


Portrait of a Graduate

The KCSD's **Portrait of a Graduate** communicates our students' most essential qualities as they walk across the stage and into their future.




Years of new interests, environments, and experiences lead the timid, curious young children entering kindergarten to develop into confident, capable young men and women ready to embark on their next phase of life.

Character allows each student to distinguish his or herself within a community and provides an avenue to improve it. Middle school is an important time to find one's true character amidst a world of physical and emotional change.




Perseverance is required to excel as students begin to challenge themselves both in and
