#### Response:

Garrard County Schools district leadership will review, submit feedback, and approve the CSIP plans for Lancaster Elementary and Garrard Middle School. The comprehensive district improvement plan for Garrard County Schools outlines the professional development, allocation of resources, monitoring, and coaching activities designed to provide support for the district's students identified with disabilities.

During the spring semester, 2023, Garrard County Schools will collaborate with CKEC to conduct an examination, CARS Comprehensive Analysis of Resources and Support, for each of the TSI schools. A team of former school leaders and teachers at CKEC will interview teachers, students, administrators, and support staff, examine student work products, visit and observe classroom instruction, review school management procedures and policy, and analyze the daily operations of each school. Upon completion of the monitoring visit, CKEC leadership will report the results and feedback to GCS district leadership and school administration. These results and findings will be communicated to the faculty by GCS district leaders and the school's leadership team. GCS district leadership and school leadership will determine which action items to address and update each of the school's CSIPs accordingly.

GCS will utilize each of the schools CSIPs to prepare local monitoring efforts where district leaders conduct Learning Walks to examine special education settings, co-teaching classrooms, and each of the school's efforts to implement the adopted curriculum to meet the Kentucky Academic Standards. The Directors of Teaching and Learning will facilitate the Learning Walk review, collaborate with school leaders to update CSIP activities, and assist the school leadership with implementing next steps outlined in the 30-60-90-day TSI plan for CSIP implementation.

The Director of Special Education will collaborate with each of the TSI schools' leadership to review support services, develop a co-teaching professional learning plan, and update each of the school's CSIP accordingly. The Director of Special Education and Directors of Teaching and Learning will establish walkthrough protocols and indicators to observe, collect information, and develop coaching items for special education resources and co-teaching settings. Walkthrough observation data will be reviewed and shared with school leadership during Learning Walks and according to the 30-60-90-day CSIP implementation plan.

The District Level MTSS committee will examine special education progress reporting following each iReady assessment. TSI school leadership will provide the committee with an update regarding the implementation of the schools' TSI measures, outlining improvement and next steps according to multiple measures, including iReady progress reports.

During monthly Direct Reports with school administrators, the GCS Superintendent will maintain TSI performance report updates as a standing item for each principal. School leadership will provide a summary of the school's CSIP activities, progress toward goals, strengths, weaknesses, and needs.
