# Newport Independent Schools Director of Pupil Personnel and Student Services Report June 15, 2022



# Non-Traditional Instruction & Temporary Remote Instruction

As of May 27, 2022 Newport Independent Schools utilized 8 of the original 10 non-traditional instruction days. Student participation rates are calculated five days after the return to learning as outlined in the Continuation of Learning Plan. Students earn participation through completion of their packet work, completion of online learning assignments, engagement in online learning programs, attendance in Google Meets with teachers, and through phone communication with teachers. Schools maintain records of students participating, reach out to students who are not actively participating, and assist students who have had issues upon the return to in-person learning. No Newport Independent group utilized temporary remote instruction (TRS) as there was no indicated need.

#### Items for review or approval

Application of Waiver of 702 KAR 7:125 under KRS 156.160

This application provides the opportunity of a virtual academy to students and families needing a virtual setting outside of Newport School of Innovation. Approval needed for submission.

Adjustment to the FRC/YSC/MKV salary scale including a cost share for salaries. This will allow for FRC, YSC, and MKV staff to have knowledge of their pay scale for each year of services not dependent solely on grant funding, allows for additional funds for direct services to students, and is reviewed for funds other than general funds.
