This year, BCPS began two new recognitions: The Moving Forward Award and The Core Values in Action Award. These awards symbolize the heart of Bullitt County Public Schools: our tagline and the fundamental values we strive to follow each day. The Moving Forward Award is open to any BCPS student, parent, other family member, a Bullitt County community member, or business and the Core Values in Action Award serves to recognize BCPS Staff Members.

Tonight, we are pleased to announce the inaugural recipients of these awards.

Moving Forward Award:

Audrey Stepp, BEHS Sophomore Student

"Audrey has accepted responsibility as a Board Member of Bullitt Opioid Addiction Team (BOAT). BOAT is a non-profit with a mission to raise awareness, educate and prevent adversities due to Substance Use Disorder (SUD) such as overdose/poisoning and promoting Harm Reduction. At 8 yrs old, she requested to be trained in Overdose Rescue and mastered the task which pioneered the training of children 8 yrs and older in this life saving technique. For many years she has volunteered her time and skills battling the opioid epidemic. Audrey is very familiar with differences among others. She has grown up in the company of others with different capabilities; such as family members with physical injury or mental impairment. She is closely acquainted with others that encounter intolerance based on disability, ethnicity, political belief, race, religion, sexual orientation and gender. Audrey is so aware of discrimination, she will deliberately give her attention to the aging animals at a shelter and refuses to ignore people and animals without homes. It is heart-warming to see this young woman reaching into her pocket to share the little money she has with someone else in need. Embracing Differences and Service Before Self are not the only areas she thrives; she is amazing academically and her kindness is beyond compare. Audrey Stepp is a Bullitt East Sophomore worthy of recognition as a BCPS Moving Forward award recipient."

Students Matter Most: Jessica Talley, MWMS Teacher

"She is very understanding and always makes sure the students' learning and general well-being come first. He meets each student where they are at and builds on their strengths while working on their areas that are not as strong without making it known to the other students. Teaching students who are on the autism spectrum as our son is can be challenging yet Mr. McClintock makes it look so easy. His calm and innovative ways have encouraged our son to WANT to try things that are hard for him. Hearing our son come home from school excited to share his day with us and how he is stepping outside of his comfort zone and feeling good about it feels great. Mr.McClintock shows how much he cares about his students being able to learn every day."

Service Before Self: Betty Shofner, Instructional Tutor at Riverview

"Ms. Shofner is the FIRST to volunteer to fill in, pick up slack, watch a class, take on responsibilities above and beyond her actual duties and on top of that she does it with a smile. She stays to volunteer for PLC's which she is not required to attend and helps students after hours by answering emails and with assignments.
