



Newport Primary Regular Attendees- 32 Total students served- 80 Newport Intermediate Regular Attendees- 30 total students served- 110 Newport High School (7-8th) Total students served- 20 Newport High School (9-12 only) Regular Attendees- 3 total students served- 30

At NPS and NIS we are focusing on identifying students that are needing extra academic support in reading and math and recruiting those for our morning program. At NHS we have started a credit recovery/credit completion study time for students who failed a class last semester. This is meeting M-Thursday from 3-5p. We are targeting seniors and those with only one failing grade first but anyone who needs to complete a credit is encouraged to attend.

At all schools we have submitted our initial summer school plans to KDE. These summer action plans were submitted March 11th. They detailed a schedule, estimated how many students we will serve, and we also had to turn in any field trip requests at this time. We are hoping to go on school wide field trips again this summer.

We are still waiting to see if we have been awarded the grants that we applied for in November of 2021. We should know by the end of March.

### **School Health Center**

### Pam Pedigo, Health Center Coordinator

Our work on covid related issues has calmed way down. Our county is now in the low risk That has allowed us to pivot to state mandated health screenings including vaccine compliance and we are making progress. Having Liz available to assist with this makes a great deal of difference. She can do the school physicals. Most of our students are eligible for our vaccine program. We do feel the loss of in-person Spanish interpretation services in dealing with this sub-population.

We will be participating in the NPS open house for kindergarten and pre-school on April 13th.

The NPS office had 293 nursing visits for February and has one daily urinary catheterization. The NIS nurse office saw 415 students, has one daily urinary catheterization and one diabetic to manage at lunch. At NHS, Nadine saw 340 students with various complaints and one diabetic in the building to manage.

Big Smiles dental clinic due to return in April so we have been laying the groundwork for that.

Liz and I are working on the annual renewal of our VFC agreement.
