SPECIAL MEETING OF THE NEWPORT INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT FINANCE CORPORATION

The meeting was called to order at 6:10 PM. Ms. Ramona Malone and Dr. Julie Smith-Morrow were confirmed as the officers.

Dr. Bob Tarvin was present to explain the plan of financing for upcoming building projects and asked the board to consider the following resolution for school building refunding revenue bonds:

A resolution of the Board of Directors of the Newport Independent School District Finance Corporation, relating to and providing for the issuance of \$3,580,000 principal amount (subject to a permitted adjustment of \$360,000) of special obligation bonds (school building revenue bonds) in accordance with sections S8.180 and 162.120 through 162.385 of the Kentucky Revised Statues to provide funds for school building purposes, providing and determining the duty of sad corporation in connection with the operation of the school property, the creation of funds sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said revenue bonds as and when they mature. The creation of adequate maintenance and insurance funds, authorizing and approving the execution of continuing disclosure procedures and the execution of tax compliance procedures, and authorizing the execution of a lease of such foregoing property to the board of education of the Newport Independent School District

The board will consider the resolution under new business.

STUDENT SUPPORT AND LEARNING SERVICES

The superintendent's update included:

- Young Scholars Academy (YSA) Starting in the fall, a select number of high school students from various schools in Northern KY can take a full college course load in their final two years of high school, earning dual credit for both their high school and college degrees. Students can earn up to two years of college credit toward a bachelor's degree or earn a full associate degree. The scholars admitted to the program study subjects in the fields of science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM), as well as integrative studies, supply chain, and computer science. A YSA signing event/luncheon was held on April 19 to celebrate those students entering the program.
- Dad's on Duty there is another meeting scheduled the first week of May. Due to COVID, the program has not been implemented but is scheduled to start in August.
- Super Saturday Event may have to reschedule due to low turnout. So far, only 5 parents have agreed to attend. A decision will be made by tomorrow. We will plan this event in the fall after careful consideration is given to best times and days.
