- District ACT on Tuesday, October 5th in the gymnasium.

- Demonstration of Writing – We are using a program called Criterion to conduct demonstrations of writing. Demonstrations of writing will mimic KPREP On-Demand writing assessments. The first of three demonstrations of writing will conclude by November 5th. Demonstrations of writing will demonstrate growth in writing for all students (grades 7 – 12).

- After our first round of both KYOTE and the ASK exams, as well as a bit of fluctuation with our enrollment, here are our updated CCR numbers:
- 16/54 (29.6%) of students are fully college and/or career ready.
- 11 (20.3%) students who are not currently college and/or career ready are at the ATC and should gain career readiness there.
- 5 (9.2%) students who aren't CCR are attending Skilled Trades and should gain career readiness there.
- 4 (7.4%) students who aren't CCR are attending Gateway and should attain college readiness there.
- 1 (1.8%) student who isn't CCR is in the Logistics pathway and should have career readiness there.
- 37/54 (68.5%) are on track to gain college career readiness through these paths.
- The other 17 students are working through a combination of the administrative support pathway (must pass the ASK exam) to gain career readiness or are working towards gaining college readiness through the KYOTE assessment/ACT.
- We are waiting on scores from students who recently took the ACT which will impact our current CCR scores.
- FAFSA Completion Initiative started October 1st.
- Senior Meetings have begun. Each senior will meet with Mrs. Stallkamp to discuss grades, being on track to graduate, college/career/military aspirations, start FAFSA, and check in on KEES money.
- Craft Academy, Morehead State University, will be meeting with the sophomore honors group to discuss the program and requirements to apply. We have one current student in the Craft Academy - Braden Bickers.



- Supply Chain OKI will be hosting the first Lunch and Learn at the board office with a select group of juniors and seniors. Maria Reynolds and 2 business partners from Castellini and Legion Logistics will be in attendance to discuss careers in supply chain.
- Gateway hosted a Signing Event for all DC students on Wednesday, October 20th at 1:00 PM in the gymnasium. Students "signed" their DC letter of intent, receive some Gateway swag, and get their picture posted on Dayton and Gateway's social media sites for their hardwork.
- We have 2 students that are applying to start the visual arts pathway at NKU in the spring. They will be the first two students from Dayton to participate in the Visual Arts pathway through NKU's School-Based Scholars Program.
- We have 6 juniors who have shown interest in applying for the KY Governor's School Program.
- The Governor's School for the Arts Program will not start nominations until November, 2021 but we already have 4 students interested in applying.
