Facilities, Transportation, Safe Schools and Healthy at Work

Transportation:

• New bus purchase requests have been opened up by the KY Dept of Transportation. I recommend we purchase a minimum of one bus. However, I have discussed the possibility of purchasing two buses with both Mr. Watts and Ms. Hoover. This would allow all of our buses utilized to have AC on them. It would also place us in a position to not have to order buses for a minimum of 5 years if not longer. Cost per bus is \$134,497.00. The following is a breakdown of the cost:

- Emergency HVAC work continues at NIS and NPS. We had two motors go out of air handling units at NIS: 1 in the cafeteria and another in the library.
- Quotes on flag poles have finally been received. Quote for 40' flag poles at NHS stadium and the high school along
 with one for the bus lot. The quote was for \$24,300.00. I asked for another quote with 50' flag poles at NHS
 stadium and high school. The cost for that would be \$39,900.00.
- Additional stored salt from Valley is being moved as we get closer to winter. We should have enough unless we have an abnormal winter.
- Haves continues to work with STW on items related to the NPS cafeteria.
 - o EDC was at NPS to do an asbestos assessment in the kitchen and cafeteria renovation.
- Ms. Klosterman and I will be meeting with a representative of KEMI (Ky. Employers Mutual Insurance) in November. Representative is a Safety and Loss Control Coordinator.
- On the 22nd we have the insurance representative coming to view the damage from the lightning strike at the Welcome Center. Hopefully, this will allow us to move forward on repairs.
