- **MTSS**- November's meeting included a great break out session with each of the schools discussing their plans and resources to help support students with SE health.
- **MTSS**- Arnett's staff has done an exemplary job in working through the MTSS process for a student that needs a variety of supports. Without skipping a beat they have aligned these resources and documentation into helping this student discover incremental successes.
- **Curriculum**- Three of our schools are applying to be part of a pilot program, through KDE alongside Achievement Network, to develop a process for aligning curriculum, resources, and standards.
