The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) has selected Kentucky to receive federal funds for the NSLP Equipment Assistance Grants. These funds were provided by Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, (Public Law 116-94).

These funds will be awarded via a competitive grant process to SFAs giving priority to high need schools (e.g., schools in underserved areas, schools with limited access to other resources, and age of food service equipment) where 50 percent or more of the enrolled students are eligible for free or reduced price meals. Equipment requests may include new equipment, renovation of equipment, or replacement of equipment. Awarded funds have to be used by the end of FFY23 (September 30, 2024).

Up to \$25,000 to cover cost of kitchen equipment.

Funds SHALL be used to purchase equipment to be used in the following ways:

- 1. Equipment that lends itself to improving the nutritional quality of meals;
- Equipment that improves the safety of food served in the schools;
- 3. Equipment that improves overall energy efficiency of nutrition program operations;
- 4. Equipment that allows SFAs to support expanded participation in the meal service; and,
- Equipment installation costs.
