Attached you will find Document I / Document II / Document IV Document V / Document VI and Document VII which are pertinent informational documents as they relate to the Select / Non-Select determination for the (2022-2023) (2023-2024) post season participation is the sports of football, boys' and girls' basketball, baseball, and softball. Documents I, II and III have been previously disseminated from this office. Document IV is the Executive Director's Louisiana Association of School Superintendent's (LASS) Advisory Committee roster, selected by the LHSAA's Executive Committee LASS liaison in cooperation with the 64 Louisiana parish school superintendents. I am including these documents in order to provide a timeline of notification to all stake holders concerning the proposed select definition (which is found in the LHSAA glossary) as well as the day, date, time, and location when this topic would be discussed and put to a vote for approval or denial by the LHSAA Executive Committee.

Over the course of the past four reclassifications, this office has received numerous communications questioning the placement of schools into select/non-select categories. The questions that have been raised are: why all magnet school(s) with one or more magnet component(s) are not select; why all approved charter schools regardless of the "type" are not select; why all schools located in parish wide approved open enrollment parishes are not select; why Orleans Parish state recovery-district (RSD) one application-based schools are not select; and why parishes with multiple high schools within the parish but only one of the schools offering football, sends all of those football players to that one parish school not considered select? In a media article written in January of 2013, the cited reasons for the pursuit of dividing the association into private school / public school and/or select non-select was as follows: "private schools could draw from outside a traditional attendance zone and were doing so by recruiting". The article continues "the sentiment was progressively more open as the week leading up to the annual convention's general business meeting, that John Curtis and Evangel were the bulk of the reason behind the push for the split." Also, "level the playing field", "fair play", and/or "recruiting" were catch phrases utilized. So, here we sit, nine years later with many educational changes and an abundance of educational options for students within and around parishes which permit students to attend schools that are not in their "traditional school attendance zone." Another frequently asked question "if the playing field is not level or fair, then why does the LHSAA allow these schools to compete against each other during the regular season?" Taking into consideration these questions, and the continued complaints surrounding the post season playoff and championship format competitiveness integrity, this office and the LHSAA Executive Committee decided to address these concerns / questions and inequities. Behind attached Document I you will find included the three options for select school definitions.

Option (1) which is the present definition in the LHSAA handbook glossary, did not address all the questions and/or concerns about the "whys". Option (2) language captures the questions and/or concerns and addresses the "whys". Option (3) I extensively spoke to at the June 2nd, 2022 executive committee meeting.

I stated "if the philosophy / matrix in 2013 was about "leveling the playing field and fairness" then why do we continue to allow select and non-select schools to intermingle during the regular season and continue to allow the sports of volleyball, soccer, cross country, swimming, wrestling, tennis, and track & field to be dominated by private/select schools during the postseasons. If we apply the above-mentioned philosophy / matrix to all sanctioned LHSAA sports the LHSAA should be divided / split into select and non-select, and the only schools that would be defined in Option 3 would be the *true* 91 private schools or (22.1%) of the LHSAA's 2022-2023 projected 411 member schools". However, this would not address the concerns amongst the remaining *true* state funded public schools as it relates to "level the playing" field and competitive fairness." I (we) are well aware of the many community based schools (metropolitan and rural) throughout Louisiana that fall into the recently executive committee approved select definition because of a parish board decision to adopt magnet(s), open enrollment, and/or student one-application (RSD), all of which permits student educational choice and the ability to gain junior varsity athletic eligibility immediately at the 9th grade level if all other LHSAA minimum eligibility requirements are established. For those few member schools that have utilized local media platforms to ridicule me, and the LHSAA Executive Committee for making a decision of this magnitude without allowing all membership to weigh-in, and stating that this is another attempt to dissolve the split, I say this ... the LHSAA Executive Committee is representative of principals, coaches, athletic directors, superintendents, state school boards, state department of education and state legislature, all selected by their respective peers and/or organizations to represent each stakeholder entities

throughout the school year, *and* from January convention to January convention. The approval of the new definition for select affected 79 schools or approximately 19% of the membership.

