

We were awarded both Cycle 19 continuation grants that we applied for. We will be amending one cycle 19 grant to cover 7-12th grades and the cycle 16 grant to cover just k-2nd grades. This way we will have one grant for each school.

We also have received our 4th and 5th year funding for our Cycle 16 grant.

We will be hiring a full time site coordinator at NIS for the new school year. With the new grant all 21st century full time employees will now be on a 220 contract. This will meet the new grant requirements.

Programming for the year ended on May 13th. This allows us to have two weeks to finish all of the reporting due to KDE and to complete our summer school preparations. Summer school this year will run from June 6th-July 1st.

School Health Center

In the past month the school nurse offices have seen:

NPS: 355 students, one daily urinary cath

NIS: 410 students, one daily urinary cath, one diabetic monitoring

NHS: 443 students, one diabetic monitoring.

The nurse division participated in the kindergarten Open House at NPS on 4/13/22. Our vendor, Big Smiles, saw students at NIS for dental care the week of April 11th. Approximately 80 students were seen.
