HISTORY/BACKGROUND:

When preparing the PD Plan for 2019-20, we originally scheduled 6 hours on Aug. 12 for our Second Step training. The trainer is not available on Aug. 12 but can work with our teachers and staff on Aug. 20 for 3 hours. The trainer recommended dividing the remaining 3 hours between two 1.5 hour after-school sessions to continue our learning and to address questions and concerns that will develop upon implementation of the program.
