COMMUNICATIONS/ VISITORS AND OPEN FORUM	None		
PRESENTATIONS:	HEALTHY AT SCHOOL UPDATE Chris Bentzel, Superintendent, was present to give the Healthy at School Update. Mr. Bentzel reviewed the current COVID data dashboard; a graph that reviews cases charted over the last month as well as the district's Test to Stay Data.		
	Mr. Bentzel emphasized that it is time to get parents back in the school. The remainder of the school year will look "traditional" with kindergarten and 6 <sup>th</sup> grade graduation ceremonies, parent nights, field day, prom, graduation, and project graduation.		
	The district will continue to monitor the pandemic and the county incidence map and also work closely with Jennie Stuart, local pediatricians, the Health Department, and other officials. <b>CHRISTIAN COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS 2022 IMPACT KENTUCKY WORKING CONDITIONS SURVEY</b> Chris Bentzel, Superintendent, was present to give a PowerPoint presentation on the CCPS 2022 Impact Kentucky Working Conditions Survey (a copy of which is attached to the minutes.)		

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This survey is taken every two years by certified staff only and its purpose is to provide the district with feedback about their working conditions. The district then takes that data to better improve their buildings.

Mr. Bentzel compared the data from 2020 to 2022. Christian County improved in all categories, except one, which only decreased by 1%. Christian County meets or is above the state average in all categories.

# SAFETY AND ATTENDANCE INCENTIVE PROGRAM FOR FOOD SERVICE AND TRANSPORTATION

Penny Holt, Director of Food Service and Mike Brumley, Director of Transportation, were both present to advise the board how implementing the Safety and Attendance Incentive Program in both of their departments was beneficial over the last year.

Both Mrs. Holt and Mr. Brumley agree that the program has helped create a culture of being at work and being part of a team. It has improved employee morale, lessened attendance issues, and decreased turnover within their departments. They both would like to see the incentive program continue next school year.

# FINANCE UPDATE

Jessica Darnell, Director of Finance, were present to provide the Board with a finance update (a copy of which is attached to the minutes.)

Mrs. Darnell gives the Board a Finance Update at every Regular Board Meeting. She provides them with the current month's Treasurer's Report. The intent of the update is to keep the Board informed with the financial status of Christian County Public Schools and to also update them if any new state or federal guidance has been received. The Treasurer's Report shows all balances, receipts, and expenditures of each fund of the District. Mrs. Darnell discussed each fund in depth, reviewed any new state or federal guidance and answered all questions from the Board.

## MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. ELEMENTARY IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Ms. Carrie Caples, Principal, MLK, Jr. Elementary School, was present to give the Board an update on their Improvement Plan (a copy of which is attached to the minutes.)

Ms. Caples began her presentation by going over their mission, vision, and goals and thanking her administrative team for their hard work and dedication. Ms. Caples stated a picture is worth 1,000 words. Tonight she wanted to share some pictures of their school hard at work. She shared pictures of district support, growth day, close reading, PLCs, MAP, and testing scrimmage. Ms. Caples answered any questions from the Board and will continue to provide updates to them throughout the school year.

# **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

**Mr. Walker** is on the Code of Acceptable Behavior and Discipline and they have met twice. The document should be ready for board approval in May or June.

**Mr. Clark** spoke to Senator Westerfield and Representative Dossett. Mr. Dossett is trying to pass legislation that districts do not have to solicit bids for projects less than \$30,000, which will help us do more projects in-house. He also states that an extension for emergency certified employees for 1 year is now in the Senate. Mr. Bentzel stated that legislators have been in session for 45 days. He appreciates the hard work of Mr. Dossett, Mr. Westerfield, Mr. Thomas, and our new representative, Jason Petrie. This is the budget year and a lot of things are going on. Bev Fort went to Frankfort because she is following a bill with Mr. Thomas to endorse residency certification. This will allow classified employees who want to become certified employees to do a residency instead of traditional student teaching. Mr. Dossett is working to approve disaster days for the tornado impacted districts. The budget, although still in question, is very favorable for public education.

**Mr. Bell** is on the Racial Equity Committee and he can say that Mr. Elam is one busy person. The first Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Newsletter is on the website. The committee will meet tomorrow and began discussions for a community forum coming up.
