School Choice Guiding Principles


The current Student Assignment plan has not undergone a comprehensive review in almost **40 years**. Historically, the plan has advantaged White affluent families with greater financial and social capital.

JCPS is committed to **co-creating a plan** with our community that ensures that all students have **equitable access** to school choice options within JCPS.




Dual Resides and Feeder Patterns








Latest Changes to Proposal Based on Feedback

- Added academics as a metric and added this into the policy as part of the annual evaluation. Pages 19, 94, 143, and 144
- Added the ten year commitment to funding for the Choice Zone in the proposal and in the policy. Page 140
- Incorporated that the Office of School Choice will make every effort for families to receive their first or second choice. Page 52
- Incorporated an upgrade to athletic facilities at Shawnee and Western High School. Shawnee Page 73; Western High Page 115
- Included replication of Elementary Performing Arts Magnet school to be located in the Choice Zone. Page 111
- Removed criteria as a requirement for a transfer. Page 127
- Incorporated a quarterly and annual report on staffing and budget at Choice Zone schools; included in reports is a review of money spent on staff salaries in comparison to similar-sized schools outside of the Choice Zone. Page 19 and 143
- Incorporated a hiring advantage for Choice Zone schools to start hiring earlier than others. Pages 71, 82, 90
- Clarified small class size information. Pages 82, 86
- Incorporated that Choice Zone Principals will have a mentor and increased autonomy to make decisions. Pages 71, 82, 90
- Clarified goal to work toward more certified magnets by Magnet Schools of America. Page 98
- Added a responsibility in the Job Description of Director Choice Zone Support to collaborate with DEP to support equitable practices.
