**WARREN COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT
DISTRICT FACILITIES PLAN HEARING REPORT**

A public hearing was held at the Warren County Public Schools 212 Academy on February 8, 2022, at 5:30pm (local time). The purpose of the public hearing was to propose a new District Facility Plan developed by the Warren County Schools Local Planning Committee. The Local Planning Committee (LPC) voted unanimously (12-0) in favor of the proposed new plan and the Board voted 5-0 to approve the new plan.

There were (0) zero individual(s) in attendance. Rachel Donnelly, Senior Accountant, acted as district designee and Chris McIntyre, Chief Financial Officer, served as the locally-appointed hearing officer.

COMMENTS

Chris McIntyre called the public hearing to order. The hearing officer outlined the purpose of the hearing and the hearing procedures in accordance with 702 KAR 1:001. It was explained that those persons wishing to speak would be given the opportunity and that written statements would be accepted. All considerations will be made available to the Kentucky Board of Education via the hearing officer's report. The hearing officer highlighted the changes and referenced the copies available for review of the new District Facility Plan which includes; **Priority One** (1.b) Construction of an 800 student capacity school on existing site to replace Rich Pond Elementary. (1.e) Renovate current Greenwood High School and Drakes Creek Middle School to meet Senate Bill I requirements. **Priority Two** (2.c) Renovation to Greenwood High School media center into classrooms and administration. Also renovation to Drakes Creek Middle School cafeteria into classrooms, resource rooms, and administration. **Priority Four** (4) Renovation of existing Old Cumberland Trace Elementary facility for occupational therapy, physical therapy, psychology, and district board room. **Priority Five** (5) There are several discretionary projects listed at Greenwood High School, Drakes Creek Middle School, Lost River Elementary, South Warren High School, Rockfield Elementary School, and Warren Elementary. Additionally, district wide playground additions & renovations, furniture replacement, site additions, repaving/paving, and energy management systems are listed.

The floor was opened to those who wished to make a statement. No person was in attendance and no written statements (letter or email) were submitted to the Warren County Public Schools.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the new District Facility Plan developed by the Warren County Schools Local Planning Committee and adopted by the Warren County Board of Education be approved as the District Facility Plan for the Warren County School District. A copy of the new plan is attached.
