- Young Women LEAD Conference
 - On Monday, October 17, 2022, four high school girls attended the "Young Women LEAD Conference" at Northern Kentucky University. Young Woman LEAD focuses on leadership, education and developing girls to be confident, successful leaders. The conference featured keynote speakers including executives from various corporations including Toyota and the current Ms. Kentucky, Hannah Edelen. A variety of interactive breakout sessions taught important skills necessary to be successful in the workforce and develop leadership skills.
