

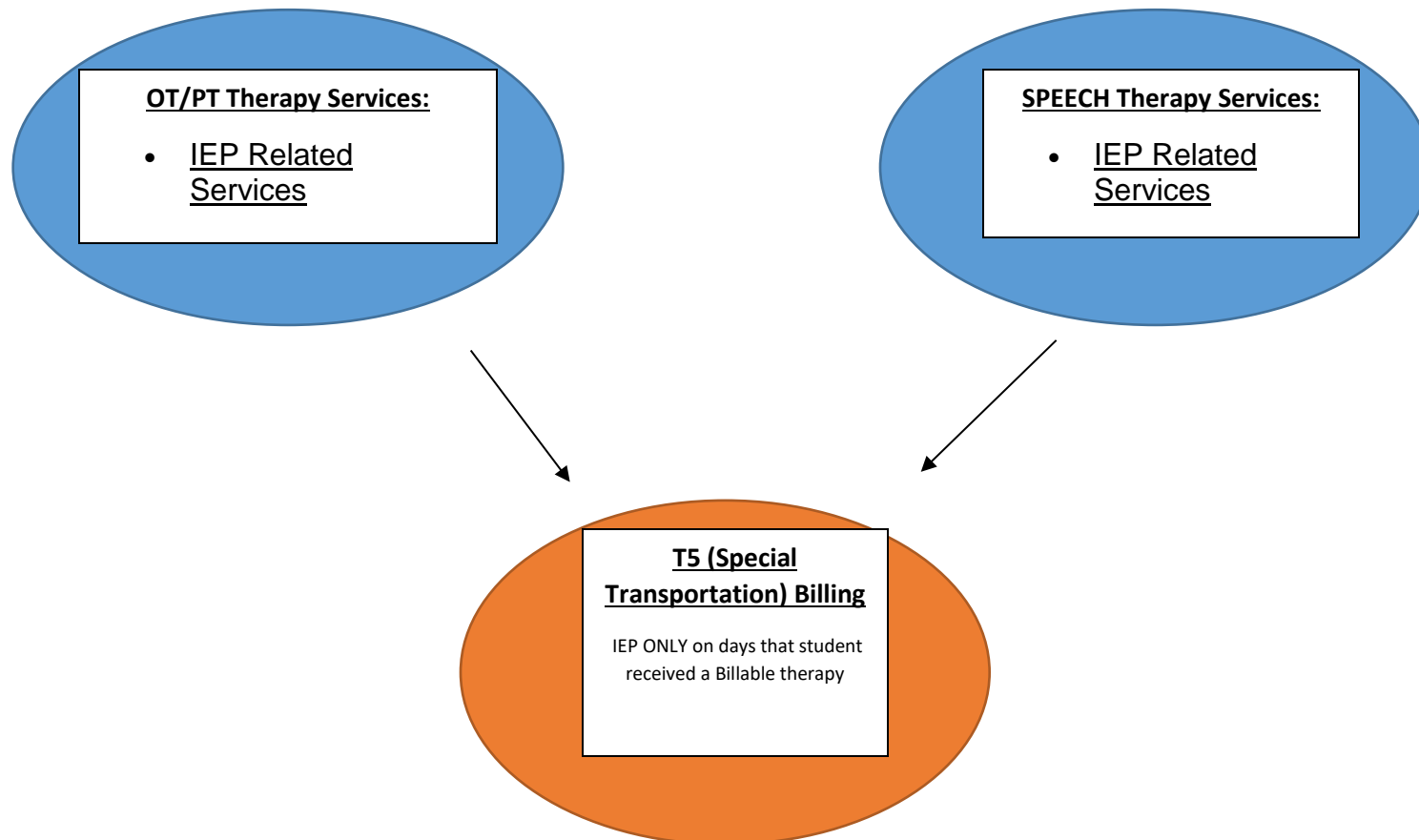
Medicaid Billing in Henderson County Schools

What Medicaid billable services at HCS used to look like in 2014:

- Only Billing Special Education related IEP services.
- Only Providers billing were OT (2), PT (2), and Speech Therapists (16)
 - I billed all T5 transportations for student who received a therapy that day.

KEY:

- **BLUE Circles:** Stand Alone Services: meaning billable alone.
- **ORANGE Circles:** Secondary Services: Meaning have to have a Blue Circle service in order to bill.



What Medicaid billable services at HCS look like today:

- Billing on all students with or without an IEP, as long as they receive a billable service.
- Providers billing are OT (2), PT (2), Speech Therapists (16), School Nurses (11), O&M Specialist (1), School Psychologist (6), Mental Health Counselors (2), T5 Transportation (9 buses and 120 Students), Assistive Tech Reimbursements, and Program Assistants (25) **TOTAL DISTRICT BILLABLE STAFF: 75**
 - I train and provide direct program assistance throughout each school year to all of our MC billable staff. I create individualized logs for the following billable services for our staff to complete then I bill and code all services to MC: T5 transportations for student who received a therapy that day, Program Assistants' billable daily student services, Assistive Tech Reimbursements (student devices), and Nurses MC billing. This allows our staff to only have to simply log their services and not take away from their time from our students for billing.

