LEGAL: HB 563 (2021) AMENDED KRS 158.120 TO REQUIRE THAT BY JULY 1, 2022, LOCAL BOARDS ADOPT A NONRESIDENT PUPIL POLICY TO GOVERN THE TERMS UNDER WHICH THE DISTRICT SHALL ALLOW ENROLLMENT OF NONRESIDENT PUPILS. WRITTEN AGREEMENTS WILL NO LONGER BE NECESSARY.

Tuition

FEE TO BE CHARGED

According to a schedule recommended by the Superintendent and adopted annually by the Board, the District mayshall charge a fee for each student attending its schools whose parent or guardian is not a legal resident of the District or a full-time employee.¹

Non-resident students enrolling in the District's schools who do not have a contract signed by the district of residence releasing A.D.A. shall be charged a tuition fee equal to current, per pupil operating expenses based on the most recent State calculations for the District plus the current per pupil amount spent from local funds.

Non-resident students enrolling in the District's schools who have a contract signed by the district of residence releasing A.D.A. shall be charged a tuition fee equal to the current amount per student spent from local funds.

CLASS SIZE

Tuition students will be accepted only when class loads are below the allowable maximum. Admission will be reviewed annually to determine if class sizes remain small enough to accommodate tuition students.

CHILDREN OF EMPLOYEES

With the exception of employees who live out-of-state, full-time personnel who live outside the District shall have the option of enrolling their children in the District school of employment without a tuition charge, contingent on the District receiving ADA as provided by law Employees who live out- of-state may enroll their children in the District school of employment provided they pay tuition equal to the SEEK allocation.
