Aligns with district trauma informed care plan and professional development in this area. Attendee intends to bring information back to the district for Best Practice Academy session


SUMMARY OF MAJOR ELEMENTS:

Making Sense of Your Worth is targeted at prompting positive self-worth for individuals that have experienced trauma. The course is focused on healing staff members of past trauma and creating positive environments for staff who are working with students who have been exposed to trauma. The training provides a curriculum for staff self-care, as well as, information for conducting groups for students that have experienced past trauma. There is also information on conducting parent/caregiver groups. The attendee has a plan to return information to the district through Best Practice Academy, sharing information with counselors/social workers/school psychologist, as well as, has ideas for hosting parent/caregiver events.

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Learning Goals and Objectives

Day 1: Intro, Opening Ritual, Attachment and Self-Worth Overview

Goal 1: Participant will understand the importance of attachment. (3 hours)

Obj 1: Participant will be able to identify the four skills identified by Jude Cassidy, PhD that are needed for healthy relationships.

Obj 2: Participant will be able to identify the four attachment styles for infants and adults.

Obj 3: Participant will be able to identify the two ways healthy/unhealthy attachment is created by the way caregivers interact with an infant/child.

Obj 4: Participant will be able to identify the characteristics of adult attachment styles and how attachment helps/hurts connection in relationships.

Goal 2: Participant will understand self-worth and shame in relationships. (3 hours)

Obj 1: Participant will be able to identify how shame is formed.

Obj 2: Participant will be able to identify how self-worth is formed.

Obj 2: Participant will be able to identify two things adults need to do to increase self-worth.

Obj 3: Participant will be able to identify what all humans need to be healthy mentally, physically, emotionally and spiritually.

Obj 4: Participant will learn about skills identified on the initial self-worth assessment.

Day 2: Identifying Needs, Identifying lies, and Safety

Goal 3: Participant will understand how to help client's identify if their needs were met or not met during childhood. (3 hours)

Obj 1: Participant will learn about the "bucket activity" where a client assesses needs that were or were not met during childhood.

Obj 2: Participant will learn how to help a client assess if their needs are being met as an adult.

Obj 2: Participant will be able learn common road blocks to healing and moving toward positive self-worth.

Obj 3: Participant will be able to identify life-events that contribute to low self-worth.

Obj 4: Participant will be able to identify the "lies" (negative cognitions) people often believe about themselves that lead to low self-worth.

Obj 5: Participant will be able to help lead clients in the "heavy backpack" experiential exercise to get rid of lies.

Goal 4: Participants will be able to learn how current safety will help or hinder someone's ability to move toward deep levels of healing. (3 hours)

Obj 1: Participant will be able to identify the five step process to gain positive self-worth.

Obj 2: Participant will be able to identify the two ways the human brain makes sense of information.

Obj 3: Participant will be able to identify what all humans need to be safe.

Obj 4: Participant will be able to identify the difference between "safety" and "felt-safety."

Obj 5: Participant will be able to identify two ways to prepare for "heavy lifting" of past life events.

Day 3: Truth and Understanding: Power and Control Games, Truth and Understanding: Relationship Red Flags

Goal 1: Participant will be able to understand the “why” behind power-and-control games. (2 hours)

Obj 1: Participant will be able to identify the two parts of the power-and-control continuum.

Obj 3: Participant will be able to identify the five step process of identifying the “why behind the lie” (identifying negative cognitions)

Obj 4: Participant will be able to identify eleven motivating factors for why people engage in power- and-control games.

Goal 2: Participant will be able to understand the harmful impact of power-and-control games. (1.5 hours)

Obj 1: Participant will be able to identify two purposes for a person playing power-and-control games.

Obj 2: Participant will be able to identify fourteen power-and-control games and give one example of each.

Obj 3: Participant will be able to identify six reasons why power-and-control players are unaware of their underlying motivations.

Goal 3: Participant will be able to understand Red Flags of Relationships. (1 hour)

Obj 1: Participant will be able to identify some common Red Flags of Relationships.

Obj 2: Participant will be able to identify childhood or adult events/traumas perpetrated by those attempting to exert power-and-control in relationships.

Obj 3: Participant will be able to identify how trauma as a child or adult negatively impacts current relationships.

Obj 4: Participant will be able to identify red flags in newly formed relationships.

Obj 5: Participant will be able to identify why healthy relationships are the key to happiness.

Goal 4: Participant will be able to identify how low self-worth impacts behavior in current relationships. (1.5 hours)

Obj 1: Participant will be able to identify low self-worth behaviors in parenting, work, finances, friendships, physical health, mental health, spiritual health, education, family relationships, hobbies, life goals and romantic relationships.

Obj 2: Participant will be able identify three reasons why healthy boundaries are important.

Obj 3: Participant will be able to identify six ways for maintaining self-worth gains.

Day 4: Forgiveness, and Moving Forward, and Group Facilitator Tips

Goal 1: Participant will be able to understand the importance of forgiveness. (4 hours)

Obj 1: Participant will be able to identify five reasons forgiveness is necessary for good self-worth.

Obj 2: Participant will be able to identify a five step process for forgiveness.

Obj 3: Participant will be able to help client assess their ability/capacity to forgive someone.

Obj 4: Participant will be able to help create a document that will identify person(s) a client is not ready to forgive presently, but would like to forgive in the future.

Obj 5: Participant will learn how to compare pre and post self-worth assessments to measure gain in a client's self-worth.

Goal 1: Participant will be able to understand how to serve different populations with the MSOYW Curriculum. (2 hours)

Obj 1: Participant will be able to identify the benefits and challenges of providing MSOYW in individual or group settings.

Obj 2: Participant will be able to identify how to offer variations of the curriculum to meet the needs of different populations.