There is no attempt being made to dissolve the split, quite the contrary, the decision stays within the split philosophy used in 2013 and expands the split participants by leveling the playing field, addressing fair play with "like schools." This decision does not change participation opportunities, basic playing districts or classifications. This decision simply addresses post season playoffs and championships.


In closing, LHSAA Constitution 4.4.4 permits the LHSAA Executive Committee to make special rules to affect the spirit of <u>fair play</u> and good sportsmanship. The committee acted within their authority and in good faith. As you will see behind Document III the meeting minutes reflect the select definition passed with a 16 to 5 vote by those present (5 nay votes Class C upper and Class C lower / Class B upper / LHSCA (RSD) and Class 4A at-large). Also, the same meeting minutes will reflect a unanimous approval vote (including 5 select school representatives) to bring all select and non-select sports championships back to the LHSAA Executive Committee approved venues.

Please see the attached document (Item I) that addresses action taken by the LHSAA Executive Committee on my recommendation as it pertains to Name / Image and Likeness (NIL). First, know this is not the LHSAA promoting / encouraging NIL and/or the LHSAA endorsing "pay to play" this is the furthest from such. We are leading and the attached media release describes the reasoning and the position we will take as an education-based athletic association. This office has received several inquiries about LHSAA athletes participating in NIL deals and the potential for violating any LHSAA Bylaw as it relates to athletic eligibility. Also know, NIL is not just for athletes, there are and will be many scenarios where students at your school who participate in co-curricular activities, such as esports, and/or others pursuing forms of social media influencing who can benefit from the educational modules and guidance we are providing collaboratively with Eccker Sports.

The U.S. Supreme Court has already offered opinion on NIL in favor of the NCAA athlete(s), the California legislature has taken a stand, and the Florida High School Athletic Association is presently in litigation for denying the athlete the opportunity to participate in the benefits of their own NIL. (Item II), which in turn has generated potential legislation in that state.

Also attached (Item III) you will find the proposed Select / Non-Select determination definitions for the upcoming (2022-2023) (2023-2024). The genesis for this conversation started after the 2019 Annual Convention where membership voted to remove a portion of the definition which prescribed that Select shall mean private or public schools that have 25% of your student enrollment in dual curriculum from outside of your attendance zone and have an established academic criterion that is used to determine the admission and retention of its students. The remaining portion of the select definition with the addition of (or) was then placed in the glossary reading Select shall mean private or public schools that have an established academic criterion that is used to determine the admission and/or retention of its students. This office has been questioned on the validity of this definition as it was not approved by the membership. According to LHSAA Legal Counsel authorized Parliamentarian, the glossary items do not need to be approved by membership. However, I will ask for the LHSAA Executive Committee to render a decision on the definition of select and non-select at the upcoming EC June summer meeting providing them the numbers breakdown of schools in each definition for post season participation.

Also attached (Item IV) you will find three documents / bylaw adoptions approved by the LHSAA Executive Committee effective July 1, 2022. Bylaw 4.1.4 had a conflict with Bylaw 4.3 which was caught after the convention. Bylaw 11.3.9 and Bylaw 14.3.10 are both new and are self-explanatory.

These 3 items were approved by EC under prescribed authority LHSAA Constitution 4.4.4 Make special rules to affect the spirit of fair play and good sportsmanship provides and will appear at the 2023 annual convention for ratification.

Also attached, (Item V) you will find the April 6th and April 7th, 2022 spring LHSAA Executive Committee meeting minutes for your review.





