There have not been any changes in the head coaching positions since the last athletic report.

Sports Information:

The football team won the 6A – 1st District Championship by beating Barren County (48-0) and Meade County (35-6) in the playoffs. We lost to Louisville Male in the 3rd round of the playoffs, 23-10. The team finished with a 10 wins for the first time since 2006 and advanced to the 3rd round of the playoffs for the first time since 2011.

The volleyball team finished with a 28-11 record. They won the 6th District Championship and the first two games of the region tournament against Livingston Central and University Heights. They fell to Madisonville North Hopkins in the 2nd Region championship game.

The cheer team finished second in the Game Day Large category at region and earned a spot in the KHSAA State competition. They finished in 9th place at State.

The dance team won the region in Pom and tied for the region title in Game Day with Daviess County. With those wins, they earned a spot in the KHSAA State Competition for each category. At State, they finished in 5th place in Game Day and in 7th place in Pom.

The boys basketball team is currently 3-2 with wins over Evansville North, Madisonville North Hopkins and Rossview High School out of Clarksville, TN. We will be hosting the Henderson Chevrolet Buick GMC Classic on December 28-30. We play at 6:00 each night.

The girls basketball team is currently 3-1 with wins over Louisville Male, Evansville Central and Massac Coounty, IL. We are excited to play in the Louisville Invitational Tournament this season in late January.

The boys bowling team is currently 3-2 and the girls team is 1-3. The boys team beat Daviess County for the 1st time ever and won a Baker Match against Apollo for the first time ever. Multiple boys and girls have rolled personal bests already this season.

The wrestling team got off to a rough start against a challenging schedule. On December 10, we hosted the Fighting Colonel Classic and went 4-1 as a team for the day.

Henderson County High School continues to be in compliance with all KHSAA By-Laws.