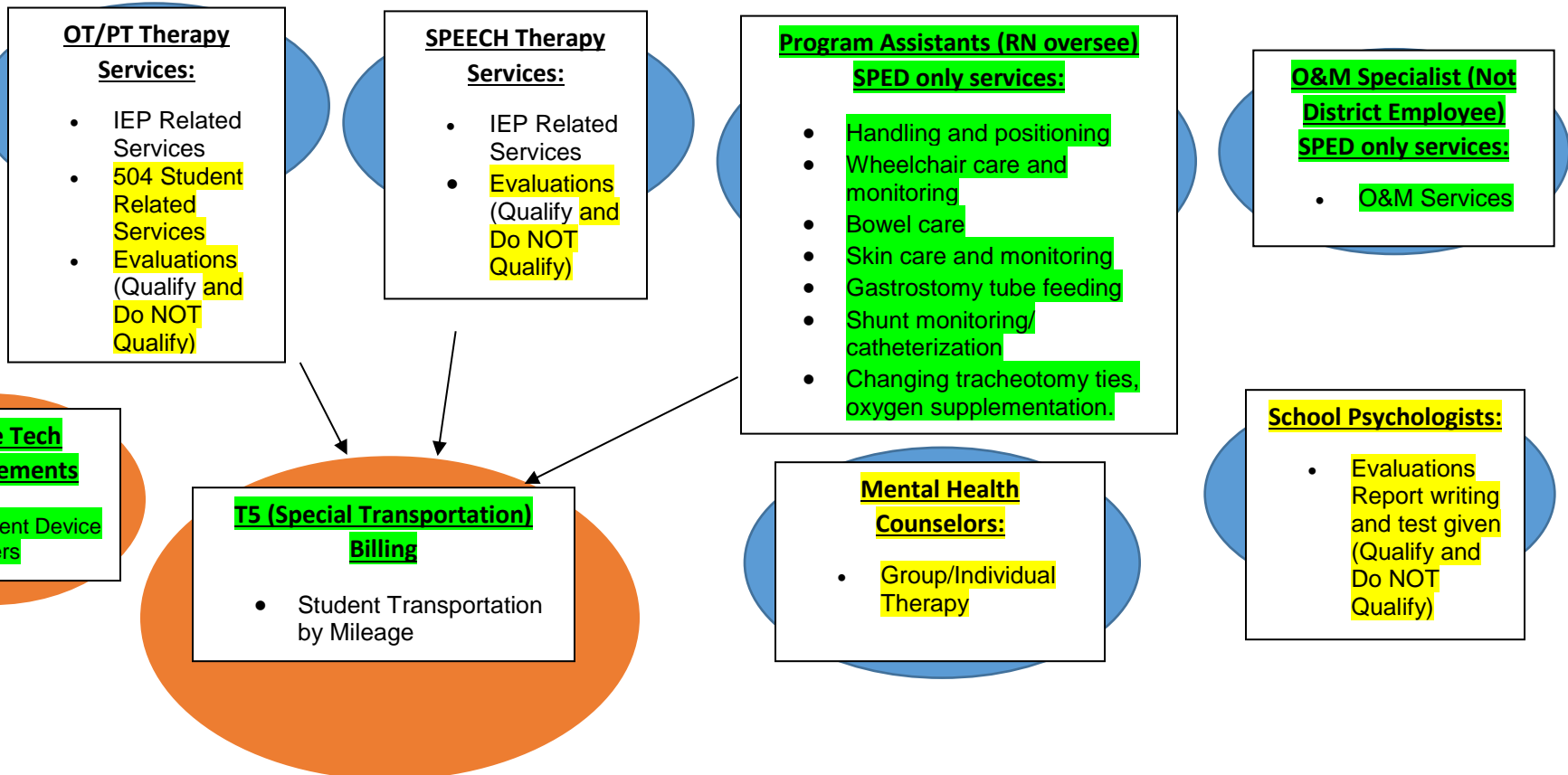
KEY:

Amber Expanded Billable Services: Only IEP Students

2021 New Expanded Access MC Billable Services: All Students

BLUE Circles: Stand Alone Services: meaning billable alone.

ORANGE Circles: Secondary Services: Meaning have to have a Blue Circle service in order to bill.



What we will be adding to Medicaid billable services at HCS:

School Nurses (RN, LPN, & Health Aides)

All MC Eligible students Gen Ed students included (primary focus to be Health Plan students)

- Assessments including referrals based on results
- Suctioning
- Emergency interventions: (Ex. example of an emergency service is the administration of an inhalation treatment to a child who is having an asthma attack.)
- Individual health counseling and instructions
- Medication administration and management including observation for adverse reactions, response or lack of response to medication
- Oxygen administration via tracheostomy and ventilator care
- Positioning
- Gastrostomy tube feeding
- Glucose monitoring
- Ileostomy and colostomy care
- Respirator dependent
- Catheterization and management and care of specialized medical equipment such as colostomy bags, nasal gastric tubes, and tracheotomy tubes
- Supervision of the health aide by the delegating nurse

• **Examples of Health Aid services (LPNs & Health Aides)**

- Handling and positioning
- Wheelchair care and monitoring
- Bowel care
- Skin care and monitoring
- Gastrostomy tube feeding
- Shunt monitoring, catheterization and postural drainage; and
- Changing tracheotomy ties, oxygen supplementation.