SELECT SCHOOL DESIGNATION DEFINITION

Option 1


Select shall mean private or public schools that have an established academic criterion that is used to determine the admission and/or retention of its students. (presently in glossary)

Option 2

Select shall mean private or public schools that have a state or parish approved designation as a lab school, magnet school(s) with one or more magnet component(s), approved charter schools, parish wide approved open enrollment, state recovery-district (RSD) application-based parish schools, tuition-based schools and/or any established academic and/or retention-based criterion schools.

Option 3

Select shall mean private or public schools that do not receive state of Louisiana Minimum Foundation Program (MFP) and/or do not receive an annual letter grade from the Louisiana Department of Education (LDOE).

On Wednesday, June 1, 2022 and Thursday, June 2, 2022 the LHSAA Executive Committee held its 4th and final meeting for the 2021-2022 school year. On day two the committee discussed and acted on the "select and non-select" agenda item II. (b) sub-section (i) to establish an approved definition for determining the designation for LHSAA member schools post season participation. After staff reports and lengthy discussion amongst committee members present Option 2 was passed by a 16-5 vote and with no abstains. The following is the approved definition: **Select** *shall mean private or public schools that have a state or parish approved designation as a lab school, magnet school(s) with one or more magnet component(s)*, *approved charter schools, parish wide approved open enrollment, state recovery-district (RSD) application-based parish schools, tuition-based schools* and/or any *established academic and/or retention-based criterion schools.* This definition increases the number of member schools in the select designation from 106 (26%) to 200(49.4%) and decreases the number in non-select from 299 (73%) to 205 (50.6%).

LHSAA ... Beyond the Game

An alpha list of schools will be released from this office on Monday, June 6th, 2022 which will be reflective of information utilized from the LHSAA member site and data obtained from the Louisiana Department of Education, all of which is pertaining to those parent/student education choice opportunities defined and offered in various parishes statewide. Once you have received the alpha list, if you feel as though you have been placed in either select and/or non-select incorrectly, you will have 15 calendar days, until June 21, 2022 to submit in writing to this office describing your reasoning on why you feel as though your designation is inaccurate. This select and non-select definition will become effective July 1, 2022. Also discussed was the present select school's separate post season venues in football, basketball, softball, and baseball. After LHSAA staff reports and committee's lengthy discussion, by a unanimous vote all select and non-select championships will be together in the LHSAA Executive Committee approved post season formats and venues statewide. Staff was given direction to prepare and present to the LHSAA Executive Committee in July any/all adjustments deemed necessary to both select and non-select post season brackets and qualifying factors therein. More information to follow.

- **1. LHSAA Bylaw 4.1.4, 4.3** Motion to approve change to Bylaw 4.1.4 and 4.3 under LHSAA Article 4.4.4 to become effective July 1, 2022 by John LeBlanc, 2nd by Eric Heinen. Motion passes.
- 4.1.4 Subject to the approval of the school principal, a coach may have out-of-season organizational meetings with his/her players or potential players. Other than these organizational meetings, a coach shall not may organize, supervise, administer, or direct out-of-season practices, meetings, or gatherings of student-athletes in the school. This includes: tryouts, informal workouts in a particular sport, and classroom sessions in a particular sport. Restrictions do not include strength and conditioning programs; these programs shall be allowed under this rule (subject to the approval of the school principal).
- 4.3 OUT OF SEASON DURING THE SCHOOL YEAR Schools shall not require or sponsor activities in the name of the school team outside the school season of the sport involved. A school sponsored team or group of any number of students sponsored by the school which resembles the school's team, is not permitted to practice or compete outside the LHSAA defined season for that sport. Any non-school group can sponsor activities which involve groups of athletes which are mainly or exclusively members of a school team but a school cannot sponsor practice or a competition by its team out of season. Students may participate on a voluntary basis in any activity, as a member of a non-school team or on an individual basis. Neither the member school nor its coaches shall allow the out-of-season activity to be mandatory or to be any part of the basis for selection of the school team. Exception: Athletic periods approved by the Louisiana Department of Education and member school superintendents and principals.
