**Facilities, Transportation, Safe Schools and Healthy at Work**

**Transportation:**

- New buses have been ordered.
- The new lift has been installed at the bus lot. It is a huge improvement over the old lift and much safer.

**Facilities:**

- Ms. Rizzo and I have met with Noah Onkst, Ehmet Hayes, and STW associates on the renovations at NPS. Last meeting, we discussed plans on feeding students if the kitchen was not ready. Ms. Rizzo and I discussed the possibility of utilizing a 48' mobile kitchen rather than run electric lines, water lines, etc... in the gym area as well as moving equipment to that location. We believe this will meet the needs of food service. I will be contacting the city to determine if this will be acceptable for a short period. Hayes is contacting the state to make sure there are no issues.
- Ms. Klosterman and I met with representative of KEMI (Ky. Employers Mutual Insurance) Nov. 10<sup>th</sup>. I have replied to his responses and he has marked everything as being compliant.
- My recommendation for marquees is to take the bid of Brielmaier for \$99K. This will provide us with the highest quality product. Attachment included from Hayes.
