- All schools completed Round 1 of the Tiered Fidelity Inventory (TFI) for 21-22. The TFI is
 a survey taken 2-4 times annually to assess the extent to which school personnel apply
 the core features of School-wide Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports
 (SWPBIS) at all three tiers either individually or collectively. Teams may take the TFI
 for a variety of purposes including:
 - An initial assessment to determine if they are using, or need, SWPBIS
 - A guide for implementation of Tier I, Tier II, and/or Tier III practices
 - An index of sustained SWPBIS implementation
 - A metric for identifying schools for recognition within their district and state implementation efforts
