agent to manage interscholastic athletics at the high school and middle school level.

(c) How the amendment conforms to the content of the authorizing statutes: The statute authorizes the KBE to designate an agency to manage interscholastic athletics in the common schools. The regulation designates the KHSAA as that agent at both the high school and middle school levels, and incorporates by reference the KHSAA Handbook, which consists of the KHSAA Constitution, Bylaws, Due Process Procedure, and Board of Control Policies to provide rules and guidance to the member schools and districts governing sporting events. The amendments in the Bylaws are made annually, according to the process outlined in the Constitution, and reflect input given by member schools and districts on changes that need to be made to provide a sounder structure of governance.

(d) How the amendment will assist in the effective administration of the statutes: See (c) above.

(3) List the type and number of individuals, businesses, organizations, or state and local governments affected by this administrative regulation: All public school districts

(4) Provide an assessment of how the above group or groups will be impacted by either the implementation of this administrative regulation, if new, or by the change if it is an amendment: There will be little impact because of the nature of the changes to the regulation. REVISIONS:

KHSAA Constitution, 5 pages:

Substantive changes to the KHSAA Constitution were made to incorporate recent action taken by KHSAA Member Schools at their Annual Meeting. Included in these changes:

 Proposal 2021-1, KHSAA Constitution, amends the Constitution to create a definitive tie-breaking procedure in the event two candidates for a Board of Control election are ties. The amendment also prescribes the procedure when more than two candidates up for election, but neither receives a majority of the vote.

Additional non-substantive changes were made in the form of technical revisions to correct drafting and formatting errors.

KHSAA Bylaws, 26 pages

Substantive changes to the KHSAA Bylaws were made to incorporate recent action taken by Kentucky General Assembly during the 2021 Regular Session. SB128 (Acts Chapter 108) permitted students to apply to repeat or supplement the 2020-2021 school year and still be eligible to compete in interscholastic athletics. As a result, the Supplemental School Year Program ("SSYP") was created. This legislation required certain bylaws to be amended to incorporate the necessary changes. Included in these changes:

- Bylaw 3 (Maximum Number of Years) was amended to permit students designated as SSYP to be permitted five (5) consecutive years of eligibility after initial enrollment in the ninth grade. Under normal circumstances only four (4) consecutive years of participation are permitted.
- Bylaw 4 (Enrollment Requirements) was amended to allow students designated as SSYP to participate while repeating a grade.
- Bylaw 5 (Minimum Academic Requirement) was amended to permit students designated as SSYP to be eligible even if they are not on the proper grade level.
- Bylaw 14 (Other Eligibility Requirements and Regulations) was amended to permit student who have graduated from secondary school but are designated as SSYP to be eligible while meeting all other bylaws.

Further changes were made to Bylaw 10 (Amateur/Awards and clarify the restrictions on awards and the value of such awards.

Other non-substantive changes were made in the form of technical revisions to correct drafting and formatting errors.

KHSAA Due Process Procedures, 3 pages:

Changes were made to clarify the definition of "Board Matters" under this procedure. Specifically, the changes clarify that Board Matters are heard by the KHSAA Board of Control when a hearing is required. Further the definition of "Board Matters" is clarified to specify that judgment calls of an official are not included as Board Matters.

Other non-substantive changes were made in the form of technical revisions to correct drafting and formatting errors.

KHSAA Board of Control and Officials Division Policies, 50 pages:

Several changes were made to conform to decisions of Board of Control on matters of policy. Included in these changes are:

- The policy on severe weather/lightning has been amended to recognize the advancement in lightning detection technology. Facilities that have such equipment may be utilized. However, the sighting of lightning or the hearing of thunder will still take precedent when the lightning detection technology is used but does not indicate the presence of severe weather.
- Policies on postseason media regarding outlets wishing to originate a broadcast have been clarified in circumstances where space is not available to accommodate all such requests. Further, restriction on locker room access have been included.
- Changes were made to the eligibility requirements for coaches to be inducted to the Hall of Fame. Formerly, a currently active coach had to be over 65 years of age. This has been changed to 55 years of age.
- The Officials division policies have been updated to recognize the potential implementation of Lacrosse.
- The addition of a policy statement on the potential continued need to adjust policy and rules in light of the ongoing pandemic may be necessary and prudent at various time based on the current circumstances at the time. The statement also recognizes the responsibility and importance of protecting the health, including mental health, of students and the integral and valuable part that athletics plays in students' lives. The policy recognizes that these adjustments will only be taken when not in conflict with other state or federal laws and regulations.
- The addition of a Sports Medicine Policy for student-athletes seeking to return to activity following a positive diagnosis of COVID-19. In light of recent declarations of emergencies and after consultation with State and Federal Health Organizations as well as the Kentucky Medical Association, a comprehensive set of recommendations on the steps to follow for students, families, schools, and medical providers to consider when a student is seeking to return to physical activity following a positive diagnosis of COVID-19. Further, a defined stepwise protocol

has been established and must be completed for students before they can return to full-activity.

Further technical revisions to reformat or correct drafting errors have also been made.

KHSAA Form PPE2/Physical Exam, "PPE2 Physical Exam Form (Grades 6-12), 4 pages:

This form was amended to add an optional, supplemental page to assist authorized medical providers conducting pre-participation exams on a student previously diagnosed with COVID-19.
