




- Not yet used Remote Learning Days

Staff Absences

- Received first shipment of COVID-19 tests from federal government
- These tests are the ones administered by nurses in JCPS schools
- We average 1000 tests a week (given by our nurses---this does not apply to the tests given by vendor)
- 5000 tests received
- We can order more every month

Point of Care Testing Allocation from Federal Government

- Hosted a vaccine clinic at Newcomer Academy
- Focused on international community
- 150 participated in the first clinic and approximately 300 participated in the second clinic
 200+ in the third clinic



Vaccine Clinic



- Mask mandate inside buildings and on buses
- Masks available for employees and students who need them-delivered KN-95 masks to school for employees and these continue to be available
- **Voluntary testing** available weekly in schools/worksites
- **Drive-through testing** available in over 50 sites after school
- Vaccine or testing **mandate** for employees
 - Test to Stay program for those exposed to allow them to test and then return with a negative test
 - Test to Play program for extracurricular activity participants
