The Literacy Opportunity Fund awards grants to nonprofit organizations within the United States that provide literacy services directly to students. Funded by the Nora Roberts Foundation and administered by ProLiteracy, the Literacy Opportunity Fund distributes grants of \$3,000 to \$6,000 to support general operating expenses. The grant would be in force for the 2022-23 school year.

Describe the components/work/salary/materials the grant will pay for. What is the time frame of the grant? Be specific.

ProLiteracy Grants are given to support general operating expenses. Applications are reviewed based on the individual needs of the literacy organization. General operating expenses might include salaries, technology, supplies, teacher stipends, equipment, space rental, etc. Literacy organizations are eligible to apply once annually, by one of the following deadlines: January 3, April 1, July 1, and October 1. Applications will be reviewed, and notifications of approval or denial will be made eight (8) weeks after the submission deadline.

If awarded the grant funding will cover \$6,000 to be used towards literacy supplies for Reading Recovery and Literacy Cohort for the 2022-23 school year.

The Education Foundation for Excellence in Henderson County wants to support the teachers in Henderson County! They have created a grant opportunity to help teachers offset expenses that they have in their classrooms. Grant source would be in force until funding is used in full. Grant will be in force for the 2022-23 school year.

1. Project Based Learning Unit of Study with a partnership with culinary class at HCHS. Students (36) from TBJ will work with the culinary class at HCHS in a Unit of Study centered around cooking and learning new skills. (Anna Moore and Rose Shelton teachers from TBJ who will be leading this unit of study
2. Storybook Math- Through the use of materials purchased with this grant, TBJ will improve student growth in the areas of quantifying and connecting numerals with their quantities, measurements, spatial relationships, and patterning.
3. 6 Family Engagement Events- Proposed funding for 6 family engagement events that involved foundational numeracy, early literacy, and social emotional development, mental and physical health.

1. Project Based Learning Unit of Study funding will cover: ingredients for 11 cooking projects, kitchen tools, literature, learning materials, transportation between schools, culminating event (student lead family meal). Total: \$2,000 Time Frame: 11/1/22-11/30/22.
2. Storybook Math- Funding will be used to purchase both high quality literature that embeds mathematical concepts and manipulatives to be used to explore the targeted mathematical concepts further. Total: \$2,000 Time Frame: 10/1/22-5/15/23.
3. 6 Family Engagement Events- Funding will pay for 6 meals for 20 families, materials in the above mentioned domains for each session provided, and funding for families to purchase items for their family that would support what they learned in our engagement events. Total: \$5,000. Time Frame: 9/1/22-5/30/23
