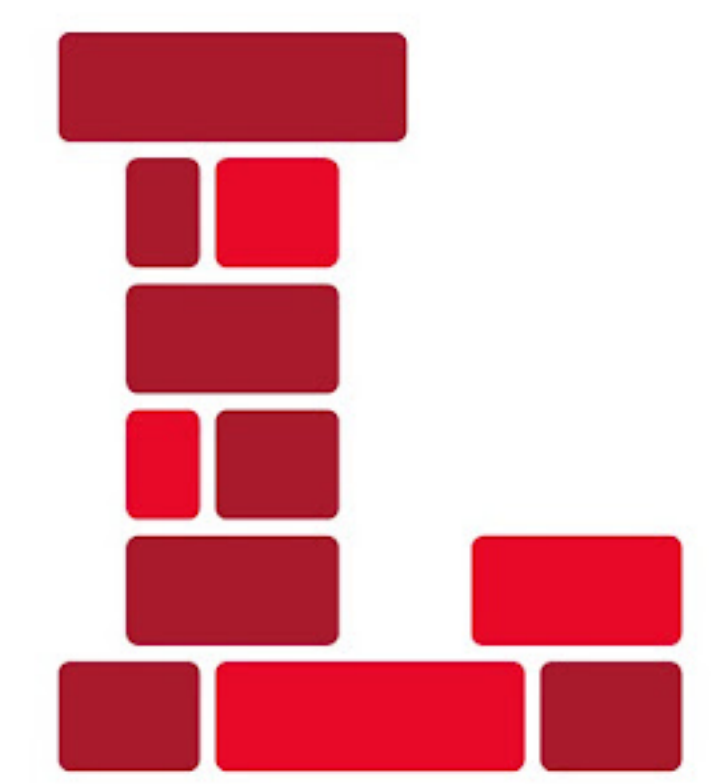

- The FRYSC maintains a stocked Food Pantry, which is open to all families. Sign up to shop at the pantry weekly if needed. Non-perishable foods, frozen and refrigerated foods, and household items are available. Fresh fruit and vegetables are often available too.
- Assistance with clothing, personal items, and school supplies is available for families.
- Power Packs are given to students for weekend meals.
- The FRYSC coordinates a variety of services for families, including academic support and mental health services. They can assist families in crisis or need.

- School Nurse services are provided daily.
- HealthPoint has an office on the school campus. Parents may register students for services offered. This office is open one day per week for physicals, sick visits, immunizations, strep tests, and medication prescriptions for illness.
- The dental office opens for six weeks, every six months, so that students can be seen for regular check-ups and cleanings, as well as receive basic dental care.

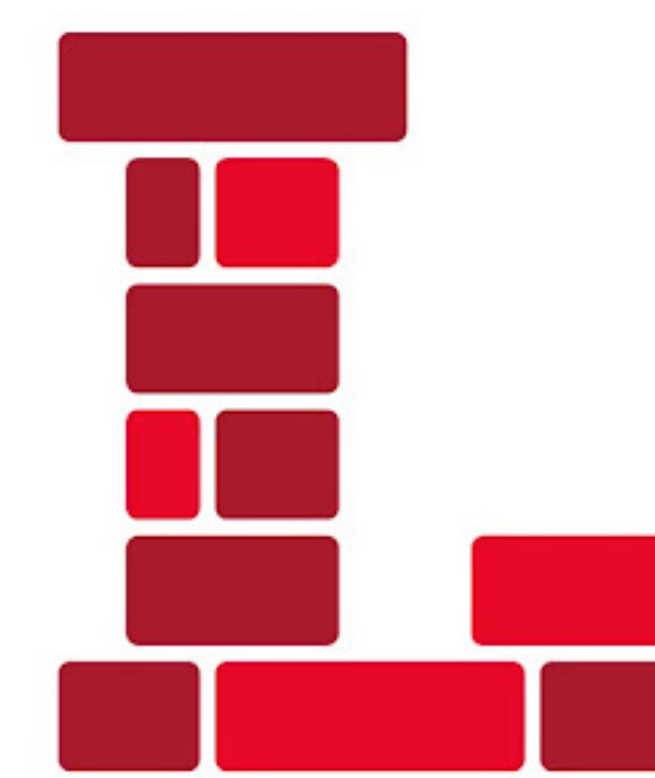
- SHINE and SOAR are 21st Century Community Learning Center Programs that are offered FREE to families. Students can sign up for either morning or afternoon sessions, or both!
- Before-School activities run 7:15-8:15 AM and include breakfast, homework help/tutoring, and a choice of physical, academic, and creative MakerSpace activities.
- After-School activities run 3:10-5:30 PM and include an after-school meal, homework help, tutoring, and a variety of enrichment activities, such as archery, the arts, chess, robotics, book clubs, 3D printing design, and cooking.

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ACADEMIC INTERVENTION SERVICES

- Academic intervention services are offered to students throughout the school day. Students will work with an Interventionist in reading and/or mathematics one-to-one or with a small group in order to close learning gaps.
- Students will have access to individualized instructional programs and spend more time each day on reading and/or mathematics.
- Students will be regularly assessed in the content area to closely monitor progress. These results will be communicated regularly with parents/families.
- Extended school services (ESS) are offered to students after school several days per week throughout most of the school year.

EARLY COLLEGE & WORK-BASED LEARNING PROGRAMS

- All tuition, books, and materials are provided for every junior and senior in the Early College and Work-Based Learning Programs.
- Students attend a half day of college, usually in the mornings, at the urban campus of Gateway Community & Technical College. They return to LHS for their afternoon high school courses. They can take dual credit courses in general education, allied health, logistics/supply chain with co-op, advanced manufacturing, auto technology, and computer information technology.
- Students can choose to attend a half day at the Enzweiler Building Institute, where they will learn various skilled trades including carpentry, electric, HVAC, masonry, welding, and plumbing. Students co-op in their second year of the program.
