AGENDA ITEM (ACTION ITEM):

Consider/Approve Student and adult meal pricing for the 2022-2023 school year.

APPLICABLE BOARD POLICY:

Support Services 07.11

HISTORY/BACKGROUND:

The Student Nutrition Department is self-sufficient from the Board of Education general fund. Meaning, no money from the local school board is received to support the operation of the school meals program. The goal of the Student Nutrition Department is to price meals to operate a financially sound program. Therefore, meals must be priced to cover the cost of producing the meals. Due to the increase in supply, labor, and food costs over the past year Student Nutrition is proposing a meal increase of \$0.35 for student breakfast and \$0.25 for student lunches. The proposed meal pricing for the 2022-2023 school year is in the table below.
