WELCOME

Dr. Tom Brillhart, Superintendent Designee, introduced Tim Eaton, Facilitator, who was joining us on speaker phone. Mr. Eaton explained what has happened since our last LPC meeting on December 14, 2021.

APPROVAL OF THE DECEMBER 14, 2021 MINUTES

A motion was made by Darrell Coleman to approve the minutes from the December 14, 2021 Local Planning Committee meeting as well as the Public Forum on December 14, 2021. The motion was seconded by Larry Coy. All members in favor.

REVIEW DRAFT WITH KDE COMMENTS

Cate Ward with Studio Kremer presented the proposed DFP with the changes from KDE. The changes are in italics. Dr. Brillhart asked if there were any questions regarding the changes to the DFP.

DISCUSSION/QUESTIONS

The only question was regarding the turf on the football field being used by PE classes and why it couldn't be funded in Category 2.

VOTE ON DRAFT AMENDMENT

A motion was made by Matthew Mooney to accept the proposed Draft District Facility Plan (DFP) with the changes from KDE. The motion was seconded by Richard Latz. Members voting YES – 11. Members voting NO – 0. Motion passes.

DISCUSSION/VOTE ON WAIVER OF REGULATION

Dr. Brillhart explained what the waiver of regulation was. We are asking for approval from KBE for a waiver request for the allowance to use restricted funds for Category 5 items under Number 24, 25 and 26, with the exception of turf,

multi-purpose synthetic playing surface at football field. It will require asking KDE to use restricted funds for those items in italics, Category 5 (Athletics).

There was a question regarding using these funds for bleachers but not for turf. A question was also asked regarding KDE and will they be able to pick and choose what gets completed. Cate Ward with Studio Kremer explained it should be all or nothing. There was also a question regarding a specific school and a connector corridor. The visual was placed on the screen so everyone was clear on the answer.

After no further questions, a **motion was made by Larry Coy to move forward with requesting a waiver of regulation from KDE for the allowance to use restricted funds for Category 5 items under Numbers 24, 25 and 26, with the exception of turf, multi-purpose synthetic playing surface at football field. The motion was seconded by Tony Roth. Those voting YES – 11. Those voting NO – 0. Motion passes.**

NEXT STEPS



**BULLITT COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT
DISTRICT FACILITIES PLAN HEARING REPORT**

A public hearing was held at the Bullitt County Board Room on 01/24/22 at 5:56 P.M. (local time). The purpose of the public hearing was to propose a District Facility Plan Amendment developed by the Bullitt County Local Planning Committee. The Local Planning Committee (LPC) voted 11-0 in favor of the proposed new plan and the Board of Education voted 4-0 to approve the new plan.

There were several district employees in attendance but no one offered any comments. Tim Eaton, KSPMA Facilitator, served as the locally appointed hearing officer.

COMMENTS

Tim Eaton called the public hearing to order. The hearing officer outlined the purpose of the hearing and the hearing procedures in accordance with 702 KAR 1:001. The hearing officer highlighted the proposed new District Facility Plan as follows: Under Priority one – life safety renovations are listed at all schools and renovation/replacement of the elevator at Bullitt East High. Priority two items include renovations at several schools that met the criteria for restricted funds expenditures. The proposed Amendment to the current plan includes major renovation at Old Mill Elementary to become part of Bullitt East High, additional qualifying items for major renovation at Bullitt Central High, additional qualifying items for renovation at Bullitt East High, along with general site improvements at North Bullitt High. There were no priority three items identified. Also included in the proposed amendment under Priority four – construction of exterior pole barns for multi-use at Bernheim Middle School and Bullitt East High. The remaining items in priority four exist on the current plan. Under Priority five – there are numerous needs identified at most all school sites including renovations to outdoor athletic facilities at all three high schools that do not qualify for the use of restricted funds at this time, and are not included in the facility needs assessment totals at this time.

The floor was opened to those who wished to make comments on the proposed DFP, and there were none. Also, there were no written comments submitted prior to the hearing. The hearing was adjourned.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the new District Facility Plan as developed by the Bullitt County Local Planning Committee and adopted by the Bullitt County Board of Education be approved as the District Facility Plan for the Bullitt County School District.
