Reducing Barriers to Education

- Terrace Metrics is preparing for the Fall screening. The districts participating are Ludlow, Ft. Thomas, Kenton, Owenton, Campbell, Newport and Southgate.
- The One-to-One program has trained 101 coaches and they will be serving 132 students. Polly anticipates the coaches being in the schools very soon. The program has received \$80,000 in grants for this school year.
- The Dr. James E. Randolph Medical, Healthcare & Scientific Leadership Program is still in the production stage. The program was set to start this Fall as a virtual program for the first year. They have several "day in the life" videos and are working on a few others. John Stanton wants to meet with the educators on the team to determine the best way to present the videos and other materials to the students who are interested.
