

Comprehensive District Improvement Plan (CDIP)

Rationale

District improvement efforts are a collaborative process involving multiple stakeholders. Through the improvement planning process, leaders focus on priority needs, district funding, and closing achievement gaps among identified subgroups of students. When implemented with fidelity, the Comprehensive District Improvement Plan (CDIP) cultivates an environment that promotes student growth and achievement.

While the focus of continuous improvement is student performance, the work must be guided by the aspects of teaching and learning that affect performance. An effective improvement process should address the contributing factors creating the learning environment (inputs) and the performance data (outcomes). Through the Needs Assessment for Districts, priorities were identified and processes, practices, and/or conditions were chosen for focus. This goal building template will assist your improvement team to address those priorities and outline your targets and the activities intended to produce the desired changes. Progress monitoring details will ensure that your plan is being reviewed regularly to determine the success of each strategy.

Requirements for Building an Improvement Plan

- There are six (6) required district goals: proficiency, separate academic indicator, achievement gap, graduation rate, growth, and transition readiness.

Goal: Districts should determine long-term goals that are three to five year targets for each required district level indicator. Long-term targets should be informed by The Needs Assessment for Districts.

The district also monitors the school’s curriculum documents and 30-60-90 day plans and provides feedback. All meetings are documented with agendas and minutes. The district further supports schools with District Curriculum Coaches for modeling and mentoring teachers.</p> <p>The district submits the improvement plan on the district website for stakeholder feedback prior to board approval. The Estill County Board of Education reviews all school improvement plans and approves the district improvement plan according to board policy in December. After the Board of Education approves the improvement plan, it is posted on the district website. The school principals will report on student data in the fall.</p>
