Data Quality

Response Rate

When a response rate is low, we are less certain that the answers we get are true for most of our former students. For this type of survey, a response rate of 60% is reasonable. However, if the response rate for a coop or district is very low, the results for the few people who respond might not show us what is really happening.

A one-person change affects the small district percentage more.







For **KENTUCKY**, **69%** (**544/788**) of those who went on to any kind of post-secondary education *lived with their family* while at school, and **47%** (**373/788**) contacted the *Disability Service Coordinator* (*DSC*) at their school or training program.

For NKEC, 74% (54/73) lived at home and 49% (36/73) contacted the DSC.

For NEWPORT INDEPENDENT, 60% (3/5) lived at home and 100% (5/5) contacted the DSC.





Percent Answering Yes










