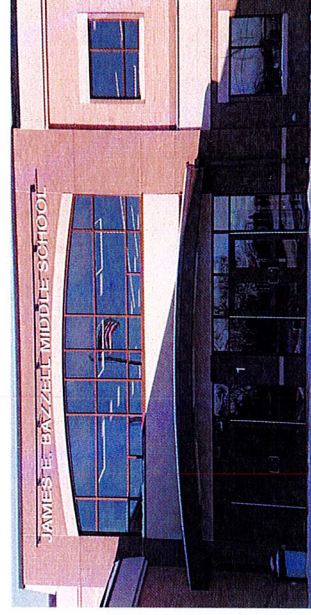


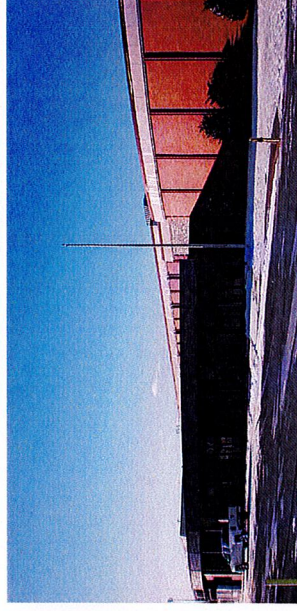
Physical Activity Environment Assessment

National School Lunch

The National School Lunch program was established in 1946 as a “measure of national security to safeguard the health and well-being of the Nation’s children.” School districts receive federal reimbursement for each school lunch served that meets the U.S. Department of Agriculture nutrition guidelines. These guidelines promote meal quality while commodity donations help the farmer and help schools keep meal cost lower.

School menus are planned in accordance with the recommended daily allowances (RDA) as specified by the national Academy of Sciences and must meet the meal pattern requirements as specified by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. We are committed to providing a nutritious, appetizing and economical meal for each student every day.

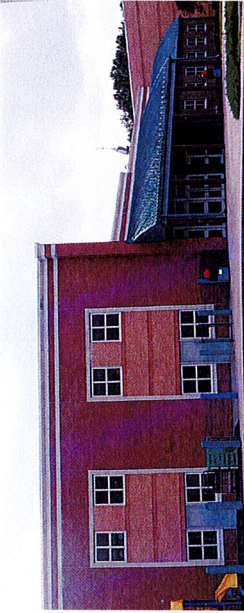
