***Director of Pupil Personnel and Student Services Report***  
***December 15, 2021***

*Madame Chair and members of the Board, Newport Independent Schools have completed 71 instructional days. Friday, December 17th is the last day of the first semester of school and is a full day of instruction. January 3rd is a Professional Learning Community Day and instruction will resume on January 4th.*

***Pupil Personnel Reporting***

**Enrollment**

As of December 8, 2021, Newport Independent's total enrollment stands at 1,368 students in grades 97 through 14. Current enrollment shows a slight increase from the same date enrollment of 2020 (+12). Enrollment efforts continue to focus on ensuring resident and non-resident students are enrolled correctly within our current offerings. Within Attendance Month 3, 53 student transfers were completed, 11 missing child notifications were processed, 11 online family applications were processed, and 53 home visits were provided.

**Attendance**

As we close the first semester of the 2021/2022 school year we have utilized 2 of our 10 allowed Non-Traditional Instruction days (NTI) through the utilization of our approved Continuation of Learning Plan. Year to date average daily attendance at Newport Primary stands at 94.69%, Newport Intermediate with 94.65%, and Newport High School with 90.63%. Performance Based student attendance will be calculated at the conclusion of the semester with the inclusion of their attendance. Chronic absenteeism data shows 15.14% of the student population at 100% full time equivalency and 31.2% attending 96-99% of instructional time. 25.1% of students are chronically absent with a breakdown of 52% male and 48% female. 52.23% of students chronically absent have identified as white.

**McKinney Vento**

Homeless Student groups reveal a total of 171 students in the McKinney Vento program. 133 students have a homeless indicator of doubled up, 4 hotels/motels, 23 in shelters and transitional housing, 11 unsheltered, and 30 unaccompanied youth. Our McKinney Vento program is funded through grant funds including Title I and two separate McKinney Vento grants awarded this school year.

**FRAM**

Free and Reduced meal eligibility is currently at 88%. This information is garnered from guardian provided household income information and direct certification data from sources such

as Medicaid. Free and reduced eligibility has a direct impact on school funding, grant eligibility, and FRYSC funding.

### **Interventions**

Within Pupil Personnel & Student Services we have partnered with the Campbell County Court designated Workers Office to bring School Based Truancy Diversion Program (SB-TDP) at Newport High School as one service offered through our Multi Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) Attendance. Students participating in November SB-TDP. This tier III intervention resulted in 93.75% immediate progress. December SB-TDP will be held on December 14, 2021 with 17 students and their guardian(s) invited.

### **Safe School Analysis**

All schools' principals have received and reviewed at the November Principals meeting an analysis of their Safe Schools behavior data as compared to the Code of Conduct for attendance months 1-3 as conducted by the DPP office. This analysis included comparison of behavior events and range from COC, participation counts, top repeat discipline offenders, top behavior reporting, behavior resolution usage, areas of immediate concern, areas of strength, areas of potential concern for review, and areas of immediate needed response.

### **Attendance Teams**

All school attendance teams have submitted completed reviews for attendance needs for each grade level and school wide data spanning attendance months 1-3. Teams have submitted next step actions and have initiated implementation. All schools have implemented no less than 7 of 8 suggested Tier I universal attendance interventions to ensure student and family educational success.

### **School Counselor PLC**

School Counselors have completed a recording of direct and indirect service provisions for December. This data will be reviewed and analyzed with findings presented to the district Cabinet team. All schools have completed resource alignment in the areas of Behavior, Social Emotional Learning, and Trauma Informed Care programs for each tier of MTSS. This includes program/service, frequency of use, person responsible for implementation, alignment to ASCA national standards, monitoring protocols, evaluation tools, and outcomes. School level programs are currently working toward the inclusion of small group counseling based on school level student data. The School Counselor Professional Learning Community held once monthly will continue to focus on increasing the individual and overall comprehensive school counseling program ratings. Immediate focus is committed to calendar control, mission/vision, counseling lessons, data based interventions within MTSS, data collection for needs assessment, and opportunity gaps from data.

### **School Medical Team**

Our school nursing staff have provided 892 health visits from the last Board meeting to December 9, 2021. We appreciate the Board support with the hiring of an additional nurse with our return to in-person learning this school year as we navigate COVID safety.
